











































Civil Death Records

- New England states started recording deaths on the town level starting as early as the first residents of the town (1600s)
- Some states began recording deaths on the county level as early as the 1860s.


Civil Death Record - Restrictions


- Some states have restrictions on who can see them.






































Cemeteries and Graves

- Preparation for Field Research
 - It is important to have as much information as possible.
 - Large cemeteries will have an office that can provide a map/directions.
 - Smaller/rural cemeteries:
 - call the local government office.
 - will have a name to help you if there is not a sexton.
 - Access follow local rules (often posted)
 - By law in Tennessee and Alabama, access MUST be provided to a cemetery (may need prior contact on private land).


Cemeteries and Graves

- Preparation for Field Research
 - Cemetery kit recommendations:
 - Foam cushion or knee pads
 - Knife, pruning shears, gloves
 - Cleaning supplies (D2, soft brushes, water bottles or sprayer, popsicle sticks, whisk broom)
 - Camera / Smart Phone
 - Aluminum Foil & masking tape
 - Pad and pen or pencil
 - GPS and tape measure
 - Probes and dowsing rods (flags for marking)
 - Hand wipes / hand sanitizer
 - Something to keep all this in ...









Finding Unmarked Graves

- Highlights:
 - Most Christian burials are from E-W with the head at the West end.
 - Clues for unmarked graves:
 - Visually: Look for depressions in the earth.
 - By feel: using very short steps (heel to toe) determine if there is a depression.
 - Size: most depressions will be approximate <2 feet
 wide, < 6 feet long (graves of children will be smaller).
 - If you have found the following:
 - location (in a cemetery or supposed cemetery);
 - orientation (E-W); size (approx. 2x6)

then you may have an unmarked grave.

Probing for Graves

- When a grave is dug, the earth is disturbed and remains that way for hundreds of years.
- The earth, once disturbed, will remain softer where the grave is.
- That grave shaft, when probed, will allow the probe to enter much easier than the earth around it.

Probing for Graves - Technique

- After finding a suspected grave, begin at the center about a foot outside the area and move ACROSS the grave
- Push the probe into the ground at 6-12 inch intervals feeling for soft spots (It is helpful to probe known graves as well as areas where there are no graves to get a feel for the difference)
- Repeat the same procedure lengthwise.
- If probing the suspected grave passes all the tests: size, shape, orientation - then you may assume that it is a grave. At this point, you would want to mark this grave: flags, GPS coordinates or other.

Dowsing for Graves


- While dowsing for graves has been used for hundreds of years, there are many that do not believe it works.
- There is NO scientific reason for it working, but I have dowsed hundreds of graves and believe in this method.











