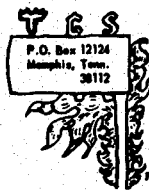

A note from a Terrell descendant: "William Johnston, of Lincoln City, Tennessee, and Elizabeth Ann Terrell were married July 28, 1825, by Squire Rust at or near Petersburg, Tennessee, with Daniel Johnston and Elvira Rust as witnesses. Eliz. Ann Terrell was born Dec. 2, 1809, dau. of Joseph Terrell and his wife, Ann Blair, daughter of Col. James Blair and his wife Elizabeth Powell. Ann Blair was born March 15, 1792. Joseph Terrell died in Franklin Co., Ga., in 1812, and his administrator was Col. James Blair, his father-in-law. Col. Blair died in Habersham Co., Ga. in 1839. After the death of Joseph Terrell, his widow, Ann Blair, married Oliver Allen Elston, and removed to old Rastaboga, Talladega County, Alabama, where both died and are buried."

From Mecklenburg Co., N. C. Deed Records: Deed Book No. 20, p 10. "Josiah Price of Lancaster District, S. C., William Price of Giles County, Tenn., James Price and John Price of Mecklenburg Co., Joseph P. Howe of Montgomery Co., Ky., Henry Ihler(?) of York District, S. C., George Henry of Mecklenburg Co., Henry Neel of Sumner Co., Tenn., to Isaac Price of Mecklenburg co. Deed dated March 23, 1802, conveying 320 acres in Mecklenburg Co., being two-thirds of "joint survey" of Isaac Price, deceased; bounded by grantee's lands and by Esther Price's dower, and lying on east side of Catawba River."

The following dates were copied from stones in Cades Cove Primitive Baptist Churchyard, Gatlinburg, Tennessee, in 1969. These represent all the graves of Olivers buried in the yard and so marked:

BOOK REVIEWS

THOMAS SIMMS OF CULPEPER COUNTY, VIRGINIA, EDMUND BUTLER OF VIRGINIA AND KENTUCKY Ancestors & Descendants With Allied Families and other Culpeper Data. 1972. Compiled and published by Lela Wolfe Prewitt. Hard backs. 194 pages. Indexed. Order from author, 501 Carpenter St., Fairfield, Iowa 52556. \$12.50

The name Sims has been spelled as Simms, Simes, Symmes, Symms, Sim, and Semmes, with variations sometimes occurring within a single family. The Sims family is traced back to William Sims, who died in Richmond Co. Va. in 1716. The Butler family is traced back to Edmond Butler who died in Goochland Co. Va. in 1747. The two families were connected through Anna Butler who married Benjamin Sims in Culpeper Co. in 1810. The Butler family moved to Ky. in 1810 and the young couple went with them. The descendants of these two families are charted to the present generations in a very well documented, well compiled volume. Original documents are abstracted and abbreviated to make reading easy and clear.

CLINTON COUNTY, OHIO OBITUARIES 1867-1875 and Selected Genealogical Notes by Larry D. Mart. 1976. Soft covers. Over 87 pages. Indexed. Order from the Author, 621 Fairfield Drive, Lima, Ohio 45805. \$6.80 pp.

The Author published in 1973 obituaries abstracted from newspapers of Clinton County, from 1838-1867. This new publication picks up where the former ended and gives abstracts not only of obituaries, but also of other items of genealogical interest. Ohio was a part of the old Northwest Territory which was ceded to the United States by the State of Virginia and settlers along the Ohio River were largely from Virginia. Much genealogical information is found in this publication such as: Letters held in Post Office 1869, marriages, legal notices of administrators, list of pioneers who attended a dinner, cemeteries, etc. 800 plus obituaries from newspapers. Includes some marriages 1856-1860. 9 cemeteries with approximately 150 names. Short biographies: Mary (Antram) Pierce, Robt. May, Timothy Bennett, Dr. Isaac Yelfair, George Haworth, Lewis M. Walker and more.

JOHNSTON COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA COUNTY COURT MINUTES 1793 thru 1797, Book V by Weynette Parks Haun. 1976. Soft covers. Over 165 pages. Indexed. Order from the Author, 243 Argonne Dr., Durham, N.C. 27704. \$16.50 pp.

This is the fifth book of transcriptions of the first six original volumes of Johnston County Court Minutes. Book VI will begin with the year 1801 as the original volume for the years 1798 through 1800 is missing (as is the first volume of Wake County, N.C. County Court Minutes). 395 deeds, administration of estates, estate settlements and guardian appointments, etc.

DESCENDANTS OF JOHN WILSON 1756-1827 (Brother of Colonel Benjamin) by Barr Wilson. 1975. Hard covers. Over 446 pages. Indexed. Order from the Author, Toll Gate, W. Va. 26442. \$20.00.

William Wilson, father of nine sons and two daughters, came to America in 1737. He married Elizabeth Blackburn. There has been several historians in the family. C. J. Maxwell printed a book in 1943 in which he listed over 7000 descendants of William, the immigrant, in which he listed the descendants of all eleven children. The Author lists 3100 descendants of John, the fifth son of William, plus early Wilson history plus early histories of related families, which had not been published before. The children of John Wilson settled in Doddridge, Ritchie, and Wood Counties of Va. (now W. Va.). Related families listed are: Moses Wilson II, Solomon Wilson, John and William White, Blackburn, Joel Westfall, Warthen, Modesitt, Hudkins, Slaven, Ingram, Shinn, Cunningham, Richards, Jones, Dotson, Bee, Prunty, Broadwater, Ellifrits, Duckworth, Clayton, Amos, and Wilson Graves.

FIELDS-WHITESSELL-DODD FAMILY HISTORY by Ruth Fields Lewis, 1976. Soft covers. Over 160 pages. Indexed. Order from Mrs. Ruth F. Lewis, 900 Walnut St., Fulton, Ky. 42041. \$10.50.

The Fields family of Kentucky, Tennessee, Virginia, and North Carolina originated with Robert Nelson Pleasant Fields, born 1768 whose parents were Nathaniel and Mary Fields of Guilford County, N. C. The line was developed by means of wills, deeds, census, and tax lists, cemetery stones, Bible records and with the aid of General Services Administrations and the Archives of Kentucky, Tennessee, Virginia and North Carolina. Brief sketches of the allied families of Dodd and Whitesell are included in the Genealogy.

THE SANDFORD-SANFORD FAMILIES OF LONG ISLAND, THEIR ANCESTORS AND DESCENDANTS by Grover Merle Sanford. 1975. Hard covers. Over 167 pages. Indexed. Order from the Author, 49 Grant St., South Farmdale N. Y. 11735. \$10.00.

The Author's paternal ancestors arrived in America at about the same time. Robert Sandford was in Hartford, Conn. about 1634. John Graves was in Concord, Mass. about 1640. There have been other Sandford-Sanford Genealogies in which the Author has proven some serious mistakes. He has proved the four succeeding Ezekiels in the Robert Sandford (1615-1676) line, i.e. Ezekiel I, "The Bridge Builder", second generation; Ezekeil II "Of The Clerkly Hand", third generation; Ezekiel III, "The Patriot", fourth generation; Ezekiel IV, "The Praying Ezekiel", fifth generation and three succeeding Thomases. The first being a son of Ezekiel I. Thomas, "The Whaler", third generation; Thomas, "The Squire", fourth generation; Thomas, "The Young Squire", fifth generation. It is well to note the source of the Author's information: Family Bibles, correspondence with family members, cemetery, obituaries, surrogate, census, D.A.R., regional and county histories and other records, and contacts of the Author, together with documented material.

OUR SMALLEY LINEAGE by Viola Smalley Miller. 1961. Soft covers. Over 145 pages. Indexed. Order from Mrs. Virginia Jensen, 1990 Durham, Palatine, Ill. 60067. \$8.00.

The story begins with John Smalley and Edward Smale, immigrants from England to Mass. and Maine. John, a tailor, was the first to arrive. He came to Plymouth Colony, Mass. June 5, 1632. He married Ann Walden, Nov. 29, 1638. The family moved to Nausett (Eastham) on Cape Cod and lived there 23 years. The next move was to Saconnet, R.I. and a little later Piscataway, Middlesex County, N. J. John died July 30, 1692 and Ann died Jan 29, 1694. They are buried at Piscataway. Edward Smale was born about 1600 and lived in Bideford, Devon, England. He was a clothier, manufacturer, and merchant of woolen goods. He married Elizabeth and was the father of six children. He and Francis, his oldest son, sailed for America about 1635. He stopped at Plymouth to see John Smalley and then settled in Maine by 1640. He worked at various occupations in and around Kittery, Maine. He is presumed to have returned to England as his wife and three younger children never came to America. She died in 1665 and is buried in the old church yard in Bideford. Edward was still living. His death date and burial place is not known.

THE GILLIS FAMILY IN THE SOUTH by Clayton G. Metcalf. 1975, Hard covers. Over 470 pages. Indexed. Order from the Author, Enterprise, Ala. 36330. \$15.00 pp.

Duncan Gillies was the eldest known Gillies and was presumed to have lived on the Isle of Skye, Scotland and most probably in the Parish of Bracadale. Most of the Scotch people who settled in Walton County, Florida were from the Scotch Highlands and the Isle of Skye. The Gillies family of the Author landed at Wilmington, N.C. and moved south in stages to Florida. The Author has written a very interesting and readable genealogy. The book is full of profitable genealogical information, many illustrations and family pictures.

THE PEAK-PEAKE FAMILY HISTORY by Cyrus H. Peake, Editor and Carol J. Snow, associate editor. 1975. Over 275 pages. Indexed. Order from the editor, 923 West Bonita Ave., Claremont, Calif. 91711. Bound \$14.50 Unbound \$11.00.

The authors have a genealogical and historical account of the family from the earliest known origin to the present. The publication is divided into four different volumes. Vol. 1 is a general history of the family in which the origins of the family, its growth and migrations are discussed. Vol. 2 is a genealogy and history of the family in Great Britain. In this volume the ancestry and descendants of Robert Peake of Burrough on the Hill, Leicestershire are discussed. Early Generations family charts are listed. One feature of the publication is a Peake and Non-Peake for each Volume or book.

Edward Smith of Carter County, Tenn. was born in Maryland (not proved) and had three wives and three families. He married Catherine Stump in 1739, 2nd Catherine Stonecypher in 1757 and 3rd another Catherine Stonecypher, a niece of wife No. 2, about 1798 in Carter County Tenn.. He died in Carter County in the spring of 1807 at the age of 87 years. He and wife appear in Rowan County, N. C. in 1761 as a land owner and a tavern operator. Also, as a member of Capt. Thomas Wade's Light Horse in the Rev. War. By 1777 he was in Carter County, Tenn.. He was appointed Justice of the Peace in Washington County in 1790. His will was probated April term of Court in Carter County, Tenn. in 1807. Smithology is well organized and documented and well illustrated with family pictures, etc. It should prove most interesting to those descendants and genealogists searching in Tennessee.

The name of Lancaster was an old and illustrious one in the History of England. The name is associated with the Kings of England and the War of Roses. The Lancasters were the Red Rose. John Lancaster of Henrico County was the first ancestor of the Author of record. John's two sons, Nathaniel and William are established by deeds recorded in 1757 and 1769. It was from Nathaniel and wife, Hope Walder, (12 children) that the direct line is traced. From the grandson (Josiah and wife, Lucy Ann Hudson) of these two Lancasters all descendants are traced.

Starkville and Oktibbeha County is the location of the State University of Mississippi formerly Miss. A and M State College. Every effort was made to get recorded facts from each active public, church, or family cemetery as well as all abandoned cemeteries in the county with only a few small family burial sites as perhaps being overlooked. Several cemeteries in adjacent counties have been noted because some early settlers of Oktibbeha County are buried there.

1810-1910 NEW MADRID COUNTY, MISSOURI PROBATE RECORDS. Transcribed and compiled by Mary M. Brown and Fay Hedgepeth. 1975. Soft covers. Over 112 pages. Indexed. Order from the Authors, New Madrid, Mo. 63869. \$5.00.

The probate records have been abstracted from loose bonds and apprenticeship records on file in the Probate Office. Any record dated prior to 1831 is unrecorded as are some of the later dates. Estate bonds usually contain names of the heirs of the deceased. The apprenticeship bonds give the name of the bound child, sometimes names of the parents and usually age of the minor. Some reference to persons from Ky. and Tenn., which are just across the Mississippi River, may be found.

1847-1874 NEW MADRID COUNTY, MISSOURI MARRIAGE RECORDS. Transcribed and compiled by Mary M. Brown and Fay Hedgepeth. 1973. Soft covers. Over 112 pages. Indexed. Order from the Authors, New Madrid, Mo. 63869. \$5.00.

The marriage records were transcribed from first two books of marriage records on file in the office of the New Madrid Co. Recorder. The first book is marked "C" and the second book is marked "1862-1874" marriages. Some older marriage records are on file with the St. Louis Archives of the Missouri Historical Society. The few recorded marriages for the 1862-1863 years can be accounted for by the fact that the record books were taken to Memphis during the Civil War.

WILL OF ADMIRE TURNER OF BEDFORD COUNTY, VIRGINIA 1818

In the name of God, Amen. I, Admire Turner, of the County of Bedford, being at this time indespoused in body but of sound mine and disposing memory, and knowing it is appointed unto man once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament. Hereby revoking all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made, that is to say;

- First: It is my desire that my Executor hereafter named, out of any monies now the hands of my creditors pay all my just debts and funeral expenses, and that they proceed to sell as soon as convenient after my decease and upon such credit as they may Judge will concern to the interest of the estate all the personal estate with the exception hereafter made, together with my Gandy (?) Branch land and plantation.
- Second: I give to my beloved wife Sally Turner for and during her natural life, the tract of land whereon we now live together with four such Negroes as she shall make choice of and such household and kitchen furniture, plantation utensils and stock as she may want, likewise the interest arising on the balance in the hands of my Executors, whether from sales or otherwise after paying such legacies as are or shall be specifically named and as it respects such negroes as remain after my said wife shall have selected the four above mentioned, I leave it for her to determine whether they shall be sold or hire out, the interest or profits in either case for her as above mentioned.
- Third: I give to my daughter Lucy Chewning Seventy Dollars out of any money in the hands of my Executors having not given her a Horse.
- Fourth: I give to the children of my deceased daughter, Frances Turner, Twenty-five pounds each, viz: John, Milly, and Kitty to remain in the hands of my executors until they shall severally arrive to lawful age and then paid to them with interest.
- Fifth: After my wife's decease, it is my desire that all my estate both real and personal that may remain be equally divided among my following children, to wit; Benjamine, James, Mary Ann Stratton, Lewis Turner, Admire Turner, Milly Leftwich, Sally Grisby, George Turner, Jubal Turner and Lucy Chewning and I give to them and their heirs forever.
- Sixth: Lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my Friend William Leftwich, Jr. and my son Admire Turner Executors to this my last will and testament. In testamony whereof have herunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 27th day of August 1818.

PETER DOWELL, some time in August last (1813), about 30 years of age, 5 feet 9 inches high, light complexion, blue eyes, light hair and well sett, who is supposed to be lurking in Wilkes Co., N.C.

JOHN POMPHREY, Sergt., about 25 years of age, 6 feet high, dark complexion, blue eyes, Black hair, who was sent with an officer in pursuit of deserters, with a hired horse and borrowed saddle, was some time since in Wilkes Co., N.C. but supposed since, to have gone to Kentucky or Tennessee.

JOHN GARRETT, about 30 years of age, 5 feet 8 inches high, fair complexion, light hair, blue eyes, and by proffession a Mill Wright, who deserted in North Carolina on the March from Salisbury to the City of Washington and is supposed to have gone to Rutherford Co., North Carolina.

JOHN BURTON, about 5 feet 10 inches high, 23 years of age, dark hair, dark eyes and by trade a Shoemaker, who was enlisted in Anson Co., N.C.

SOLOMON COOKER, aged 24 years, 5 feet 10 inches high, fair complexion, black eyes, and dark hair.

JOHN KELLY, 23 years of age, 6 feet 1 inch high, dark complexion, grey eyes and black hair.

PHILLIP MATTHEWS, aged 30 years, 5 feet 10 inches high, dark complexion, blue eyes and brown hair.

WILLIAM SHORT, aged 37 years, 5 feet 8 1/2 inches high, dark complexion, black eyes and black hair.

All of the above were enlisted by Lieut. Cranton, in Rutherford Co., N.C. except John Burton.

RILEY FITZPATRICK, age 24 years, 5 feet 10 inches high, a Fifer and is supposed to be lurking in Wilkes co., N.C.

EPHRAIM COOK, a small boy about 14 years of age, enlisted by consent of his father, who is supposed to be about one Smith's, in the lower end of Wilkes Co., N.C.

THOMAS USSORY, deserted at Danville, Va. on the march from the Barracks near Salisbury, to the City of Washington, aged 25 years, dark complexion, dark eyes and dark hair, supposed to aim for Wilkes County or East Tennessee.

GEORGE COOK, from Danville, on the same March, aged 28 years, 5 feet 10 inches high, fair complexion, sandy hair, blue eyes, supposed to aim for Rutherford Co., N.C.

GEORGE DIMSDALE, from same place and on same march, aged 26 years, 5 feet 10 inches high, fair complexion, blue eyes, brown hair and is supposed to aim for Rutherford.

WILLIAM JACKSON, deserted sometime in April last, who has since, by the contrivance of a Friend has been accused of petit larceny and when sent for, this fellow confined him in Richmond jail, North Carolina. This appears to have been an agreement between the soldier Jackson and the then Sheriff. Jackson is about 5 feet 10 inches high, fair complexion, blue eyes, light hair and about 24 years of age.

JAMES GRADY, deserted from Wilkesborough, N.C., description not known, is supposed to have gone to Tennessee in company with other deserters.

It is confidently expected that every good citizen will apprehend these deluded men. The above reward for the whole or ten dollars for each, will be paid together with all reasonable expenses on their being (coubued?) in any jail in the United States and notice given me or delivered to any officer in the United States.
