1860 U. S. CENSUS OF JOHNSON COUNTY, TENNESSEE compiled by Walter W. Wilson. Copyright 1979. Soft back. 140 pp. Indexed. Order from Historical Society of Johnson County, P. O. Box 123, Mountain City, TN 37683. \$10.00

As no surname index of the 1860 U. S. Census of Tennessee has yet been compiled, we are deeply grateful to those individuals and/or societies who are doing so by counties. Copied from microfilm of the original return, Mr. Wilson's publication gives information on all white and free colored people who lived in Johnson County on the first day of June 1860. Said to be one of the many present Tennessee counties settled years before counties were formed, Johnson County's location in the extreme N. E. corner of the state is important not only to researchers of Tennessee, but also to researchers of its boundary states of Virginia and North Carolina.- ERN

VALLEY FORGE, IN SEARCH OF THAT WINTER PATRIOT 19 DECEMBER 1777 - 19 JUNE 1778, A Comprehensive Guide for Tracing Valley Forge Ancestors. Compiled by Ramona Cameron Worley, 1979. Indexed. Soft back. Published by The National Society Sons of the American Revolution, 1000 S. 4th Street, Louisville, KY 40203. Order from the publisher. \$10.00

The purpose of the compiler is to gather into one volume some pertinent data to aid amateur genealogists in their quest for documenting Valley Forge ancestors. Mrs. Worley includes information on how to use the National Archives Form 6751 and the DAR records in research. There are individual chapters for the states represented at Valley Forge. Each state chapter lists the regiments at Valley Forge and has extensive bibliography for locating the Patriots from that state. The states included are Connecticut, Delaware, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Vermont and Virginia. This is a most helpful guide for searchers of Valley Forge and Revolutionary ancestors. - EDS

THE CENSUS RECORDS OF ELBERT COUNTY 1820-1860 AND THE 1850 CENSUS OF WILKES COUNTY Compiled by Irene Stillwell Wilcox. Hard Back. 438 pp. Indexed. Order from the Southern Historical Press % the Rev. Silas Emmett Lucas, Jr., P. O. Box 738, Easley, South Carolina 29640. \$17.50

Elbert County, GA was created in 1790 from Wilkes and Madison Counties. The county was named for Major General Samuel Elbert, who became Governor of Georgia. Wilkes County was named for John Wilkes, a Member of Parliament who opposed the policy of Great Britain toward the American colonies. Elbert and Wilkes are Savannah River counties, with Richmond County and Augusta to the south and South Carolina across the river. These two counties and their predecessors lay in the path of migration from the northern colonies to the southwest and are rich in the early history of GA. Each census is indexed by "Heads of Families"; a complete index follows. - HLB

HISTORY OF KENTUCKY, 2 Volumes by the late Lewis Collins, Revised and Enlarged by his son, Richard H. Collins - 1882. Reprinted 1979. Hard back. 1487 pp. Indexed. Order from Southern Historical Press, % the Rev. Silas Emmett Lucas, Jr. P.O. Box 738, Easley, SC 29640. \$75.00 for the two volumes.

This history of Kentucky was first written and published in 1847. The purpose of

the author was to preserve local and personal histories "many of which exist, at present, only in the ephemeral form of oral tradition..." Twenty-seven years after the first edition Lewis Collins' son "brought it down to the year 1847." Vol. I has a listing of Revolutionary Soldiers, or their widows, in 1840. It also has names of other pioneer soldiers, annals of KY, a chronical of important events 1539-1874, a brief outline history, statistics, geology, climate, and a report on first things in the state. Most of the second volume is devoted to county histories. These histories give first settlers and early events. Some biographies are included within the county histories. It is here that much of the oral history is evident. The books are individually indexed. - EDS

HISTORY OF CHRISTIAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY, by William Henry Perrin. 1884. Reprinted with new material 1979. Hard back. 656 pp. Indexed. Order from Southern Historical Press, P. O. Box 738, Easley, SC 29640. \$32.50

Christian county was erected in 1797 from Logan, which was derived in turn from Lincoln, one of the three original Kentucky counties. Muhlenberg, Todd, McLean, Hopkins, Webster, Henderson, Union, Crittenden, Caldwell, Trigg, Livingston, Lyon, and the eight counties of the Jackson Purchase area have evolved either partially or wholly from her beginnings. Therefore, the earliest history of Christian County is of importance to genealogists who have an interest in Western Kentucky. Perrin sketches the earliest settlers and lists the people living there when the county was formed, people whom he describes as living on the edge of the wilderness and "amidst the blood-curdling shrieks of prowling panthers." There is a special section on Hopkinsville, then biographical sketches of people living in the different precincts begin. The new material added to this volume is the index of approximately 8000 individuals' names. - EWG

THE FARRAR'S ISLAND FAMILY AND ITS ENGLISH ANCESTRY, Alvahn Holmes. 1977. Hard back. 181 pp. Indexed. Order from Miss Alvahn Holmes, 5015 Boxhill Lane, Baltimore, MD 21210. \$20.00

The main object of the author's work has been to find convincing proof of the parentage of William Farrar, who emigrated to Virginia in 1618 and to give a brief account of the fine old English families from whom he descended, based on actual records and the work of English authorities on each family. Farrar's Island, about fifteen miles below Richmond, consists of about 600 acres and is in that part of the James River where the river's meandering forms several large islands. This was the home of the Farrars for one hundred years, and also the site of Henrico Towne. Family charts, maps, pictures and coats of arms add interest to the text. - EWG

THE KEOWEE COURIER, 1849-1851, 1857-1861, and 1865-1868, edited by Colleen M. Elliot 1979. Hard back. 197 pp. Indexed. Order from Southern Historical Press, % the Rev. Silas Emmett Lucas, Jr., P. O. Box 738, Easley, SC 29640. \$17.50

The Keowee Courier was first published at Pickens Court House, SC, but was moved to Walhalla, the county seat of Oconee County, in 1868, after the original Pickens District was divided into present-day Oconee and Pickens counties. Abstractions were made from available newspapers of May 1849 to May 1851, April 1857 to July 1861, and Sept. 1865 to Aug. 1868. Notices of deaths, marriages, legal notices, and genealogical quotes from other newspapers are included here. Although the title does not indicate it, the notices continue through 15 Nov. 1883. - HLB

THIS OUR HERITAGE, THE ANCESTRAL HISTORY OF CHARLES AND CORA BEARD INGRAM, by Gladys A. Ingram. 1978. Hard Back. 278 pp. Indexed. Order from the author at 620 South Walnut, Stillwater, OK. 74074. \$15.00

Looking at a four generation pedigree for herself and three siblings, Miss Ingram deals with each surname in turn. Each is traced as far back as possible; many extend back into other countries. In name they are: Ingram, Beard, Nichleson, Savage, Crane, Lashley and Smith. When these have converged into her immediate family, a more personal style evolves, which makes very enjoyable reading as well as an educational account of life in Oklahoma early in the century. There are many family portraits, reproductions of tintypes, and original records. - EWG

HISTORY OF FAYETTE COUNTY, KENTUCKY, by William Henry Perrin. 1882. Reprint 1979. Hard back. Indexed. 905 pp. Order from Southern Historical Press, % the Rev. Silas Emmett Lucas, Jr., P. O. Box 738, Easley, SC 29640. \$40.00

In 1776 Kentucky was designated as Kentucky County, Virginia. In 1780 this area was divided into three counties, Fayette comprising nearly one third of the state. By 1790 Fayette had birthed Bourbon and Woodford, and in turn, many others by 1900. An outline of this blue grass region covers such topics as the prehistoric mound-builders, Daniel Boone, early travel, churches, agriculture, horses, cattle, horticulture and manufacturing. There are lists of jailers, sheriffs, judges and state representatives. A special section on Lexington discusses its growth, educational facilities, churches, lawyers, the press, secret societies and war history. Another section describes the election precincts of Athens, Brier Hill, Dog Fennel, Sandersville, South Elkhorn and East Hickman, with special interest stories on each. Biographical sketches and some portraits are in the back. - EWG

SAINT DAVID'S PARISH, SOUTH CAROLINA MINUTES OF THE VESTRY 1768-1832, PARISH REGISTER 1819-1924, by Brent H. Holcomb C.A.L.S., 1979. 149 pp. Indexed. Hard back. Order from the Southern Historical Perss % the Rev. S. Emmett Lucas, Jr., P. O. Box 738, Easley, SC 29640. \$25.00

The contents of this book have been transcribed from the Vestry Minutes and Parish Register of St. David's Parish, Cheraw, South Carolina. The Cheraws District was partitioned in 1785 to form three counties - Chesterfield, Marlboro and Darlington. Some of Chesterfield and Darlington County records have been destroyed, and this volume adds knowledge and information about people in this area. The dates included are from 1768 to early 20th century. Until 1778 the Vestry was as much a political body as a religious one, and although St. David's was an Anglican Church, its records include persons of other denominations. Some of the categories included are voting lists, ministers, church officers, baptisms, marriages and burials.-EDS

BERTIE COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA COUNTY COURT MINUTES, 1772 THRU 1780, BOOK IV, by Weynette Parks Haun. 1979. Soft back. Over 144 Pages. Indexed. Order from Weynette Parks Haun, 243 Argonne Dr., Durham, NC 27704. \$16.50

Ms Haun is continuing her "good works" unto genealogists in this latest verbatim transcription of court minutes from microfilm of the original. Bertie County seems to have continued "business as usual" during these Revolutionary years. The probate of wills gives family connections that may not have been obvious before, and the guardianship and bastardy bonds may indicate name changes not otherwise accounted for. Jury and tavern permits show citizenship before the first census. Reading early handwriting is tedious, and we appreciate Ms Haun's work. - HLB

TALLAHATCHIE COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI MARRIAGE RECORDS-CHARLESTON 1856-1915, Compiled by Pauline Casey Briscoe and Bonny Briscoe Jenkins. 1979. Soft back. 232 pp. Indexed. Order from Mrs. Cecil D. Briscoe, 3223 Lyndale Ave., Memphis, TN 38112 \$12.95

Mrs. Briscoe's mother admonished her to never talk about a resident of Tallahatchie County because she was probably kin to them all! When she began to research these records, she found this was very good advice. The marriages are listed in alphabetical order according to the groom and there is an index of brides' surnames in the back. Also, each marriage has page and book number given as an aid to anyone who might wish to obtain a copy of the license from the courthouse in Charleston.-EWG

ANDERSON COUNTY (TENNESSEE COUNTY HISTORY SERIES), by Katherine B. Hoskins. 1979. Hard back. 130 pp. Indexed. Order from Memphis State University Press, Memphis, Tennessee 38152. \$10.00 - Pre-subscription for ALL 95 counties - \$9.00 each.

Memphis State University Press is beginning the publication of a history of each of Tennessee's ninety-five counties; this is the first. A need was felt for bringing the state's history up to date, and much of this material is previously unpublished. Anderson County was created in 1801, and her boundaries have changed at times, as have the life styles of her people. The early settlers were agrarian; then came the era of industrial progress, the TVA and Oak Ridge. If you have family lines in Anderson, don't miss this one. - EWG

DYER COUNTY AND NEWBERN, TENNESSEE, by Arahwana Hendren Ridens. 1979. Hard back. Indexed. 373 pp. Order from Southern Historical Press, % the Rev. Silas E. Lucas, Jr., P. O. Box 738, Easley, SC 29640. \$22.50

The author says that her aim is "to help families and friends to know where they came from...and how they are all connected." She uses excerpts from the diaries of H. R. A. McCorkle of Newbern, TN that were started in 1848 and continued for 58 years. They give a vivid picture of life in Dyer County with genealogical information about births, deaths, marriages, detailed weather observations and how it affected events of the time. Local, state and national politics are included. McCorkle's story of the Civil War and of his service in Col. Tyree Bell's command under Gen. N. B. Forrest is included almost exactly as he wrote it. The 39 Dyer County families with records in the book are: Atkins, Bell, Bryant, Burkett, Cole, Douglass, Drane, Enochs, Ferguson, Fowlkes, Fuller, Fumbanks, Gauldin, Glass, Harris, Hendren, Hendrix, Holland, Jackson, Jones, Lanier, Ledsinger, McCorkle, McCullough, McKnight, Moore, Nichols, Parks, Pate, Porter, Pritchard, Purcell, Scobey, Sugg, Sullivan, Tarrant, Williams, Williamson and Young.

INDEX TO GENEALOGICAL PERIODICAL LITERATURE 1960-1977, Volume 9 in the Gale Genealogy and Local History Series, by Kip Sperry. 1979. Hard back. 166 pp. Order from Gale Research Company, Book Tower, Detroit, Michigan 48226. \$24.00

The purpose of this index is to help researchers find source material in genealogical and historical periodicals. The preface lists the 88 periodicals whose material has been indexed over a 17 year period, in most cases, according to subject and author/title. This list does not include all published quarterlies, only certain selected ones. The subject index will intrigue you with such items as the French in America, the Loyalists, Anabaptists, tombstone rubbings, Vatican archives, etc. The author suggests that you first check to see if your local library has the desired periodical; if not, it perhaps can be obtained on inter-library loan.- EWG

CENSUSES FOR GEORGIA COUNTIES: TALIAFERRO 1827, LUMPKIN 1838, CHATHAM 1845, Census series No. 4, Marilyn L. Adams, Editor. 1979. Soft back. 57 pp. Indexed. Order from R. J. Taylor, Jr. Foundation, P. O. Box 38176, Capitol Hill Station, Atlanta, GA 30334. \$5.00

This publication concerns itself with the state censuses of Taliaferro, Lumpkin, and Chatham Counties of the years indicated. State Censuses were specified by the 1798 state constitution and were required every seven years. The purpose was for reapportioning the State House of Representatives. The first was taken in 1799 and the last in 1859. The Civil War and subsequent changes in the constitution terminated these censuses. They were valuable in that they supplemented the federal censuses and in that they pinpointed the person and gave additional information concerning year of birth, death, marriage, and other human activities. - HLB

UNION COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA, MINUTES OF THE COUNTY COURT 1785-1799, by Brent H. Holcomb. 1979. Hard back. 554 pp. Indexed. Order from the Southern Historical Press, % the Rev. Silas Emmett Lucas, Jr., P. O. Box 738, Easley, SC 29640. \$30.00

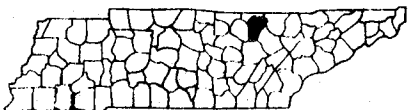
Union County was formed in Ninety-Six District by the County Court Act of 1785. In 1791 the court system was changed and another court added. These minutes are not only records of both courts, but also accounts of the daily life-style of early settlers in Piedmont Carolina. The book lists deeds, probate records, minor court cases, bastardy cases and jury lists, as well as applications for tavern licenses and ferry permits. County officials bonds are recorded as are the sections of roads allotted to overseers for maintenance. This last category helps locate the residence of a given settler at a particular time and gives a clue to an early map of this county. Mr. Holcomb has given genealogists a valuable tool in an area about which little has been published.

JOHNSTON COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA COUNTY COURT MINUTES, 1823 thru 1826 BOOK XII, by Weynette Parks Haun. 1979. Soft back. Over 153 pages. Indexed. Order from Weynette Parks Haun, 243 Argonne Dr., Durham, North Carolina 27704. \$16.50

County Court minutes contain much valuable information that the federal census does not furnish. These minutes can pinpoint a person who has moved into and out of a county between federal censuses or who has been overlooked by a federal census. Johnston County was formed in 1746 from Craven County which was formed in 1712 from Bath County. Bath County had its beginning in 1696 and was discontinued in 1739. Genealogical search for Johnston should extend back through the records of its preceding mother counties, but the searcher of its modern day neighbors could benefit from these court minutes. Early Wilson County records may be found here because that county was formed partially from Johnston in 1855.

Ms Reeve has told the story of her Georgia county in a chatty, newspaper-column style, and indeed she has taken much of her material from interviews with people whose forebears lived in Gordon County and includes the family stories and a few pictures as well. Because the county is located on the railroad and highway from Chattanooga to Atlanta, this was the route General Sherman took during the Civil War. The area suffered much destruction of property and records at this time. The author has used a unique style and has made an interesting story of this historic county.

December 19, 1846 - Married on Tuesday last at the residence of Mr. Jesse A. Forman, by Judge T. M. Yancey, Mr. Edmond P. Morrill of Memphis, Tenn. to Miss Susan M. Forman of Holly Springs.

Married on the 14th inst. at the residence of Capt. T. Wilson, by Rev. Benjamin Culpepper, Mr. Richard Dotson of Fayette County, Tenn. to Miss Susan Spencer of this county.

January 8, 1847 - Married on 6th January, 1847 by Rev. W. H. Seat of Somerville, Tenn., G. Zelotes Adams, the poet of Oxford, Miss. to Miss Lucy Catherine Agee of Marshall Co., Miss., daughter of James A. Agee Esq. of Buckingham Co., Va.

January 29, 1847 - Married in Memphis, Tenn. on 20th January at the residence of D. S. Greer Esq. by Rev. Mr. Alston, Dr. A. Hopton to Miss Susan M. Porter, daughter of the late Gen. Richard Porter of Paris, Tenn.

July 2, 1847 - Married on 6th June at the residence of Capt. James Wallace by Rev. Dr. F. Courtney, Mr. David S. Wells of Memphis, Tenn. to Miss Louise E. Wallace of this county. (from *The Eldorado Ark. Union*)

Died at the residence of her husband, J. Cooney in Henry Co., Tenn., Mrs. Mary Cooney, age 37 years.

FAMILY GATHERINGS

HAYDON WELLS - Information from Mrs. Clara Hamlett Robertson, 215 Young Avenue, Henderson, NC 27530

On December 24, 1779 a group of descendants of early settlers walked across the Woodland Street Bridge in Nashville, Tennessee, re-enacting the crossing of the Cumberland River 200 years earlier by General James Robertson and his group. One of the men in the original group was Haydon Wells, who had been born in Virginia before 1749, later helping to draw up the Cumberland Compact of May 1, 1780 which was presented to the North Carolina Assembly. He was in Kaskaskia, Illinois briefly, and lived in both Davidson and Montgomery Counties in Tennessee; in 1810 he moved to Mississippi Territory in the section that later became Washington County, Alabama. There he died after 1818.

HAYDON WELLS was the son of Capt. Samuel Wells and his wife, ? Haden; his grandparents were Charles Wells of Prince William County, Virginia and his Irish wife, ? Carty. Montgomery County, Tennessee Deed Book A, pages 20, 23 and 40 show that Haydon Wells and wife, Margaret, jointly sold some negroes. Their children were: Archelus Wells, Benjamin Drury Wells and Robert Wells.

ROBERT WELLS was born in 1764 and died between 1832 and 1840 in Montgomery County, Tennessee. His first wife, (name unknown) and their two children were killed by Indians in 1793. His second wife, (Ann Beaty?) petitioned for divorce and alimony in 1817. (See Robert Beaty vs Robert Wells, Montgomery County Minute Book, Vol. 8, page 29 1817-1818) His third wife, Sarah ?, was the widow of William Hubbard of Weakley County, Tennessee, and formerly a widow of Simon Ward. By his first marriage the children were: Haydon E. born 1792 and possibly Anna, the first white girl born in the Cumberland Settlement. By later marriages, he had Elizabeth who married Judge William Fitzgerald of Paris, Tennessee; Imahal who married Thomas F. Roberts of Dover, Tennessee and Nancy Wells who was buried in Riverview Cemetery, Clarksville, Tennessee.

NANCY WELLS born 1794, at age 13 married her father's overseer, the 19 year old Josiah Morrison, and they were the parents of Nancy Morrison who married her first cousin Jesse Morrison; Robert R. Morrison born 1812; William W. Morrison born 1814; James Morrison born 1815; Sarah Morrison born 1819, married Mr. Jett. Josiah Morrison born 1788 in North Carolina (according to the 1850 census but no proof), died in 1868 and is buried in Riverview Cemetery, Clarksville, Tennessee.

JESSE and NANCY (MORRISON) MORRISON were parents of Wesley Washington Morrison (1833-1886) who married Mary Jane Hamlett; Martha Morrison born 1836 married Samuel P. Jones and Susan Elizabeth Morrison born 1838 in Salem Community, Montgomery County, Tennessee and died in 1900 in Clarksville, Tennessee. Nancy Morrison died in childbirth when Susan Elizabeth was born and the children lived with their mother's parents. The girls are identifiable in the 1840 census, and all three are named in the 1850 census.

SUSAN ELIZABETH MORRISON married James Joseph Hamlett who was born in 1824 in Fort Royal area, Montgomery County, Tennessee and died in 1902 in Clarksville, Tennessee. Their children: Robert Lee Hamlett; Clara Hamlett married Barksdale; Nannie Hamlett married Terrell Collins of Alvord, Texas; Joseph J. Hamlett (youngest) who moved with his brother, Robert to Texas and later to California; James Morrison Hamlett born 1864 in Clarksville and died 1948 in Kingsport, Tennessee. The latter was father of the compiler.

TAYLOR FAMILY of North Carolina and Tennessee. Information from Jessie Taylor Webb, 1914 Poplar Avenue, Apt. 217, Memphis, Tennessee 38104

In June 1816 court of Franklin County, North Carolina, what must have been a rather controversial will was probated. Major FRANCIS TAYLOR gave his wife, PATTY TAYLOR, only his "riding chair, harness and best chair horse" because he "solomnly declared she never loaned him one cent in her life." His son, WILLIAM PENN TAYLOR, was left "the whole of the truth and honesty I may possess in addition to what he was entitled to as the half brother of NANCY THORP, deceased." His unoffending granddaughter, ANN ELIZA TAYLOR, was left \$500, and the remainder of his estate was to be divided between his son, THOMAS PERSON TAYLOR, and his daughter, ANN WILLIAMS JOHNSON, wife of CHARLES EARL JOHNSON. In a codicil he expressed the desire that "none of my family (except my daughter) wear the smallest scrip or badge of mourning for me as I am convinced not one of them (except herself) will be the least sorry for my death."

In 1785 FRANCIS TAYLOR had married MARTHA ("Patty") PERSON, widow of PETERSON THORP, who had three children: BENJAMIN PERSON THORP, NANCY ANN THORP and PATTY THORP. The Thorp children did not approve of FRANCIS TAYLOR'S guardianship of them, and after his death there must have been further dissention in the family. PATTY TAYLOR made her home with WILLIAM PENN TAYLOR but financial reverses arose, and after PATTY'S death in 1836 matters went from bad to worse. WILLIAM PENN TAYLOR sold or lost everything including his wife, REBECCA JANE McLEROY, in 1837, and moved with his ten minor children in 1838 to Haywood County, Tennessee. There he died later the same year and was buried in the Old Wesley Cemetery. A record of the ten children is recorded in his Bible:

1. ANN ELIZA TAYLOR - born 1814 in NC, died 1848 in TN. She married first in 1833 WILLIAM H. FOSTER, who died in Louisburg, NC in 1838. They were parents of three children. She married second, Dr. Franklin Sanders, a colnel in the War of 1812, but there was no issue.
2. MARIAH KELLY TAYLOR - born 1815 in NC, died 1841 at Old Wesley near Stanton, TN. She married MOSES F. ADAMSON, who Haywood County, TN Minute Books show was appointed guardian of Mary R. Taylor, Martha H. Taylor, William Taylor and Issac Taylor. There is no record of whether Moses and Mariah Adamson had any children.
3. JOHN P. TAYLOR - born 1817 in NC, killed in a hunting accident near Covington TN in 1859. He married first JANE E. MANNING of Memphis and had a son, FRANK TAYLOR, who is thought to have gone to TX. In 1858 he married second, MOLLIE SMITH of Covington, TN and had one daughter, JACKQUE LENA TAYLOR. There are Tappan descendants in Helena AR.
4. MARY REEVES (or Rives) TAYLOR - born 1819 in NC, married CORYDON SETH SPENCER who died in 1890 in NC. They preserved William Penn Taylor's Bible and carried it back to NC when they moved there.
5. MARTHA H. TAYLOR - born 1823 in NC and died 1847 in Haywood County TN. She married 1840 WILLIAM W. WARE, and their only son, JOE WARE, born in 1844, married Molly Boyd. They lived in Covington, TN and ha a number of children.
6. WILLIAM F. (Fletcher?) TAYLOR - born 1825 in NC. He is thought to have gone to Texas after he left Haywood County, TN. There is no record of marriage or children.
7. ISAAC H. TAYLOR - born 1828 in NC, died in Memphis, TN. In 1852 he married ELIZA M. TALLY in Shelby County, TN, but there is no record of any descendant.
8. RECECCA REEVES (or Rives) TAYLOR - born 1830 in Louisburg, NC, died 1892. She is thought to have married a Mr. Bidwell and gone to Trinity, TX.
9. WILEY PERRY TAYLOR - born 1831 in Louisburg, NC, died 1882 at Stanton, TN. His

older brother, John P., had brought him to Memphis where he worked as a clerk and later as a salesman. In 1858 he married FRANCES LENOW, daughter of JAMES LENOW and ELIZABETH BABB, in Memphis. During their early married life they lived in Memphis, but moved to Stanton, TN where the younger children were born.

10. ELIZABETH JANE ("Lizzy") TAYLOR - born 1834 in NC, died 1892. She married R. B. EDWARDS of Tipton County, TN in 1853 and had three children. Their two daughters married brothers named Finley and are said to have been founders of Finley, TX.

William A. Floyd - born 15 Aug 1829, died 28 May 1861 in Lawrence County, TN

Nancy C McNeil - born 16 May 1831, died 28 Mar 1908

They were married in Lawrence County 24 Nov 1850 by B. W. West, J.P. The bride was given in marriage by William C. McNeil. Their children were:

Henry W. Floyd - born 28 Sept 1852

Lucy Joannah Floyd - born 6 Aug 1859

Selah M. Floyd - born 8 Feb 1855

WILLIAM AND CATHERINE GATES - Information from Mrs. W. S. Watters, Route 2 Box 23, Abilene, Texas 76861

The first mention of WILLIAM GATES is found in Edmund L. Starling's "History of Henderson County, Kentucky" when on the second Tuesday in July 1799 he was empanelled on the grand jury. In the July term of 1810 he and ABNER KUYKENDALL were appointed commissioners to view a road from the Town of Henderson to the main ford of Highland Creek. Their names also appear in the Order Book A-1 of Russellville, Logan County, Kentucky. WILLIAM GATES and family left Kentucky and settled "four or five miles below Cadron Creek" in Pulaski County, Arkansas prior to July 1813 when he sold his claim to THOMAS GREEN. He witnessed a deed there in 1819 before moving to Miller County and thence to Texas in 1821 where he became one of the "Old Three Hundred" settlers in Stephen F. Austin's colony. As an inhabitant of the River Brasses in the Province of Texas in 1823 he was a man aged 60, with his wife, Catherine, age 57. He had a 17 year old daughter, 1 horse, 7 head of cattle, 40 hogs, and was considered a farmer of good character.

On 16 January 1829 SAMUEL GATES made a deposition that he frequently heard WILLIAM GATES in his lifetime, say that he had procured from the Mexican Government a half league of land joining SAMUEL GATES' half league on the Brazos below said half league which he intended for CHARLES GATES. The land had been surveyed by Josiah H. Bell. The land to be deeded when he got the money. WILLIAM GATES also intended deeding AMOS GATES land on which he had made improvements, but AMOS was to pay the government fees. A fraction of the land immediately above Doe Creek fronting on the Brazos, WILLIAM GATES intended to deed to JANE GATES. In the deposition, SAMUEL GATES swore that he "was born in the State of Tennessee of the United States of the North, that he was forty years of age, of the Roman Catholic Apostolic religion."

By using "List of the Inhabitants of the River Brasses in the Province of Texas in 1823", by J. H. Bell and Mullin's "First Census of Texas", one may construct this list of children of WILLIAM and CATHERINE GATES, members of the "Old Three Hundred".

1. SARAH (Sallie) GATES KUYKENDALL, age 40 in 1823, wife of ABNER KUYKENDALL, age 46. Their three daughters, ages 19, 11 and 4 years were listed along with six sons, ages 17, 15, 13, 9 and 7, and twin boys 2 years old. ABNER KUYKENDALL's will and estate administration are extant.
2. SAMUEL L. GATES, age 34 in 1823, wife KATY PYEATT, age 26. They were parents of daughters ages 8 and 4 years, and a son age 6. SAMUEL L. GATES was a pre-emption claimant opposite Crystal Hill. His will is recorded in Washington County, Texas in 1836. KATY PYEATT's father died without a will, but she is named in administration of his estate.
3. HANNAH GATES HANKS, age 28 in 1823, was on the 1835 Texas Census of San Augustine. In 1853 she requested her lawyers, Rogers & Searcy, to collect from the estate of her brothers, WILLIAM and RANSOM GATES, any and/or all part that she was due. This partition established the two sons and the daughter, HANNAH GATES HANKS, of the senior WILLIAM GATES: WILLIAM GATES, the younger, RANSOM and HANNAH GATES HANKS.
4. CHARLES GATES, age 25 in 1823, was a single man of good character. He was on the 1835 Texas Census of San Augustine County. In 1829 he named his oldest brother, SAMUEL GATES, as his legal representative in the settlement of his father's estate - the senior WILLIAM GATES. CHARLES listed his home in the San

Augustine, Tenaha District, filed 12-21-1846. There is a Power of Attorney to SAMUEL and AMOS GATES. AMOS GATES was appointed guardian of CHARLES GATES' estate with MINERVA HANKS GATES.

5. AMOS GATES, age 23 in 1823, a young farmer of good character. His obituary of 1883 was in the Christian Advocate. JAS. B. GATES, youngest son, was administrator of the estate.
6. RANSOM GATES, age 21 in 1823, a young farmer of good character, was named in HANNAH GATES' records.
7. JANE GATES, age 17 in 1823. In family records she is listed as wife of D. A. PERRY, M.D., son of Sion Perry of North Carolina and Tennessee.
8. WILLIAM GATES, the younger, age unknown.
9. Mrs. Watters believes there was another child born after Sarah Gates Kuykendall who has not been identified.

Solomon L. Leonard, born 14 Nov 1811 in Franklin County, Ohio, went to Knox County, TN to teach school. He married first on 8 Jan 1833, Perilla Fisk, born 11 May 1818; she died 15 Sep 1834. Solomon then married on 16 Dec 1837 in Knox County, TN, Leannah Hall, born 12 Aug 1818 in Knox County. They went to Missouri in the spring of 1838. Solomon died by drowning near Ft. Gibson, Indian Territory on 24 Sep 1861. There were ten children, all born in Missouri. The Leonard Bible contains the following information

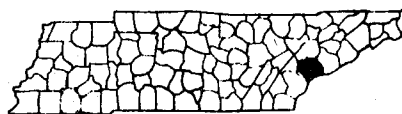

In 1932, Mr. Will E. Parham of Maryville, TN gathered together and copied all the old marriage records that he could find in the Blount County court house. He stated that he was induced to do so by the members of the DAR chapter there, and that he was over seventy-two years old at the time. He made a typed and roughly indexed copy of more than 4000 couples who were married, or took out licenses, between 1795 and 1854. Record Book 1 begins with July 1854 and goes to May 1870. The Tennessee State Library and Archives has microfilmed Mr. Parham's records and the first volume of marriages, and it is from this film that these first twenty-five years were extracted. Mr. Parham stated that the original papers were in very poor shape, and our copy of the film has been scratched in the processing, so that a few blank spots may occur from time to time, but how fortunate for researchers that so much of it has survived, and how grateful we are to Mr. Parham.

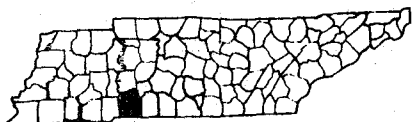

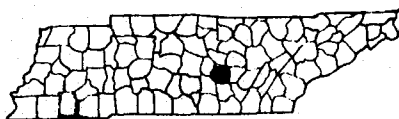
