These funds will be used to digitize 14 cassettes with the "Voices of the Memphis Belle" collection. Many of you remember the airplane that sat on the south side of Central at the Armory near the Fairgrounds and then on Mud Island. Here at this library we have the cassettes of first-person accounts of the men who flew on the plane and the woman for whom it was named. Between now and May 2019, we need to work hard to digitize the sounds of their interviews. A volunteer has been secured to improve the sound and make them into MP3 recordings.

TNGS needs your help to transcribe (type) the words of the men who flew on the *Memphis Belle*. Please

Meet Charles Arthur Speed

Charles Speed, currently the Director of Membership, has been a member since about 1970 when TNGS was located on Madison Ave. in Memphis. Over the years, Charles has maintained his membership as the TNGS moved their headquarters to Union Ave. in Memphis, Davies Plantation in Brunswick, TN, and then to Germantown, TN. He served on the Board as Vice President (1976-77) and as Business Manager and has volunteered in many other capacities for the Society.



Born in Memphis, TN, Charles was a Boy Scout and sang in the choir and was an acolyte at Holy Trinity Church. He graduated from East High School in Memphis. He was the cadet Col. in ROTC and on the rifle team. At Memphis State U., he was an Airman cadet for a couple of years. Charles was a member of the Marines Air Wing reserve in Millington, TN (1961-72). He has been a member of the Germantown Church of Christ for 50 years.

In 1968, Charles married Shirley Timmons and they had three children--Charles Jason, Kelli and Shannon. Charles has four grandchildren--Charles Wyatt, Cody, Abigail, and Marshal. Shirley passed away in 2001, and Charles married Jane Pugh in 2003.

Volunteer work has always been a part of Charles's life. As a member of the Memphis Jaycees and Shelby Co. Sheriff Reserve, he worked the Germantown Horse Show before they formed their own police reserve. He is currently a volunteer for the World Golf Championships-FedEx St. Jude Invitational (formerly the FedEx St. Jude Golf Tournament.) He is the longest-serving volunteer at this event, having served since 1960 (58 years!).

Charles descends from a line of five generations of builders in Memphis. He bought Germantown Lumber in 1990 and also owned The Salon and Boutique of Germantown. He has built many commercial centers, stores, a church, a bank, and many homes around Germantown.

Charles has been an Ambassador and member of the Germantown Chamber of Commerce since 1990. He was named "Ambassador of the Year" in 2017. Charles was in the "Leadership Germantown" class of 2016, where he received the "Jim Roberts Award."

Germantown Community Library Hold Requests Policies

Effective November 1, 2018

All patrons using the shared Wolf River Library Consortium catalog (Germantown, Millington and Arlington libraries) can place *Hold Requests* on records in the online catalog, including new and onorder records. On-order records are placeholders for items that have not yet been published. There is no guarantee of when on-order items will be available, since the publisher may delay or even cancel a publication for a variety of reasons.

Patrons of the owning library get preferential placement in the holds queue; other patrons' holds will be filled only after all holds by the owning library's patrons have been fulfilled. After three months, holds on items will no longer be preferential by owning library, but will be filled in the date order they are received. **Hold Requests** for on-order records follow the same preference rules.
