We appreciate Mr. J. Kenneth Kerby, 1849 Central Ave., recording the talk given by Mr. Leonard W. Severson at our last meeting. Mr. Severson is branch president of the Memphis First Branch, Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Mr. Kirby gives the following brief report for those unable to attend:

"The Genealogical Society of the Church of the Latter-day Saints was organized in 1894 in Salt Lake City, Utah. Their library, as of January 1963, contained almost 70,000 volumes, the majority of which are locality records, family histories or genealogies. They have 325,000 rolls of microfilm, which include records from all of the fifty states of the U. S. and 18 foreign countries. These records are preserved in especially constructed caves where the temperature never varies more than 10 degrees. Their library is open to the public every day from 8 a.m. til 5 p.m., except Sunday. A family survey will be made upon request for \$10.00 for all areas except Switzerland, which is \$15.00. A check or money order must accompany the request. Address your request to: Records Office, The Genealogical Society, 107 South Main St., Salt Lake City, Utah. Information required: A pedigree chart showing the line or lines to be surveyed (not more than three lines), state specifically which lines to be surveyed, if several generations extend beyond lines 4, 5, 6, and 7, state relationship to person requesting the survey, if any. Remember the researcher has no way of determining how much or how little information the patron has already, unless the patron tells them, so send all information possible."

May I answer the question mark? The "v" should have been a "u" -- the family name is properly spelled MELUGIN; however, on many early documents, recorders spelled the name a variety of ways including Malugen/Malugin/ Mallugan. As one historian of the Melugin Clan, I am presently working on this particular man's line. I have evidence of his living in Davidson County, 1794 and 1798; Williamson County, 1805-1809; Hickman County, 1814-1834, land grants and deeds."

EAST TENNESSEE SURVEYS 1807-1813

Submitted by Mable H. Thornton (Mrs. Robert E.), Rockwood, Tennessee.

These abstracts are taken from the original surveys recorded in Record Book A which is filed in the office of the Register of Deeds, Roane County, Tennessee. The volume contains 828 surveys dating from August 24, 1807 to November 8, 1813 for the "Fourth Surveyor District." John McClellan was the Surveyor General for the Fourth District. Deputy Surveyors were Joshua Cox, John Hackett, Abraham McClellan, William McClellan, Josiah Patty, John Purris, Jeffery Robinson, James Scott, Robert Tunnell, and Samuel Walker.

Each survey identifies the land surveyed as being in Anderson, Bledsoe, Campbell, Overton, Rhea, or Roane County, with two surveys describing land in Knox County. The present-day counties of Cumberland, Fentress, Loudon, Morgan, Pickett, Scott, Sequatchie, and Union were formed in part from those counties.

These abstracts are arranged by county and name of owner. Data includes Survey Number and date, Entry Number and date (if given), the date of recording, the date the plat was lifted or delivered, and the number of acres. The description of the location of the land has been limited to landmarks and names of individuals mentioned in the original surveys. The names of the "Sworn Chain Carriers" have been included since it can be shown that frequently the carriers were neighbors or relatives of the owner.

It should be noted that these abstracts do not include the recitations tracing the assignment of the certificate on which the survey was based. The lengthy and somewhat repetitious nature of this material prohibits its inclusion here although many of the names of the assignees are not mentioned otherwise.

PETITIONERS OF GREEN COUNTY, TENNESSEE, ASKING FOR REDUCTION IN TAXES, ETC. 1809

Transcribed by Jewel B. Standefer (Mrs. E. M.)

To The Honourable the General Assembly of the State of Tennessee now sitting in Knoxville. We your humble Petitioners, Citizens of Green County of State afores'd with the Prefference of Prospect beg leave to submit & lay before your Honourable body the Supreme power of this state, The grievances which we labour under, and hope that you in your wisdom will take the several complaints under your wise consideration and supply each of them as you in your wisdom may deem right. We your Memoralists finding it Extreamly difficult from the present Embarrassment abroad, to procure money for a support of meeting the public demand: We hope that you in your wisdom will point out a way by which our Taxes may be reduced: Your Petitioners are astonished when taking a view of the Acts passed since the year 1804: Raising of salaries session after session till at length some of our officers of Government has double the salary they had when we first became a State: and --- what alarms your petitioners more, is we believe that in the period of time our number of Taxable Inhabitants of the state are double the number than what they were when we first became a State, and we are of the opinion that it would be right for you in your wisdom to repeal every Act passed since the year 1804, giving larger salaries to the officers of Government of every description: On the whole there are many of your petitioners that are scarcely able to procure the common necessaries of life, although called upon --- yearly: Your Memoralists further State that after turning(?) to the state land law and perusing it, we are of the opinion from the Expenses incur'd, & the dreadful effects it may produce in future upon those who have been Innocent purchasers from the State of North Carolina, when their Grants are found without vallid warrants annexed to them: We learn from the 37th section of sd law a preference of two years is given to all who have purchased such grants to procure a vallid warrant to secure their land perhaps a 2d & 3d times, but when we read in the latter part of sd section we come to a proviso as follows - viz) provided nothing therein shall be so construed as to prohibit any person having a good & vallid warrant from laying it on the land, where we your petitioners are living on, and have paid the State of North Carolina for it long since: And since have been your obedient subjects paying towards the support of Government yearly: And we your petitioners discover that the day of preference is Elapsed on the 3 day of December next: Is it possible that we should become a prey to the desperate speculator Turned out of doors to rove at large: or spend all we have, at a Suit of law trying Cavate, when in fact according to the land law we have no right at all, or at least many of us expect we must purchase more warrants at six times the value of them: And many of your Men now are of the opinion that we have great reason to believe/when taking into view the Act of Congress granting unto the State of Tennessee power to make Titles on all Bonafide Claims/Congress has a reference precisely to the Session Act & Refers to it alone as a guide, but what has been the decision in Judging Claims, why truly we learn the claims which were long since declared Invallid by the Session Act are now judged to be good in the hands of the money'd men & speculators. Is is possible that we are to have no End to this dark & unknown measure. We therefore, hope that in as much as Congress in her Act in the 3^d section has promised to purchase land West & South of sd line to satisfy good & Bonafide Claims that you in your wisdom would pass a law to compel all warrants to be laid in a given time within the present limits: so as to have an end to sacrafising our best Interests, and by an Act of yours make good all grants obtained from the State of

North Carolina where a consideration has been paid & now in the hands of Innocent purchasers: And your petitioners further pray the replevening law to be continued as you in your wisdom may deem right, and your petitioners as in duty bound will ever pray.

TAYLOR AND HOUSE FAMILY NOTES

Copied from an old family Bible by Blanche Taylor Bowers, Box B, Kirby, Wyoming.

OBITUARY OF MRS. LYDIA A. TAYLOR: "On Tuesday, April 18th, at the family residence in this county (Massac County, Illinois), Lydia A. Taylor, wife of Thomas J. Taylor, age 39 years. It is but seldom that we are called upon to chronicle the death of anyone who strikes the tenderest sympathies of the heart more directly than that of the above estimable lady. True her demise was not unexpected; she has long been a sufferer but her associations have been the most pleasant and her home one where happiness reigned triumphant, save for the presence of the "fell destroyer" who entered and stole the precious jewel away. We extend our sincere condolence ... Lydia A. House, daughter of James H. and Lena House, was born in Tennessee, February 6th, 1839. Died April 18th, 1876 in Massac Co., Ill. Married first, Alexander Clinton Bradshaw; married second, Thomas Jefferson Taylor, born Stewart Co., Tenn., August 23, 1832. The deceased leaves two children, Frances Bradshaw and Thomas Jefferson Taylor of the family home. Burial was at Pell cemetery."

OBITUARY OF THOMAS JEFFERSON TAYLOR: "T. J. Taylor, a familiar figure in Wynne (Arkansas), died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. W. K. Baker Monday morning at 7:30 o'clock June 11, 1906. He was born in Stewart Co., Tenn., August 23, 1832. Mr. Taylor was one of the river men on the Mississippi during the early days when "Mark Twain" plied his trade and through the stirring times of the Civil War. He was pilot on a freighter from 1849 to 1878. In the latter years he was elected sheriff of Massac Co., Ill., which office he held four years and in which he lost a fortune. In 1894 at Bald Knob, Ark. the ex-sheriff was run down by a train and both feet were cut off rendering him almost helpless for the rest of his life. The deceased leaves four children: Mrs. W. K. Baker of this city, T. J. Taylor of Longview, Texas, Mrs. Josephine Spaulding of Paducah Ky., Charles Newton Taylor, Brookport, Ill. The remains were interred at the Cogbill cemetery here Tuesday."

GIBSON COUNTY, TENNESSEE (continued from April 1964):

- BOBBITT GRAVEYARD, Cumberland Presbyterian, 8 miles N.E. Trenton, 1 mile N.E. Dyer on what is known as the old Trenton and Rutherford Road, established prior to 1860 by James Bobbitt by deed to above church. 250 graves.
- BOWERS CHAPEL METHODIST GRAVEYARD, 12 miles S.W. of Trenton, $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles of Brazil on Humbolt and Brazil Road, established 1853 by P. Y. Bowers, by deed.
- BRADFORD GRAVEYARD, also known as Baker's, $\frac{1}{4}$ mile W. of city limits of Trenton to Bradford Highway, ll miles N.E. from Trenton. Established 1865 by J.M. Baker. 700 graves.
- BUCKSNORT PRIMITIVE BAPTIST GRAVEYARD, also known as Pleasant Hill, 5 miles N.W. of Trenton on old Trenton and Dyersburg Road, about 1,000 yards N. of Beech Grove Church. Established prior to Civil War, discontinued in 1923, contains 150 graves. Phillip Walker's father was first person buried here also the original owner of the land. There was in the early days of the cemetery a Primitive Baptist Church at this place. William McFarland was the last person buried there in 1923.
- CAMPGROUND GRAVEYARD, 7 miles E. of Idlewild on Road from Idlewild to Holly-leaf, 20 miles E. of Trenton, established 1864.
- CARTER CEMETERY, also known as Jones', 5 miles S.W. of Trenton on Trenton and Alamo Road, discontinued 1889. The cemetery was plowed up several years ago and the tombstones piled in a fence corner. Families buried there were Jones, Carters, McColough.
- CHINA GROVE BAPTIST GRAVEYARD, 15 miles N.E. of Trenton, 4 miles E. of Rutherford on Rutherford to Bradford Road,
- CLEAR CREEK BAPTIST GRAVEYARD, $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles N.W. of Trenton, $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles E. of Currey on old Trenton and Dyersburg Road, established 1864 by Isaac James.
- CONCORD PRESBYTERIAN GRAVEYARD, 7 miles E. Trenton, $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles W. of Cades, $\frac{1}{4}$ mile N. of Trenton and Cades Highway. Established September 13, 1849 by Thomas B. Jones by deed to Jacob Skiles. Contains 250 graves.
- COOL SPRINGS GRAVEYARD, 21 miles N.W. of Trenton, 10 miles W. of Rutherford, mile N. of Trimble to Rutherford Road.
- DAVIDSON CHAPEL PRESBYTERIAN GRAVEYARD, 6 miles N.E. of Trenton, 1 1/8 miles N. of Avery, 3 miles S.E. of Trenton to Bradford Highway. Established in 1875, contains 200 or more graves.
- DAVID GROVE METHODIST GRAVEYARD, $10\frac{1}{2}$ miles N.E. of Trenton, $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles S. of Bradford, 2 miles W. Idlewild, 1 3/4 miles W. of Milan to Bradford Highway. Established 1923 J.M. Davis et al to trustees.

- DOUBLE SPRINGS CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN GRAVEYARD, $12\frac{1}{2}$ miles S.E. of Trenton, $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles N.E. Gibson, $\frac{1}{4}$ mile N. of Humbolt and Milan Highway. Established October 25, 1841 by Isaac M. Gunter by deed.
- DUCKHILL GRAVEYARD, $8\frac{1}{2}$ miles N.W. of Trenton, 1 mile S. of Currey, 1 mile S. of Upper Trenton and Dyersburg Road on dirt road.
- FLOWER'S CHAPEL GRAVEYARD, Primitive Baptist, $13\frac{1}{2}$ miles N.W. of Trenton, $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles W. of Rutherford on Rutherford and Mason Hall Road, established prior to Civil War by Henry Flower, Sr.
- FOLLIS CHAPEL METHODIST GRAVEYARD, 4 miles S.W. of Trenton on Trenton & Gibson Wells Road. Established January 29, 1914 by J. O. Follis and wife by deed.
- GIBSON CHURCH CEMETERY, Presbyterian, $6\frac{1}{4}$ miles S.E. Trenton, 1 mile S. of Edison, 3 miles S. W. of Humboldt to Trenton Highway.
- GRICE'S GRAVEYARD, 10 miles N.E. of Trenton, $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles S.E. of Dyer on Dyer, Bradford and Greenfield Road, $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles W. of Trenton and Greenfield Highway. Established 1870 by deed from Wm. M. and Lornah Meek to Edmund Keeley, et al, contains some 150 graves. The original one acre was purchased by the following named persons, who were allied families: Lot 1. James Gibson, 2. Nancy G. Davis 3. B. M. Battle 4. Mary and T. J. Callis 5. T. W. Riley 6. W. H. Callis 7. Edmund Keeley 8. Henry Battle. No other reason is given for the name of GRICE except that there was in the immediate vicinity at that time a rural school by that name.
- GRIER'S CHAPEL METHODIST GRAVEYARD, 3 3/4 miles N. of Trenton, 3/4 mile E. of Trenton to Dyer Highway, established August 3, 1894.
- GRIFFINS CHAPEL METHODIST GRAVEYARD, 9 miles N.E. of Trenton, 3 miles W. of Bradford, 1 mile E. of Trenton to Greenfield Highway, established in 1901.
- HARTSFIELD GRAVEYARD, 11 miles S.W. of Trenton, 1 mile W. of Brazil, off the Brazil and Eaton Road. Established in 1850 by Dick Hartsfield, discontinued some years ago. Started as a family cemetery by Dick Hartsfield. He and his wife and some of their children are buried there.
- HOPEWELL GRAVEYARD, Methodist Episcopal Church South, $19\frac{1}{4}$ miles S.E. of Trenton, $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles S.E. of West, 1 3/4 miles N.E. of Medina and Spring Creek Road, 1 mile W. of Carroll County line.
- HOPEWELL GRAVEYARD, Cumberland Presbyterian, $17\frac{1}{2}$ miles S.E. of Trenton, $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles E. of Medina on Medina and Spring Creek Road, established 1837.
- HUCKABY'S GRAVEYARD, 5.1 miles N.E. of Trenton on old Trenton and Dresden Road, 3/4 mile S. of Riverside Store (Cross Roads), established in 1840 by W. T. Huckaby, discontinued in 1890, contains 15 graves.
- KEAS' GRAVEYARD, Methodist, $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles N.E. of Trenton, $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles N.E. of Dyer, $\frac{1}{2}$ mil E. of Dyer to Goodluck Road, commonly called Keely Mill Road. Established prior to 1860 by deed of gift from Jim Keas, 250 graves.
- LOCUST GROVE GRAVEYARD, 13 miles N.E. of Trenton, 2 miles N.W. of Bradford, 3/4 miles N.W. of Bradford to Martin Highway.
