Numbers of you have asked for the mailing dates of "Ansearchin'" News. The 1900 CENSUS IS NOW AVAILABLE for purchase, and all restrictions on access to it are lifted, according to an announcement received from the National Archives. For each person listed, this census provides: full name, race, sex, date of birth, age, marital status, number of years married, place of birth, father's and mother's place of birth, citizenship, occupation, education, relationship to head of household, and in many cases, the value of real estate and personal property. LIBRARY NOTES

A necessary skill for a genealogist is the ability to correspond with other genealogists and with institutions that have genealogical collections. Even the beginning researcher realizes that his ancestors were a very mobile group, and that it is rare, indeed, to find a family settled in any location for a long time.

While traveling to the various locales where our forefathers lived is often an enjoyable research experience, it is not always practicable. Therefore, the genealogist must write to others to obtain needed information.

Since one of my duties at the Memphis-Shelby County Public Library and Information Center is to answer inquiries from genealogists around the country, I have an opportunity to read many types of letters. Based on this experience, I have a few suggestions that can increase the effectiveness of your correspondence.

First, if a letter is to reach its destination promptly, it is important that you have the correct address for the person or institution from which you are requesting information. Your local public library has reference books that provide this information. The *American Library Directory* lists all libraries in the country with their current addresses. The *Directory of Historical Societies and Agencies in the United States and Canada*, published by the American Association for State and Local History, provides addresses for historical organizations and gives some information on programs and publications of each of the societies. The Everton publication, *Handbook for Genealogical Correspondence*, not only lists libraries, public archives, church historical societies and archives, but also states the services that are available through correspondence. Finally, for addresses of individuals, directories of other cities are frequently available in large city public libraries.

The genealogical letter should be both brief and clear. Before writing, decide what information you want and then carefully state your question. Provide the reader with only the essential information needed to answer the question. Too often we receive letters of inquiry in which the writer does not state the exact information he wants or needs. Letters written without a clear statement of purpose cannot receive a satisfactory response. Do not ask more than one or two questions per letter. Furthermore, you should not ask questions which will require a great deal of research. Public and private institutions simply do not have the staff available to answer letters that require a great deal of time. If you have a genealogical problem that will result in extended research, you should ask for a list of local genealogists who work on a fee basis.

Although the genealogical letter does not have to be grammatically perfect, it should be written in a clear style in order that it may be understood. An untidy letter that is carelessly written is sometimes relegated to the bottom of the pile and those written in a more comprehensible style favored. It is not necessary for the letter to be typed if your penmanship is legible.

Naturally, pleasant letters which express the genealogist's gratitude for information are appreciated; and the enclosure of a self-addressed, stamped envelope is a boon for the recipient who, remember, is doing you a favor. If you are writing to an institution requesting photocopies, it would be wise to set the upper limit on the amount of money you are willing to spend. If you are requesting a professional genealogist to work for you, always decide on the payment before the work is done. Have a clear understanding of the amount of work that is to be performed and of the fee he charges. Never send cash for photocopies or services; payment should always be made by check or money order.

These suggestions will not necessarily guarantee that all of your correspondence will be completely satisfactory, but, hopefully, they will provide some help in avoiding common problems of written communication.

CHARLESTON, THE PLACE AND THE PEOPLE by Mrs. St. Julien Ravenel. 1912. Reprinted 1972. Hard backs. Over 528 pages. Indexed. Order from the Southern Historical Press, c/o Rev. Silas Emmett Lucas, Jr., P. O. Box 738, Easley, SC 29640. \$12.50

This work, written when Charleston was 250 years old, is a vivid and captivating saga of the birth, growth and maturing of that city. In twenty-one chapters the story moves along, telling of people and events in an interest-gathering way. The names of those who built and sustained Charleston are woven into the events in a most fascinating manner. You must read it!

THE LONDON FAMILY compiled by Mrs. Opal London Cox. 1976. Hard backs. Over 400 pages. Indexed. Order from Mrs. Arthur Cox, 734 Quapaw, Enid, OK 73701. \$11.50

The book is well documented but the compiler makes no claim that it is a complete genealogy of the London families in America. The publication is an endeavor to preserve known records and to serve as a basis for further research. The book is divided into five parts: 1) Descendants of Amos London (1737-1805) of New Jersey and Surry County, NC; 2) John London of Hanover, NC (born in England 1747, died in Wilmington, NC 1816); 3) James London (born 1791 in NC) of St. Genevieve County, MO, Morgan County, IL, and Marion County, IA; 4) Virginia London; and 5) John London, Jr. (1726-1773) Burlington County, NJ. The book contains copies of the London coat of arms, land records, wills, marriage bonds and many other interesting records. A credit to the London lineage.

PROBATE RECORDS OF SOUTH CAROLINA, VOL. 1, INDEX TO INVENTORIES 1746-1785 by Brent H. Holcomb. 1977. Hard backs. Over 115 pages. Indexed. Order from Southern Historical Press, c/o the Rev. Silas Emmett Lucas, Jr., P. O. Box 738, Easley, SC 29640 \$20.00

The publication includes Vol. 6-20 of the South Carolina inventories (71 pages) and Newberry, South Carolina Court records (44 pages). Vol. 1-5 of the records for 1736-1746 are incorporated into an index of miscellaneous records available at the South Carolina Archives. Inventories often contain little nuggets of information for the researcher and are the largest part of the intestate records for the Colonial and Revolutionary periods, and this index is an invaluable tool for the 1746-1785 inventories.

GRAND ARMY OF THE REPUBLIC, IRVIN McDOWELL POST 19 REGISTER BOOK AND DAUGHTERS OF UNION VETERANS, LUCRETIA GARFIELD TENT 3, APPLICATION FORMS copied, compiled and published by Mrs. Opal London Cox. 1925. Soft backs. Over 52 pages. Not completely indexed. Order from Mrs. Opal London Cox, 734 Quapaw, Enid, OK 73701. \$3.00

The Grand Army of the Republic named their posts after famous generals, and Garfield County, Oklahoma Post 19 was named after Gen. Irvin McDowell, the Union commander at the first battle of Bull Run. The first section of the book is an alphabetized list of women, residents of Garfield County, who were descendants of Union veterans.

A MIGRATION STUDY OF THE THIRTY-TWO STATES AND THE FOUR ORGANIZED TERRITORIES COMPRISING THE UNITED STATES IN 1850 compiled by Eleanor Myers. 1977. Soft backs. Over 48 pages. Order from the Central New York Genealogical Society, Inc., Attn: Mrs. Lester F. Meyers, 304 Briarcliff Rd., Syracuse, NY 13214. \$4.00

The publication is presented in tabular form and in three parts. Part one presents each state's population in three columns. The enumerated residents for each state, native born and foreign born, are arranged in two columns. The third column shows migration from the state or territory into other states or territories. Part two shows the countries of origin of the emigrants from thirty foreign countries. The balance of the emigrants--eighty-two hundred, from "Other Countries" as categorized by the Census Bureau--showed no specific country of origin. Of the nearly twenty million people living in the United States in 1850, slightly over two million were foreign born. A concerted effort has been made to compile this publication which should prove most useful to those who seriously consider migration data in their research.

COLONIAL BERTIE COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA, DEED BOOKS A-H, 1720-1757 abstracted by Mary Best Bell. 1963. Reprinted 1977. 256 pages, 64 pages of index. Order from Southern Historical Press, c/o Silas Emmett Lucas, Jr., P. O. Box 738, Easley, SC 29640 \$30.00

Bertie Precinct was formed in 1722 but the earliest known settler was Nathaniel Batts in 1657. By 1722 the area was densely populated. Many parts or all of the present northern and central NC counties were in 1722-1725 a part of Bertie Precinct including Tyrell, Edgecomb, Northampton, Granville, Halifax, Nash, Wilson, Hertford, Martin, Orange, Vance, Franklin and Warren. The book is chaptered and dated by deed books A-H with approximately 12 to 14 deed abstracts per page.

SOME HEROES OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION by Rev. J. D. Bailey. 1924. New material copyrighted 1976. Hard backs. Over 205 pages. Indexed. Order from the Southern Historical Press, c/o Silas Emmett Lucas, Jr., P. O. Box 738, Easley, SC 29640. \$15.

The rich Revolutionary history of upper SC and the part played by men of that region and parts of NC and GA is well preserved in this book about heroes of the American Revolution. At Cowpens and Kings Mountain and other lesser battles, these resolute leaders and their men changed the fortunes of war for the Colonies, saving the American Cause from doom. Such were the likes of Daniel Morgan, Andrew Pickens, John E. Howard, Wm. Washington, John Thomas, Sr., James Williams, Sam Hammond, Ben Roebuck, Thomas Brandon, Elijah Clark, Wm. Farr, Joseph Hughes, Joseph McJunkin, Thomas Young, and many, many others.

ROHRBACH GENEALOGY, VOL. II compiled by Lewis Bunker Rohrbach. 1977. Hard backs. Over 280 pages. Indexed. Order from the author, 43 Sea St., Rockport, ME 04856. \$24.95

The author, a certified genealogist, compiled the Rohrbach Genealogy in 1970. His research for this Vol. II included church records, family Bible records, federal census and pension records in the National Archives, and state and county records. His book contains all known descendants, both Rohrbach and Rorabaugh, of Hans Georg Rohrbach who came to America in 1732 and settled in Berks County, PA. Descendants of daughters are included for one generation out of the Rohrbach-Rorabaugh names.

EARLY SETTLERS OF ALABAMA by Col. Jas. Edmonds Saunders, with notes and genealogies by his granddaughter, Elizabeth Saunders Blair Stubbs. Part II, 1899. Reprinted 1977. Hard back. Over 556 pages. Indexed. Order from Southern Historical Press, c/o Silas Emmett Lucas, Jr., P. O. Box 738, Easley, SC 29640. \$25.00

The author was born in Brunswick County, Virginia, in 1806 and died in Alabama in 1896. He was a striking figure in the life of the South and the state of Alabama. He lovingly relates the story of the people who first made Alabama; from the humblest to the highest, he weaves the story of the state from early settlers and their settlements through the Indian Wars, the Texas War and the Civil War. His records of the people who made Alabama in some cases extend their genealogies back to their European origin, and always to their beginnings in America. This is a remarkable book, rich in early Americana, and contains over 57 more-or-less complete notes and genealogies of early settlers.

NEWBERRY COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA MINUTES OF THE COUNTY COURT 1785-1798 by Brent H. Holcomb. 1977. Hard back. Over 368 pages. Indexed. Order from Southern Historical Press, c/o Silas Emmett Lucas, Jr., P. O. Box 738, Easley, SC 29640. \$35.00

Newberry was one of the counties (districts) formed from old Ninety-Six District by the County Court Act of 1785. (Others were Abbeville, Edgefield, Laurens, and Spartanburg.) The minutes of the county courts are some of the most valuable records of the South Carolina counties. They are analogous to the Virginia Order Books and North Carolina Minutes of the Court of Common Pleas and Quarter Sessions. While these do not exist for all counties in South Carolina, they do for the counties of Newberry, York, Chester, Union, Spartanburg, Pendleton, Winton (Barnwell), and perhaps a few others. These minutes are the basic records of the county, containing lists of deeds recorded, wills and administration records, guardian bonds, bastardy cases, tavern licenses, permits to sell liquor, road commissioners, etc., as well as minor civil cases.

THE PEOPLE OF NACAGDOCHES COUNTY IN 1870 an edited census, edited by Carolyn Reeves Ericson. 1977. Over 210 pages. Indexed. Order from the Editor, 1614 Redbud St., Nacogdoches, Texas 75961. Soft backs \$10.00; hard backs \$12.50.

The 1870 census, being the first census after the Civil War and the first in which blacks were listed by name, can be a valuable source for researchers, and this neat edition reflects a sincere effort to help those seeking information on various Nacogdoches County families. The author has added the maiden name of the wife where possible, and the name of the deceased husband of a widow has been added, if known. Census records, marriage records, cemetery records and family records were the sources for these additions. Spelling of names varied from district to district and from enumerator to enumerator. These various spellings are indicated in the index.

LIMESTONE COUNTY, ALABAMA CEMETERIES, VOLUME ONE, NORTHWEST SECTION compiled by The Limestone County Historical Society. 1977. Soft backs. Over 202 pages. Indexed. Order from Limestone County Historical County Book Fund, 301 9th St., Athens, AL 35611

The northwest section of Limestone County is the most populated section and, therefore, contains as many cemeteries as all the rest of the county. The Society plans two more volumes; Volume Two will contain cemeteries from the northeast, southeast and southwest sections; and Volume Three will contain cemeteries from the city of Athens. The work is well done and documented, having fifty-six pages in the index.

MASTER INDEX TO THE GEORGIA GENEALOGICAL MAGAZINE NUMBERS 1-46, 1961-1972 *published by the Georgia Genealogical Magazine. 1973. Hard backs. Over 888 pages. Order from Southern Historical Press, c/o the Rev. Silas Emmett Lucas, Jr., P. O. Box 738, Easley, SC 29640. \$50.00*

The editor has dedicated the master index to the two individuals responsible for the work, Walter H. Cunyus and Mildred Bagley Smith (Mrs. Stanley). The index is broken down into volumes by issues, i.e., 1-4, 5-8, 9-12, 13-16, 17-20....39-42, 43-46, rather than one large alphabetical index which would have been almost impossible to do.

GEORGIA GENEALOGICAL MAGAZINE, EIGHT VOLUMES (Issues 1-34) *Bicentennial Reprint Edition. Hard backs. Over 3658 pages. (See master index). Order from Southern Historical Press, c/o Silas Emmett Lucas, Jr., P. O. Box 738, Easley, SC 29640. \$140.00*

These are reprints of the Georgia Genealogical Magazine Nos. 1-34 in eight hard-bound books. They contain much valuable information for Georgia-related research.

THE LIFE AND ADVENTURES OF EILBURN WATERS, THE FAMOUS HUNTER AND TRAPPER OF WHITE TOP MOUNTAIN, EMBRACING EARLY HISTORY OF SOUTHWESTERN VIRGINIA *by Charles Coale. 1878. Reprinted by Mrs. Dean Elswick. 1976. Hard backs. Over 265 pages. Not Indexed. Order from Commonwealth Press, Inc., P. O. Box 3547, 1st St. Sta, Radford VA 24141. \$10.95*

The book gives an insight into the history, traditions, and way of life of the pioneer families of southwest Virginia, who, as a matter of daily life, felled the forest, constructed homes, protected home and family from the Indians and wild animals, fostered education, believed in and lived the Christian religion, thereby leaving to their descendants and posterity a priceless heritage. The publication consists of a description of the life and adventures of Wilburn Waters, the great hermit and trapper, and a series of articles written for a weekly newspaper, partly for pastime and partly to preserve a few facts connected with the early settlement of southwestern Virginia.

YEISER, LEDBETTER, AND ALLIED FAMILIES *by Mary Louise Yeiser Wiley. 1977. Soft backs. Over 140 pages. Indexed. Order from the author, Rt. 2, Estill Springs, TN 37330. \$13.50*

Emanuel Zimmermann (Carpenter), pioneer, lawgiver, jurist, and patriot, was born in 1702 at Wattenwy Canton of Berne, Switzerland, and died 1780 in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. His father, Henry, had come to America about 1698 and settled first at Germantown, Pa., bought land and practiced medicine, but returned to Switzerland in 1700 and married Salome Ruefener. In 1706 Henry returned to Pennsylvania with his wife and two sons, Emanuel and Gaberiel, where the family grew and prospered. "Zimmerman" means "Carpenter" in English, and this name was assumed by succeeding generations. Catherine, daughter of Emanuel, married 1) Fredrick Yeiser and 2) Adam Reigart. The son, Philip, married Catherine Doudel, moved to Kentucky and died there in 1833. Philip was the father of ten children. The Doudel family descended from David and Michael, two brothers of three who emigrated to America from Germany. Daniel never married. The Yeiser family is represented in Alabama and Tennessee by Dr. Jacob Doudel Yeiser. Collateral families are: Bernard, Gaines, Jameson, Fauntleroy, Davis, Ledbetter, Godwin, Craig, Vaughn, Grey, Muse, and Wiley.

A GENEALOGICAL HISTORY OF THE RUBEL, WHITE, ROCKEFELLOW, McNAIR and ALLIED FAMILIES edited by Mrs. John Bennett Boddie and published by Jack P. Rubel. 1977. Hard backs. Over 263 pages. Indexed. Order from Mrs. M. Boddie Pulling, 333 Old Mill Rd., #294, Santa Barbara, CA 93110. \$15.00

The book presents the interrelations of the various branches of the Rubel, White, Rockefeller-Rockefellow, and McNair families. Each family history is compiled from the records left by individuals such as photographs, documents, and family Bibles, many of them in the possession of Mrs. Henrietta Pierpont Rubel. Rubel-related families are: Lyon, Gosney, Hawkins and Yager (Yeager). White relatives include: Maunsell, Shannon, Willing and Pointer. Related families of the Rockefeller-Rockefellows are: Macklin, Conkey, Lambert and Taylor. McNair-related families are: Pierpont (Pierrepont), Sherman, Beebe, Buck, Hooker, Willett, Norton, Bristol, Warner, Greenhill, Gunn, Ensign, Wilson, Horner, Tolbert, Hawley and Strong.

THE TEXAS TURNBOS by Charles A. Turnbo. 1977. Soft backs. Over 115 pages. Not indexed. Order from Charles A. Turnbo, 239 Oakridge Rd., Lompoc, CA 93436. \$7.00

Starting with the Carolina Turnboughs the author discloses the origins of the family. The Turnbo family moved to Kentucky, on to Tennessee (nw Wayne County), then to central Texas, settling first in Williamson and later in Bell County, Texas. The book describes the family of Andrew Jackson Turnbo, its life in central Texas from the mid-1800's, and tells of Pvt. Andrew Jackson Turnbo's role in the Civil War. More than twenty pictures and maps are included to locate places and people who made up the Turnbo family. Burial places of several dozen Texas Turnbows (thought to be distant cousins) are given, and more than fifty family groups are listed.

Tryon County was formed in 1769 from Mecklenburg County which had been formed from Anson County in 1763. Tryon County included all or part of the NC counties of Lincoln, Gaston, Cleveland, Rutherford, Henderson, Polk, Burke and McDowell and the SC counties of York, Chester, Union, Cherokee, Spartanburg, Greenville, Laurens and Newberry. After the border was surveyed, the lands once granted by NC were registered in the SC land memorials and often called "Northern Patents". Wills and estate papers from Tryon County, which was abolished in 1779 to form Lincoln and Rutherford Counties, are in the NC Archives filed with the Lincoln County records.

Mrs. Bolton's work is a copy of Transcription of the County Archives of Tennessee, prepared by the Tennessee Historical Records Survey, Division of Professional and Service Projects, Works Projects Administration, January 1941. The preface of this volume states, "This volume is intended to be a verbatim transcription. There are numerous apparent errors, but the book was transcribed as it appears."

Questionnaire forms were sent to all known living Tennessee Civil War soldiers by the State Archivist in 1914 and 1915, and by the director of the Tennessee Historical Committee in 1920. All the completed forms that were returned were received by 1922. Participation was voluntary, and about 1600 Civil War veterans responded. 3. In what State and county were you born? Tennessee, Lauderdale County
4. Were you a Confederate or Federal soldier? Confederate
5. Name of your Company? E (b) Number of Regiment. First Confederate Calvary & first I joined or voluntired at Co. seat, they added five regiments.
6. What was the occupation of your father? Carpenter when young, then farmed.
7. Give full name of your father. Lenard Dunavant Born at Amelia Co, Va,
in the County of State of Virginia . He lived at in Virginia while
young man then moved to Tennessee and farmed.
Give any particulars concerning him, as official position, war services, etc., books written by, etc.
8. Maiden name in full your mother. Sarah Buford Reed She was the daughter of
Alexander Reed and his wife ---- who lived at in Middle
Tennessee, Williamson Co.
9. Remarks on Ancestry. Give here any and all facts possible in reference to your parents, grandparents, great-grandparents, etc., not included in the foregoing, as where they lived, offices held, Revolutionary or other war service; what country the family came from to America, first settled, county and State, always giving full names (if possible), and never referring to an ancestor simply without giving the name. It is desirable to include every fact possible, and to that end the full and exact record from old Bibles should be appended on separate sheets of this size, thus preserving the facts from loss:
My grandfather on father side was in Revolutionary War, was wounded in knee, crippled for life. My father was in War 1812, was Major. General Jackson ordered them not to fire until british was close enough to see white of eyes, but Father said if they waited that long would be too late so he ordered fire.
10. If you owned land or other property at the opening of the war, state what kind of property you owned, and state the value of your property as near as you can. My father deeded me 100 acres land in woods. I sold that and bought more joining of 118.
11. Did you or your parents own slaves? If so, how many? My father owned two slaves.

12. If your parents owned land, state about how many acres. My father owned about 300 acres.
13. State as near as you can the value of all the property owned by your parents, including, when the war opened. About one to three dollars per acre. Lots of land sold as low as 50 cts an acre or less.
14. What kind of a house did your parents occupy? State whether it was a log house or frame house or built of other material, and state the number of rooms it had. Log house, four rooms and shed. Log room off a peace for cook room.
15. As a boy and young man, state what kind of work you did. If you worked on a farm, state to what extent you plowed, worked with a hoe and did other kinds of similar work. (Certain historians claim that white men would not do work of this sort before the war.)
Worked on farm, plowed and hoed, picked cotton, done all kinds of work on farm. My father built a gin and people hauled cotton a long ways as it was all gin in county.
16. State clearly what kind of work your father did, and what the duties of your mother were. State all the kinds of work done in the house as well as you can remember--that is, cooking, spinning, weaving, etc. My mother cooked, spun and wove cloth to make clothes for us children. She was the mother of 12 boys and 2 girls. My oldest brother was in Mexican War. My self and five brother(s) was in Civil War.
17. Did your parents keep any servants? If so, how many? two
18. How was honest toil--as plowing, hauling and other sorts of honest work of this class--regarded in your community? Was such work considered respectable and honorable?
Honorable thank God I did work.
19. Did the white men in your community generally engage in such work? Most of them did.
20. To what extent were there white men in your community leading lives of idleness and having others do their work for them? There was always some men idle. Made a living beating the other man.
21. Did the men who owned slaves mingle freely with those who did not own slaves, or did slaveholders in any way show by their actions that they felt themselves better than respectable, honorable men who did not own slaves. To some extent some of them thought they were better.
22. At the churches, at the schools, at public gatherings in general, did slaveholders and non-slaveholders mingle on a footing of equality? Yes, some thought they were better than others. More soc(i)able then than they are now.
23. Was there a friendly feeling between slave-holders and non-slave-holders in your community, or were they antagonistic to each other? As a general (thing)
24. In a political contest in which one candidate owned slaves and the other did not, did the fact that one candidate owned slaves help him any in winning the contest?
As a general thing most people was looking for an honest man, not what he was worth.
25. Were the opportunities good in your community for a poor young man, honest and industrious, to save up enough to buy a small farm or go in business for himself? Most an(y) hardworking young man could have saved enough money to have bought a small farm or went into a small business.
26. Were poor, honest, industrious young men, who were ambitious to make something of themselves, encouraged or discouraged by slaveholders? There wasent much inter(e)st taked eather way.
27. What kind of school or schools did you attend? Privet school.
28. About how long did you go to school altogether? About 14 months altogather.
29. How far was it to the nearest school? About 1 mile. My wife and her brother walked three miles to school.
30. What school or schools were in operation in your neighborhood? One
31. Was the school in your community private or public? Privat
32. About how many months in the year did it run? About four or five months.

33. Did the boys and girls in your community attend school pretty regularly?
Yes, most of them did.
34. Was the teacher of the school you attended a man or a woman? The first one was man;
the next one was my sister and the last one man.
35. In what year and month and at what place did you enlist in the service of the Confed-
eracy or of the Federal Government? In Oct year 1861, Ripley, Tennessee. I went
then to Camp Bouragard and from there to Miss; taken tyford fever and lost my
hearing, have been deaf ever sense. Wasent able to go in battle at Perryville.
36. After enlistment, where was your Company sent first? Camp Bouragard in Ky. Near
Fulten, Ky on I C railroad.

While my father was camped at New Orleans they eat green cowhides, boiled and parched corn. My Brother wasnt able to go in the Civil War, but he wanted to go. Our sister begged him not to go but he had rather go and fight for his county if his bones bleached on battlefield. He was killed at battle of Shylo (Shiloh) and his bones did bleach on the battle field.

There was more in my company, but I can't call them to mind now. This is all true history, don't think I have made any mistakes.

A LIST OF THE COMPANY OF MILITIA UNDER THE
COMMAND OF CAPTAIN JOSEPH MARTIN IN PIT(T)SYLVANIA CO., 1774

[Joseph Martin (1740-1808) was a frontier military leader and an early inhabitant and leader of the State of Franklin. After the demise of Franklin he represented that section (now northeast Tennessee) in the legislature of North Carolina. In Lord Dunmore's War (1774) he was appointed Captain in the Militia of Pittsylvania Co., VA and served in the same capacity at the beginning of the Revolutionary War; he was later made Lieutenant Colonel. Many of the men who served with him, like their leader, became early citizens of the new state of Tennessee. JRJ]

By virtue of a Commission from the Governor and Commander in Chief of the Colony and Dominion of Virginia appointing one Lieutiant of (the) County of Pittsylvania and chief commander of the said County I do appoint you the said Joseph Martin Captain of the above named company of militia and you and every one of you of the above named company are from time to time to observe and obey him as your captain or any other of your superior officers according to the rules and discipline of war given under my hand this Twenty-fifteth day of November and Fifteeneth Year of his Majestie's Reign 1774.
