BOOK REVIEWS

MARRIAGES OF BLOUNT COUNTY, TENNESSEE 1795-1859 compiled by Edythe Rucker Whitley. 1982. Hard back. 102 pp. Indexed. Order from Genealogical Publishing Co., 111 Water St., Baltimore, MD 21202. \$15.00.

The marriages listed in this work have been copied from a register in the county clerk's office in Maryville. The majority of the records derive from marriage licenses and thus prove that the marriage was performed. In some cases the records derive from bonds, which in themselves are not proof of a marriage, only that a marriage was intended. The records abstracted here give names of bride and groom, the date of issue of the bond or license and the names of bondsmen. 4,000 marriages are listed here; a great place to begin eastern Tennessee research.

INDEX OF NORTH CAROLINA ANCESTORS by the North Carolina Genealogical Society. 1981. Soft back. 378 pp. Indexed. Order from The Reprint Co., Publishers, P.O. Box 5401, Spartanburg, SC 29304. \$18.75.

A valuable book, indeed, intended to promote the exchange of information among researchers working on North Carolina family lines. From entries submitted by over 1,000 contributors it contains the names of over 10,000 North Carolina ancestors and their spouses with biographical information on each. There are three indexes: ancestor, spouse, and contributor. The latter gives the names and addresses of the contributors with appropriate keying to entrees in the ancestor index. A suppliment gives formation data on North Carolina's 106 present or former counties.

CEMETERY INSCRIPTIONS OF MARION COUNTY, ALABAMA, Vol. III compiled by Dorothy Shores Stalcup and William Spann Stalcup. 1982. Soft back. 47 pp. Indexed. Order from Mrs. Stalcup, P.O. Box 217, Winfield, AL 35594. \$10.00 (AL residents add 4% sales tax)

This is the third and final volume of Marion County Cemetery Inscriptions compiled by husband and wife. There are 67 cemeteries and burial places listed in this book. Most of the locations are small family plots, graves at the side of a road or graves isolated in woods and fields. These cemeteries are important to genealogy research since the graves of early settlers who purchased the land from the government were found while researching this volume. There are several Franklin County cemeteries included because they contain ancestors of present day Marion County residents. Also included are several Black American cemeteries. The authors have made these cemeteries available in printed form for the first time, hoping it will be helpful to many people researching for their ancestors.

MONTGOMERY COUNTY ILLINOIS 1860 CENSUS AND MORTALITY SCHEDULE compiled by the Montgomery County Genealogical Society. 1982. Soft back. About 197 pp. Indexed. Order from the Society, P.O. Box 212, Litchfield, IL 62056. \$11.00.

Information included in section one of the book is dwelling number, family number, given name and surname of each person, age, sex, color, occupation (by code) and birthplace. Real estate and personal property values are indicated by R and P - amounts not given. Section two of the book contains the information from the mortality schedule, the name of person who died, age, sex, color, free or slave, married or widowed, place of birth, month died, occupation, cause of death, and number of days ill. This 1860 index to the Montgomery County Census is most welcome by the researcher in the southern central portion of Illinois.

STINNETT, GUEST AND ALLIED LINES by Mrs. Alice Stinnett Watson. 1981. Hard back. 120 pp. Indexed. Order from the author, 117 South Ave. D, Portales, NM 88130. \$21.00.

Mrs. Watson has compiled a remarkable Stinnett chronology which is exhaustive in its scope. Early Stinnetts of record were William Stinnett and his descendants of Calvert County, Maryland, James, John and William in Virginia and in the 1790 U.S. Census of Rowan County, North Carolina, William and John. In 1815 James and Samuel Stinet were in Bledsoe County, Tennessee and others appeared in Kentucky, Missouri and Texas. In 1896 Samuel Henry Stinnett married Mrs. Mary Jane Guest Woodburn. This introduced the Guest heritage, which is also detailed here. There are nine proven lines back to the Revolutionary War included here. They are: Guest, Watson, Jackson, McCarter, Barton, Hanna, Woodburn, Loggins and Harrison.

MARRIAGES OF STEWART COUNTY, TENNESSEE 1838-1866 compiled by Edythe Rucker Whitley. 1982. Hard back. 105 pp. Indexed by Eleanor R. Antoniak. Order from the Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc., 111 Water St., Baltimore, MD 21202. \$16.00.

Although the county seat was established as early as 1805, the earliest marriage records in the courthouse at Dover date from 1838. The compiler says, "The earlier records were lost or destroyed before I began copying the records, now more than thirty years ago." Her listings cover loose records and Marriage Books 1 & 2, and state the names of groom, bride and date of bond. The date of marriage and officiant are given (when available) for the loose records section. This volume will be helpful to researchers of this border county, which contains the major waterways of the Tennessee and Cumberland Rivers.

HICKMAN COUNTY, TENNESSEE CEMETERY RECORDS by Jill Garrett and Iris H. McClain. 1982. Soft back. 329 pp. Indexed. Order from Mrs. Garrett, 610 Terrace Dr., Columbia, TN 38401. \$20.00.

This is a revised edition of a book published in 1966 with many additional cemeteries and information included. All pertinent information on the tombstones was copied except Bible verses and epitaphs, unless unusual. Some of these cemeteries are so overgrown the authors suspect they will be lost in a few years. The earliest marked graves date from the 1820's. There is a cemetery index and also a name index, directions to the cemeteries and obituaries and interviews included in this research tool for middle Tennessee. Hopefully more county cemetery records like this one will be published in the future.

GOODLOE GENEALOGY by Paul Miller Goodloe II. 1982. Hard back, in full color. 500 pp. Order from author, P.O. Box 689, East Organge, NJ 07019. \$55.50.

This book is beautifully bound; the front cover depicts the coat-of-arms and the back cover shows a Goodloe plantation home in Virginia. <u>Goodloe Genealogy</u> is a comprehensive family history covering the English ancestors from 1250-1650. The author then moves on to the American descendants of George Goodloe, immigrant to Virginia in 1655, and includes work done by several earlier family historians. Thousands of Goodloes are identified and recorded in proper sequence, plus thousands of cousins bearing hundreds of other surnames, which are indexed. Photographs, explanatory notes and references make this a very rich volume for these Goodloe descendants.

TWELVE FAMILIES . . An American Experience by William F. O'Dell. 1981. Hard back. 520 pp. Indexed. Order from the author, 5707 Junonia, Shell Point Village, Ft. Myers, FL 33908. \$27.50.

<u>Twelve Families</u> is a unique publication in that it does more than list births, marriages and deaths. The book presents ancestors as living entities in their historical settings. These Scot, Dutch, and English immigrants are carried through the American Revolution, or to Canada, or through the Indian troubles, or on the trail westward to newer lands, or through the Civil War, and nicely brought up to their modern day Canadian and American descendants. Over 2,000 family members and 200 or more charts and photos bring the following names into family relationships: Gant/Ghent, Peerenboom, Riley, Rooks, Springer, Swing, Aikman, Bar/Baer, Green, Horning, Michell, Odell, Blair, White, Wright, Davis, Showers, Wilson and Carroll.

MARRIAGES OF SHELBY COUNTY, TENNESSEE, 1820-1858 compiled by Edythe Rucker Whitley. 1982. Hard back. 139 pp. Indexed by Deborah G. Sherr. Order from the Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc., 111 Water St., Baltimore, MD 21202. \$16.00.

Mrs. Whitley continued her series of marriage records of Tennessee counties with this volume. She lists the 4952 bonds recorded in the register at the Shelby County Courtouse in Memphis, giving only the names of the principals and dates of bond or marriage, as available there. Although there has been some confusion about the location of the original bonds, it is now known that they are housed in the holdings of the Memphis and Shelby County Archives. As always, variations of any name must be expected due to the difficulty in reading old penmandhip, but comparison may be made with Shelby County marriage records published by the Tennessee Genealogical Society in 1961.

<u>A MEMORIAL TO THE MELUGIN FAMILY IN AMERICA</u> by Douthitt Melugin McKay. 1981. Hard back. 294 pp. Indexed. Order from the author, 618 Rayborn Dr., San Antonio, TX 78221. \$28.00.

The author dedicated the book to her Melugin ancestors, John 1754-1835, Joseph 1773-1845, Thomas 1801-1850, Joseph Allen 1833-1911, William S. 1873-1963, and to those young people who left no descendants because they gave their lives for the defense and development of their country. John, a veteran of the Revolution and War of 1812, was born in Chester County, Pennsylvania and moved to North Carolina and later Tennessee. Melugin descendants have been found in Kentucky, Illinois, Missouri, Texas, North Carolina and Tennessee. The appendix presents military accounts, wills, deeds and other legal records of early Melugins.

MARRIAGES OF LAWRENCE COUNTY, TENNESSEE 1818-1854 compiled by Edythe Rucker Whitley. 1982. Hard back. 110 pp. Indexed. Order from Genealogical Publishing Co., 111 Water St., Baltimore, MD 21202. \$15.00.

The records abstracted in the first section of this book, covering the years from 1818-1838, derive from the original bonds and licenses. Records appearing in the second section, covering the period from 1818-1854, are based on a marriage register. Both sets of records, totalling about 2,500 marriages, provide the names of bride and groom and date of the bond or license and frequently both. The index contains about 5,000 names.

SEQUATCHIE COUNTY, TENNESSEE MARRIAGES 1858-1881 by James A. Douthat. 1982. Soft back. 40 pp. Indexed. Order from the author, 2504 Kell Rd., Signal Mt., TN 37377. \$7.50.

The 10th Civil District of Bledsoe County and the 1st and 2nd Civil Districts of Marion County were attached to Hamilton County February 25, 1856. These three districts were then bound together as Sequatchie County in 1857. Marriages which were performed in this area prior to these dates should be researched in Hamilton, Bledsoe or Marion Counties. This publication gives the usual information: page number, date of the license, name of the clerk, name of the groom and bride, by whom solemnized and date performed. Beginning in 1872 the name of the security is given in place of the clerk.

BLUE RIDGE HERITAGE, Burnett, Branscome, Hylton, Cox, Slaughter and Related Families by Dorothy Burnett Peterson. 1982. Soft back. 274 pp. Indexed. Order from Mrs. Robert E. Peterson, 3454 Scheibler Rd., Memphis, TN 38128. \$21.00.

<u>BLUE RIDGE HERITAGE</u> is the result of Dorothy Peterson's 30 years of research on her ancestors of Patrick, Floyd and Carroll Counties, Virginia. These ancestors are Jeremiah Burnett, Richard Branscome, Matthew Cox, Elijah Hylton, Charles Mabry, Blackmore Hughes, and John Slaughter. There are short chapters on Mr. Peterson's Swedish and U.S. lines including Olson and Erickson. This volume contains 106 pictures, charts, old letters, obituaries, wills, and deeds. Over 5,200 persons are found in the full name index.

MARRIAGES OF GIBSON COUNTY, TENNESSEE 1824-1860 compiled by Edythe Rucker Whitley. 1982. Hard back. 173 pp. Indexed. Order from Genealogical Publishing Co., 111 Water St., Baltimore, MD 21202. \$17.50.

The marriage records for Gibson from 1824-1860 are on file at the courthouse in Trenton and are also available on microfilm at the Tennessee State Library and Archives, as provided by the 1965 Act of the Tennessee Legislature - drafted amd sponsored by the compiler - to preserve the county records in Tennessee. The records abstracted here derive from both bonds and licenses, each record giving the names of the bride and groom, the date of the bond or license, and the names of bondsmen. The index contains 10,000 persons.

HERALDRY, CUSTOMS, RULES AND STYLES by Carl-Alexander von Volborth. 1981. Hard back. 229 pp. Indexed. Order from Sterling Publishing Co., Inc., Two Park Ave., New York, NY 10016. \$37.50.

In this beautifully executed book of color and black and white, the author explains what you see on a coat of arms. He has been collecting information for years and is passing this on to readers. He cautions us to not adopt the bearings of another family that happens to have the same name without having proof of the necessary connection. This is truly a fascinating book.

HISTORY OF MONROE COUNTY, TENNESSEE, Vol. I, Part 1; Vol. I, Part 2; and Vol. II by Sarah G. Cox. 1980. Hard back. Indexed. Order from author, 1213 N. Main St., Sweetwater, TN 37874. Vol. I, Part 1. 682 pp. \$25.00 plus postage \$1.50. Vol. I, Part 2. 817 pp. \$25.00 plus postage \$1.50. Vol. II. 423 pp. \$18.68 plus postage \$1.32.

The author has done a magnificent job of recording the history of Monroe County, Tennessee. Vol. I, Part 1 of the history covers the pre-settlement period, formation of Monroe County, government and the Judiciary. Part 2 of Vol. I covers the history of each of the towns of Monroe County except for Sweetwater which will be the beginning chapter of Vol. III to be published later. Included in the volumes are documents, petitions, tax lists and many wonderful pictures. Vol. II covers the history of education and schools, communications and postal service. This reader found these books very interesting and informative and enjoyed most of all the multitude of pictures of the families and homes of Monroe County, Tennessee.

ROSTER OF THE CONFEDERATE SOLDIERS OF GEORGIA 1861-1865, INDEX by Lake Blackshear Regional Library. 1982. Hard back. 515 pp. Indexed. Order from The Reprint Company, P.O. Box 5401, Spartanburg, SC 29304. \$31.25.

This roster was compiled for the State of Georgia by the Director of the Confederate Pension and Record Department of the Georgia Department of Archives and History. Approximately 80,000 names appear in the Index as they are spelled in the Roster. Each entry contains a reference to both volume and page number, but the original Roster must be viewed for any additional facts. THE KERSHNER FAMILIES OF MARYLAND 1731-1977, VOLUME III by Mary Kershner Maxwell and Ruth Bownds Kershner. 1981. Soft back. 374 pp. Indexed. Order from Mrs. Maxwell, 1622 W. St. Vrain, Colorado Springs, CO 80904. Price not stated.

This third volume continues the story of the Kershner family, extending it back to about 1570 in Germany, and supplements the facts given in the first two volumes with many pictures and data which have recently been uncovered. Of particular interest is the section pertaining to research in Germany, which revealed the home of the three Kershner brothers who immigrated to this country in the 1730's. Many allied lines are included to the present time, and a full name index includes the name of spouse, which aids the identification. For example: Kerschner, Peter b 1803 m Catharine Body 278; Kerschner, Peter Augusta Co., Virginia Census 169.

ANCESTRAL ECHOES 1619-1981 by Julian Porter Pruett and Frances Pruett Limozaine. 1982. Hard back. 210 pp. Indexed. Order from Frances P. Limozaine, 1125 Postell Rd., St. Simons Island, GA 31522. \$27.50.

The principal families in <u>Ancestral Echoes</u> are Pruett, Griffin, Hamilton and Keenan. Related families are Harden, Clement, Estes, Nelson, Scruggs, Motley, Peal, Sanders, Turner, Barbett, Craddock, Warmath and more. The authors follow each of these principal families and many of their children from Virginia, Pennsylvania, North Carolina, into Middle Tennessee and then into West Tennessee as the first settlers of what was to become Gibson County. Most of the families remained in the same general area of Gibson County after 1822, and only few traveled far until about 1915. A fold-out pedigree chart depicts family relationships of proven lines, one of which covers nine generations.

LANCASTER ANCESTORS, WRIGHT-KEMP-MALUGEN DESCENDANTS compiled by Ruth Fay Wright Kilgore. 1982. Soft back. 96 pp. Indexed. Order from author, 873 Robertson Academy Rd., Nashville, TN 37220. \$16.00.

Mrs. Kilgore's research traces Lawrence Lancaster's descendants from the middle 1700's in Virginia and North Carolina to the present; much of the research is from Hickman and Perrry Counties, Tennessee. There are two indexes; one for the narrative and another for the genealogical tables. The narrative contains most interesting family letters. Excerpt: one family member "lived all over everywhere and as far away from anyone else as he could get".

SIXTEEN HUNDRED LINES TO PILGRIMS, LINEAGE BOOK III edited by Mary E. Mayo. 1982. Hard back. 1035 pp. Indexed. Order from Mrs. Mayo, Chairperson, Publishing Committee, 195 Henry St., Manchester, CT 06040. \$30.00.

Pilgrims, as used in this book, does not mean only the Pilgrims of the Mayflower pact and subsequent arrivals at Plymouth Colony. The Pilgrims of this book were wanderers to a distant land searching for a new home and a new life with freedoms that they had not known before. These Pilgrims, most of whom landed before 1700, were predominatly immigrants to the Middle Atlantic and Southern Colonies. These lineages are of the members of the National Society, Sons and Daughters of the Pilgrims. There are about 185 pages of names in the index making this book a tremendous storehouse of valuable information for researchers.

YALOBUSHA COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI CEMETERY RECORDS, VOLUME III, NORTHERN SECTION WATER VALLEY, MISSISSIPPI by Yalobusha County Historical Society. Looseleaf. 111 pp. Mimeographed. Indexed. Order from Yalobusha County Historical Society, Rt. 1, Box 15, Coffeeville, MS 38922. \$7.00.

Some of the cemeteries contained herein are Austin, Bethel, Bethlehem, Big Springs, Hopewell, Memorial Gardens, Old Mt. Gilead, Mt. Liberty, Palestine, Rocky Mount, Sand Hill, Sylva Rena, Tabernacle, and miscellaneous family cemetries. Instructions are given on locating these burial grounds, and other pertinent information known by the researchers is supplied. This and the two earlier volumes provide an excellent opportunity for the researcher working in this central northern county of Mississippi. Printed cemetery records are of great help since the visiting researcher could possibly never locate some burial grounds in an unfamiliar county.

THE McLAINS, by GEORGE compiled by Carrie McLain West. 1981. Hard back. 182 pp. Indexed. Order from the author, 4161 Larchmont, El Paso, TX 79902. \$27.50.

This family history and genealogy concentrates on George McLain, who was a Revolutionary War veteran, and two sons, John Alexander McLain of Bond County, Illinois and Jediah Alexander McLain of Bedford County, Tennessee. George's emigrant ancestor was Alexander McLain, who was born in Scotland or on the Isle of Mull in 1709, moved to Northern Ireland, emigrated to America and settled in Pennsylvania and North Carolina, and died 1789 in Lincoln County, North Carolina. Some of his children remained in North Carolina while others migrated to Missouri, Illinois and Tennessee. In the first three chapters the author has given a unique description of the clan system of Scotland.

CHEROKEE BLOOD, VOLUME I by Shriley Hoskins. 1982. Soft back. 141 pp. Indexed. Order from author, 2321 Brookwood Dr., Chattanooga, TN 37421. \$13.50.

This Cherokee Indian genealogy is based on applications made under oath to the U.S. Court of Claims for a share of the award made as a result of a suit brought by the Cherokee Indians for treaty violations. The book contains information on up to six generations for 160 families. They had to prove that they were a member of the Cherokee Nation at the time of the treaties, or were descended from such persons who were members on 28 May 1906. In 1835 the Eastern Cherokee domain consisted of certain counties in the states of Georgia, Alabama, Tennessee and North Carolina before the removal of the tribes to lands west of the Mississippi River.

THE SAMS FAMILY OF VIRGINIA by Dr. Crawford F. Sams, Conway C. Sams, Col. Robert C. Hackett. 1981. Hard back. 136 pp. Indexed. Order from Crawford F. Sams, 55 Shearer Dr., Atherton, CA 94025. Price not stated.

The first Sams to arrive in the Colony of Virginia was Elizabeth who came to Jamestown in 1635 from England. Of the eight Sams who arrived in Virginia before 1700, two survived to produce descendants, these two major lines being from James Sams, Sr. (b 1686-94), and perhaps George Sams through Edward Sams (b 1723). After the Revolution, the descendants of James Sams, Sr., migrated from Virginia to Tennessee, North Carolina and Kentucky. The descendants of Edward Sams migrated from Loudon County, Virginia to southwestern Pennsylvania and on into Indiana, Illinois, Iowa, North Dakota and Washington. All descendants take pride in the fact that their members have participated in every war in which the Colony and U.S. have been engaged from the Indian Wars of 1742 to the present.

DANIEL WARREN FAMILY - Submitted by Jo Ann McGhee, Rt. 1, Box 165, Foristell, MO. 63348

Daniel WARREN was born in North Carolina c1796, but was living in Hardin Co., TN by 1820. It is believed that Daniel's first wife, the mother of his sons, died in Hardin Co., TN c1832. He then married Celona __?, probably a Cherokee Indian, who was the mother of two daughters. In 1850 Daniel and Celona were still in Hardin Co., TN. Celona died sometime later and on 1 Nov 1852 he sold his Hardin Co. land which was west of the Tennessee River. Daniel migrated to Franklin Co., IL with his daughters and sons, except for William A. Warren.

Known children of Daniel Warren were:

- 1. William A. Warren born cl819 in TN, married Matilda ? born cl826 in TN. Their children were: Francis M. Warren (male) born cl844; Daniel born cl848 and probably others. It is believed this family stayed in Hardin Co., TN. On 10 Nov 1856 William A. bought land from Jacob and Frances C. Warren, which Frances C. had inherited from her deceased father, Henry HAGY.
- 2. Elias Warren born Jun 1824 in Hardin Co., TN, wed Nancy Jane BEATY, who was daughter of James Beaty, at Ewing, IL on 2 Mar 1851. Elias died 11 Dec 1900 and Nancy Jane died 20 Jan 1912. Both died in Franklin Co., IL and are buried in the Phillips Cemetery there. Their children were: George W., Amanda J., Joshua, William, Emma, Francis Marion, Louisa, and Elias Monroe Warren. Elias, Sr. served in the Union Army in the Civil War.
- 3. Jacob Warren born 1825 in Hardin Co., TN, wed Frances C. Hagy on 12 Oct 1846 in Hardin Co., TN at the home of her father, Henry Hagy. The wedding was performed by Josophia HURLEY, J.P. In 1853-54 Jacob and family moved to Franklin Co., IL. Their children were: William Leroy, Mary C., Henry D. Oliver, Casabianca Finnel, Samuel Davis, Elijah Webb, and Clara Medora Warren. Jacob served in the Union Army in the Civil War, dying of the "flux" and is buried in Tennessee.
- 4. Joshua Warren born c1827 in Hardin Co., TN was age 22 and not yet married in the 1850 Franklin Co., IL census and was living in the household of Lewis G. PAYNE. He appears to be the first of this family to move to Illinois. He had died by 3 Feb 1867. Joshua married Eliza J. ? and had children: Nancy C., Manerva C., Terrissa V.
- 5. John F. Warren born cl830 in Hardin Co., TN wed Elizabeth WHITLOW on 10 Oct 1852 in Franklin Co., IL with Lewis G. Payne, J.P. performing the ceremony. They had at least four children born in Illinois: Carrol (male), William, Nancy E., and Clara E. Warren. John F. Warren also served in the Union Army in the Civil War.
- 6. Nancy Warren born c1840 in Hardin Co., TN wed Dr. Simeon Monroe ROBERSON on 4 Nov 1858 in Franklin Co., IL. Simeon's parents were William and Elizabeth "Betsy" (Payne) Roberson. "Betsy" was a sister of Lewis G. Payne, J.P. Nancy and Simeon's children were: Monroe, Hester, Alice, Sally, John Q., and Green M. Roberson.

 Sarah "Sally" Ann Warren - born cl841 in Hardin Co., TN married Simeon's brother, Francis Marion Roberson on 28 Sep 1858 in Franklin Co., IL. Three of their children were: George, Nancy E., and Sarah Roberson.

This information was found on a loose sheet in the Bible of Nancy Caroline Shedden WEST. The Bible is presently owned by Mrs. Henry William Sheddan of Live Oak, FL.

James SHEDDAN was born 18 Jan 1797 in Jefferson Co., TN. He was married to Sarah H. RUSSELL in Blount Co., TN on 21 Jan 1823. The first six of their children were born in Blount Co., TN. They moved to Benton Co. (now Calhoun Co.) AL where the last four children were born. The family later moved to Rusk Co., TX.

CASWELL MALONE'S CONFEDERATE SERVICE - Contributed by Mrs. Bernadett Malone Spillone, 1631 Robin Whipple Way, Belmont, CA 94002

"Cas" Malone was the first born son of Leonard Malone and Molly SHINAULT. He was born 26 Nov 1841 in Fayette Co., TN. Cas had three brothers, Leonard Polk Malone, John Malone, Dallas Malone and a sister, Emiline Malone. His mother, Molly, died in 1848 and the following year (1849) his father married Ann PULLIAM. After his father's death, his whole brothers and sister went to live with their Shinault uncles and their grandmother, Hannah Shinault. Caswell remained on the farm with his stepmother and his half sisters and brothers.

On 24 May 1861 Caswell enlisted in Jackson, TN in the "Gaines Guards", Co. G, 13th Regiment of the Tennessee Infantry. He was mustered in at New Madrid, MO with pay of \$11 per month. His Company was officially under: Cheatham's Division, Vaughn's Brigade, Pittman's Regiment under the overall command of Gen. Braxton BRAGG.

While in the Confederate Army, Caswell saw much action. His earliest recorded battle was at Belmont, MO in late 1861. The next came on April 6-7, 1862 when he fought in the second largest battle of the war at Shiloh. He escaped this terrible time to fight again at Perryville, KY on 8 Oct 1862. On 31 Dec 1862, at Murfreesboro (the Battle of Stone's River), Caswell was severely wounded in the arm and right thigh, but it was not until 5 Jan 1863 that he was taken prisoner of war and carried to Camp Morton, Indianapolis, IN where he was held for approximately three and one half months. On 12 Apr 1865 he was released in a prisoner exchange and

sent to City Point, VA. It was from here that he was sent for additional medical care to the Confederate States Hospital at Petersburg, VA. By Sep 1863 Caswell was once again back under the command of Gen. Bragg. Since his wounds made him unfit for general duty, he was ordered to serve as a train guard and provost. In this assignment he was in service at the Battle of Chickamauga on Sep 19-20, 1863. Records show he was issued new clothing on 25 Oct 1864 at Augusta, GA. He was home on furlough when the war ended and his regiment was paroled on 2 May 1865 at Greensboro, NC.

In Jan 1870 Caswell married Frances "Fannie" TWISDALE, the daughter of David William Twisdale and Eliza GORDON. They settled in Tipton Co., TN and had three children: Joseph Mason, Mary Ruth, and Georgia Malone, according to the 1880 census. Caswell Malone died on 26 Feb 1923 and his wife, Fannie, passed away 23 Jun 1928.

On this Sixth day of Sep 1834, before me, the subscriber, a Justice of the Peace for the said Co. of Mercer, personally appeared Jonathan BARNARD who on his oath, declares that he is the same person who formerly belonged to the Company commanded by Capt. E. NOEL in the Regiment commanded by Col. Henry KNOX, Artillery in the service of the United States; that his name was placed on the pension roll of the State of East Tennessee, from whence he has lately removed; that he now resides in the State of Kentucky, where he intends to remain, and wishes his pension to be there payable, in future. The following are his reasons for removing from Tenneysee, to Kentucky, his children and friends were breaking up and removing off to the west and he thought he could live better and cheaper in Kentucky.

Samuel Jobe was married in Maury Co., TN to Sarah (Sallie) FRANK who was born 1800 in Kenturky. They remained there until after the 1830 census and then moved to Hardeman Co., TN for the 1840 census. Samuel died 5 Jan 1845. Sarah and her family moved to Tippah Co., MS, settling in what is now Benton Co., MS. Among their eleven children, number six is Francis Marion Jobe who was born in 1830 in Maury Co., TN and married Elizabeth Moore. The 1850 census of Tippah Co., MS lists Francis Jobe with his mother, Sarah Jobe, and her children. The same census lists Elizabeth Moore in family #1231, E. P. Moore RICHMOND, her stepfather. It also gives Peyton English Moore as Robert P. Moore.

Francis Marion Jobe fought in the Civil War, was taken prisoner and died 3 Sep 1864. His and Elizabeth's children were: Sarah A., who died young in 1855; Martha J. born 1857 and died young; William Thomas Buchanan who was born 10 May 1859; and John W. Jobe who was born 1863 and died Oct. 1869.



Nov. 13, 1858 Session met, present; Rev. EVANS, Elders FLEMING & FARLEY. Mr. W.J. LORANCE presented a Certificate of Membership asking to be received into Salem Church, which was granted. At the same time Certificates of Dismission were granted to J. MORRIS & wife, and to Miss E.G. MORRIS.

Dec. 12, 1858 Session met; present, EVANS, FLEMING & FARLEY. Mr. Wm. HARBISON & wife, Mrs. G. HARBISON, J.P. HARBISON, Miss Sarah A. HARBISON and Mrs. Martha McKINSTRY asked for Letters of Dismission from this church which were granted.

Examined and approved April 9, 1859 - LaGrange, TN, W.H. THOMPSON, Moderator.

May 7, 1859 Session met; present, EVANS, FLEMING & FARLEY. Letters of Dismission were granted to Philip McNEIL, Sarah M. McNEIL, John Robert McNEIL & A.W. McNEIL to join the Wattensaw Presbyterian Church, Arkansas.

May 22, 1859 Session met; present, EVANS, FLEMING & FARLEY. Mr. Samuel McKINNEY was received on a certificate.

June 12, 1859 Session met; present, EVANS, FLEMING & FARLEY. Mrs. Polly Ann HUTCHERSON & Miss Isabella HUNTER were received by certificate from Tallabenita Church, Mississippi.

Sep. 12, 1859 Session met; present, EVANS, FLEMING & FARLEY. J.M. FLEMING was elected delegate to attend Presbytery at Osceola, AR, W.T. FARLEY, alternate.

Oct. 9, 1859 Session met; present, EVANS, FLEMING. Mrs. Fannie S. ALEXANDER was received by certificate from the Methodist E. Church.

Feb. 12, 1860 Session met; present, EVANS, FLEMING. W.J. LORANCE asked for & obtained a Certificate of Dismission to join Hopewell Church, Mississippi.

Sep. 5, 1860 Session met; present, EVANS, FLEMING & FARLEY. Mr. W.A. BANKS presented a Certificate of Dismission from Madison Church, Virginia & was received into this church. Dr. Joseph S. McNEELY and Mrs. Jane R. HENDRICK were received upon examination.

Sep. 8, 1861 Session met; present, EVANS, FARLEY & FLEMING. Mary Ellen DAVIS was received on examination. Elder FARLEY was elected to represent this church at Presbytery to be held at Emmons Church in Fayette County on the 12th inst.

At the same time, Mrs. Maria E. SOMMERS presented a certificate from LaGrange and was received. Mrs. Mary STRATTON presented through the pastor of First Presbyterian Church of Memphis a certificate and was received into the church. Also, at the same time, Dr. Alexander C. EWELL presented a certificate from the Presbyterian church at LaGrange and was received into this church. (the pages numbered 54 & 55 are missing from the book at this point) May 11, 1867 Session met; present, EVANS, FARLEY & FLEMING. Mr. Samuel J. DUNN applied before the session and stated that he was a member of the church in Arkansas, that it was not a formal dismission as at the time he obtained it he did not know where he would settle. Also Mr. James E. HUTCHESON stated to the session that he was a member of the Presbyterian Church in Montgomery, AL before the war, but that he had been unable to attend that church for many years and he would send for a Letter of Dismission. Both were received into this church. Aug. 17, 1867 Session met; present, EVANS, FARLEY & FLEMING. Miss Virginia LUSK was received into the church on examination. Sep. 12, 1869 Session met; present, EVANS, FLEMING & SOMMERS. Elder SOMMERS was appointed to represent the church at Presbytery at Park Ave. Church on Thurs. Sept 16th inst. Apr. 24, 1870 Session met; present, EVANS, FLEMING & SOMMERS. Miss Mary DEAN was granted a Letter of Dismission from this church to connect herself with a church of like faith wherever in the Providence of God her lot may be cast. Whereas Col. W.A. 
