

He offers census and tax records, marriages from 1861-1881, cemetery listings, and some local military records. #### FAMILY GATHERINGS

NORVELL MIGRATION - Submitted by Grace Norvell, 108 Richards Ave., Winchester, VA 22601

Following even one family as they spread across America is instructive in how our nation was settled and developed. The Norvells of Tennessee provide a good example of how this was done. In addition, the migration of this family into Tennessee provides insight into how whole groups of people took part in the westward movement which peopled America. The Norvell relocation was remarkable only in that not many men of about eighty made such an arduous resettlement as our ancestor, James Norvell.

In late 1807 or early 1808, after a brief stay in Sumner County, Tennessee, the Norvells -- James Sr. and his five grown sons, William, James Jr., David, John and Clinton -- arrived in Bedford County, Tennessee at the time it was opened for settlement. The Norvells were accompanied by their KNOTT cousins and some of the neighbors from their home in Granville and Franklin Counties of North Carolina. Other families from the old neighborhood soon followed. Soon Norvells, Knotts, RAGSDALES, DAVISes, FRAZIERS, HILLS, TAYLORS, BROWNS, BRADFORDS, OWENSES, ROBERTS, MORRISSES, SNELLINGS (and possibly DRAKES, SUTTONS and CRAIGS) all had settled together again in the fertile, rolling hills of northeastern Bedford Co TN near the present village of Bell Buckle.

Probably, if the whole Norvell family had not made the migration to Tennessee as a group, old James Norvell and his wife, Mary Knott, would have found the relocation impossible. With sons, daughters-in-law, grandchildren of every age and all of the family's slaves making the move together, some protection must have been given to the old couple.

Once settled, they resumed their frontier life and evidently re-established their religious life, helping to form a new Methodist-Episcopal church, cemetery and campground on their land. The church was known as Norvell's or Salem Church and the cemetery remains. Life in Tennessee, after the initial struggle of starting anew, probably continued much as it had in North Carolina.

However, as time went on, the sons began to be drawn, once again, further south and west -- wherever new land was available. Sons William and John remained at Bell Buckle, but their brother David moved a few miles away to a larger farm in Bedford County. Clinton moved south to Lawrence Co AL briefly, and then back to McMinn Co TN. James Jr. took his young family to McNairy Co TN. Eventually, their descendants scattered into Arkansas, Texas, Oklahoma and points west, so that Norvell/Norville descendants from the Bedford Co TN family are now living all across America.

Breaking new ground was a tradition for the Norvells, just as it was for many other early families. By 1630, an early Norvell forebearer had acquired title to land in Tidewater Virginia. From that time on, successive generations of Norvells, responding to the lure of virgin land, pushed westward with the expansion of our country, often accepting the challenge of taming the wilderness.

FAYETTE CO TN DEED BOOK INDENTURE - Contributed by Mrs. Jean West 3133 Chisca, Memphis, TN 38111

Deed Book F, page 77 - This Indenture made 1 Oct 1836 between Abbe WILLIAMS, free woman of color on one part and Edwin WATKINS and John C. COOPER on other part. Whereas Abbe Williams free woman of color aforesaid is the rightfull owner of a certain negro man named William BRAWNER, a tailor by trade and a honest peaceful, industrious slave and whereas the said Abbe William has determined to marry her said slave William and to give him full management and control of all his business and property for the term of ninety-nine years and whereas also the said Abbe is desirous of giving her said slave and husband as full liberty by the laws of Tennessee he can have to pursue his said trade of tailoring or any other lawful occupation and to enjoy all the profits, proceeds, and earnings of his own labor and all the profits and proceeds of the said Abbes property during the said term of years; and whereas the said Abbe, after expiration of the term aforesaid desires to emancipate her said slave according to the laws of Tennessee and to vest the remainder of all her property in the children which she may have by her said slave William. Now therefore this indenture witnesseth that in consideration of the premises and the sum of 1.00 to her in hand pd by the said E. Watkins and J.C. Cooper the said Abbe hath bargained an sold and conveyed by the presents doth bargain, sell & convey unto Edwin Watkins and John C. Cooper and their heirs forever all her real and personal property consisting of the following viz three lots of ground in Sommerville #3 block P, Block P #4, Block R #5 also her negro man slave William Brawner, one horse, numerous articles of household and kitchen furniture togather with some hogs and other livestock to have and to hold in trust, however for the proper use, benefit and behoof of said William for 99 years from this date. and to emancipate the said William or cause him to be conveyed to the Colony of Liberia in Africa subsequent therefore or after death of slave William to have and hold the remainder of property for children of Abbe and said slave William. Watkins & Cooper to give him permit in writing to carry her business to have full enjoyment, management and control during said term of years. Also Watkins & Cooper shall sanction, confirm every sale, purchase and contract which said William shall desire to make with regard to said property, its proceeds and profits during term of years aforesaid - for the special purpose and intent moreover that after the expiration of term and emancipation of said slave or upon death of Watkins & Cooper or their heirs shall convey & assign said property and proceeds & profits of labour of slave & all such property as may be received on xchange for the property aforesaid or bought by its proceeds & profits or by the proceed & profits of labour of said slave as aforesaid to the children of Abbe Williams by slave William and their heirs forever.

The following information is from the family Bible of Mrs. Marry L. (Baker) PALMER. It was printed in New York by the American Bible Society, 1858.

JAMES VAUGHAN RECORDS - Submitted by Verna Baker Banes P.O. Box 7435, Huntsville, TX 77342-7435

The Bible was found in the former home of C.S. KILGORE, Hancock Co TN, where Sarah Jane PAYNE, wife of Swimpfield VAUGHN and second wife of James ROLLER, died 1926. She probably got it from John and Temperence Seal Vaughan when she and Swimpfield lived in their home on Copper Ridge.

James Vaughan was born 27 Sep 1767 and his first wife was born 30 Aug 1770. One source says one of his wives was Elizabeth WALKER, but he was survived by his widow, Sally. His will was dated 8 Sep 1840 Hawkins Co TN. His children were:

In his will James directs that his son, John, should have the land and plantation whereon I now live, containing 100 acres, also 30 acres known by the written place

and also an entry of 30 acres lying on the north side of Copper Ridge, which has not been surveyed. Then the part of land lying on Clinch Mountain River should be rented for the support of wife, Sally, and her support until her death when son, John, may sell the land. If he chooses to sell the land, he should pay William, Allen, Nancy Donnelson, Patsy Rogers and Elizabeth HERREL fifty dollars each in money or good trade. He appointed his sons, James, Joseph and Benjamin W., as executors. The will was witnessed by James PAYNE and George Payne.

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This Bible Record information was taken from a copy submitted by Ms. Renick to obtain her Certificate of Tennessee Ancestry issued by The Tennessee Genealogical Society. Complete data on each generation of Ms. Renick's ancestors will be published in the Certificate of Tennessee Ancestry book. The Bible information was obtained from Clara MARTIN of Fullerton, CA in 1984. It is a certified copy of Keziah Whitman SMITH's Bible which passed to her son Drew, and to his son Drewer, and on to his son Lenn Smith of Knoxville, TN. Jacob and John Whitman were the only sons of the family whose father disappeared and possibly returned to the old home.

### SHELBY COUNTY PETITIONS TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF TENNESSEE

Two early petitions from Shelby Co TN to the Legislature in Nashville reveal the disagreement between those living on the Chickasaw Bluff [Memphis], and those living in the rest of the county. They disagreed over the boundaries of the county and the location of the county seat. These two petitions are important because the 1820 Census gives so few names and the petitions add many more names of men who were in this area earlier. Some persons in the outlying part of the county were in this part of West Tennessee from early 1800's farming by agreement with the Indians.

The first petition is badly torn with pieces of pages missing. It has no date on it, but was probably 1821 or 1822. "The petition of the undersigned living at and in the neighborhood of the Chickasaw Bluff, in the Southwestern corner of this State Respectully Shews...most of them have emigrated latterly from other parts...Reynoldsburg is the nearest Court of Justice...place of holding Court should be fixed at the Bluff...the county boundaries should extend thirty miles eastward..."

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#### Shelby County Petitions to the General Assembly of Tennessee (continued)

The second petition was dated "In Senate 18th 1823." A statement by John Ralston says that he had "platted the meanders of the Mississippi River as returned by M. Byler." The petitioners "solicit your attention to the subjects of complaint made known to you at the last Session with the addition of a few more...to give a detailed statement of the means used by selfish men to mislead our Legislature at different times...The State of North Carolina having granted a portion of this section of our country one of the grants fell into the hands of persons afflicted with the rage of town makeing. This tract lies in about five miles of the south west corner of our county and State, and includes the Chickesaw Bluffs. These Bluffs are cut off from the ballance of the State by Wolf and Loosa Hatcha rivers which emty in the Mississippi at the head of the Bluffs. At the purchase a dozen families or less of Indian country people resided here. In the fall of 1819 the intrigues we complain of commenced. It is said a man named Wm Ferguson was employed to make a list of 200 petitioners for a county, it being the constitutional number. The next step was to represent to the Session of 1819 that 200 good and lawfull men resided here without the benefit of law and gospel and prayed for the organization of a county etc. This was done and a pack of Justice of the peace appointed all liveing on or near these Bluffs...Not a man lived in the interior of the county. No survey of our county haveing been made it was represented to be necessary to have our Southern line 30 miles long. This was done, but afterwards at the Session of 1821 when all the counties in the Western District had their limits fixed from actual survey... The manner in which the act of 1822 was passed was very mischevous... The rivers Wolf and Loosa Hatcha divide our county from east to west a distance of thirty miles the extensive bottoms of which are overflowed for months by the back water of the Mississippi. By fixing the Courthouse at the Bluffs below the mouth of these rivers we will be detached from the ballance of the State and our courts never will be held with regularity...We also ask for the appointment of John Ralston, Esquire and James Warren to act as Justices of the Peace for Tradewells company..." #### WARREN COUNTY, TENNESSEE 1836 TAX LIST Contributed by Wanda Muncey Gant 112 West End Avenue, McMinnville, TN 37110

The 1836 tax list is helpful in that it sometimes listed for the first time in Warren County people who had come from another county after the 1830 census. The list was recorded by civil districts and is important to persons researching the 1840 census of Coffee, Dekalb, Van Buren, Cannon and later Grundy County, which was formed in 1844. When school land is listed, it means that a person rented land, and the money went to support the school.

Ed. Note - Names of taxpayers are spelled as the clerk wrote them in 1836 and as they appear on the microfilm, Tennessee State Library and Archives Tax List, Roll No. 9. Descendants of these people may not use the same spelling. Abbreviations are: DIST. = District, A = Acres, TL = Town Lot, S/L = School Land, S = Slave, W = White Poll. \* = Mrs. Gant's comments at conclusion.

ABSTRACTS FROM THE 1855 TENNESSEE CONFERENCE, UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

The Rev. Matthew Pitts PARHAM, son of Thomas J. Parham of Maury County...was converted at Pope's Campground in 1843...was received on trial in the Tennessee Conference in 1844, and appointed to Hickory Creek Circuit, then Carthage Circuit. He was ordained a deacon at conference in Nash-ville in 1846 and appointed with Rev. F.S. FETWAY to Asbury Circuit. "In 1847 he was placed on the Dover Circuit with Rev. Jordan MOORE. He was ordained elder in Clarksville in 1848 and sent to Decatur Station. In 1849 he was placed on the Wartrace Circuit, where his health failed him." After two years, he was appointed junior preacher on Mt. Pleasant Circuit. "At our last conference he obtained a superannuated relation and went to Texas to restore his health." He died there in early spring of 1855.

The Rev. James F. McCRACKEN was the son of John and Elizabeth McCracken; he was born 22 May 1828 in Lawrence County, TN...professed religion in 1848 at Mt. Pisgah Campground in Giles County... licensed to preach in 1850...admitted on trial to the Tennessee Conference in the fall of 1852, and appointed to the Richland Circuit with the Rev. J.R. M'CLURE...1853 appointed to Savannah Circuit with the Rev. F.M. HICKMAN...ordained deacon in 1854 and reappointed to Savannah Circuit. After an eight-day illness, he died 26 Aug 1855, leaving a wife (not named). The Goodspeed Biographical and Historical Memoirs of Western Arkansas was published in 1891 by the Goodspeed Publishing Company for the counties of Yell, Pope, Johnson, Logan, Scott, Polk and Montgomery. In 1978 new material was copyrighted by the Rev. Silas Emmett Lucas Jr., Southern Historical Press, P. O. Box 738, Easley, SC 29640.

The abstracted biographies show some connection with Tennessee in the life of the subject. Since they are abstracts and not complete quotes, the researcher should refer to the original for complete information. Abbreviations used are:

MAJOR GENERAL P. R. CLEBURNE'S GRAVE Contributed by Amelia P. Eddlemon, 4555 Jamaica, Memphis, TN 38117

Major General Cleburne is buried in the Confederate Cemetery in Helena, Arkansas. The cemetery is located on a hill at the end of a Memorial Drive and is surrounded by trees. There are two monuments, one probably erected at the time he actually died, and the other some time later. The larger marker indicated that he fought in the battles of Shiloh, Missionary Ridge, Richmond Ky, Ringgold Gap, Chickamauga, Scheltonhouse and Franklin. The inscription reads:

> Patrick Ronayne Cleburne Major General, Confederate States of America b. County York, Ireland 17 Mar 1828 Killed in Battle of Franklin, Tenn. 30 Nov 1864



#### BOOK REVIEWS

## Lincoln Johnson, Marilyn D. Kimberling and Vyrah Mann

THE TENNESSEE COUNTY HISTORY SERIES, MONTGOMERY COUNTY by Ursula S. Beach. 1988. Hard back, 6x9. Indexed, 144 pp. Order from Memphis State University Press, Memphis, TN 38152. \$12.50

This compact history of Montgomery County, which is situated on the Northern Plateau of the Highland Rim and lies on the Kentucky border, begins with a vivid description of prehistoric culture and the coming of the white man. It moves through two centuries of progress in brief but colorful sketches on life in the Cumberlands, government, prominent citizens, education, commerce, transportation etc. Of interest to genealogists is the fact that records of deeds are available from 1788, minutes of the court from 1805 and marriage records from 1837. The county seat is Clarksville, which in 1984 celebrated the bicentennial of its founding.

This volume, prepared by the Cleveland Library staff and local volunteers, includes more than 500 cases of Bradley County's earliest years. Because many of the county records were burned during the civil war, this information is valuable to historians and genealogists alike. In each case the State is the Complainant, and each case contains the names of the persons involved and the offence and a brief description where possible. The transcription of documents pertaining to the murder trial are almost verbatim; only a few changes in spelling have been made to clarify the intent of the original. This gives one an idea of life in a frontier town.

Although death certificates in Tennessee were first kept on a statewide basis from 1907 through 1912, laws on record-keeping were not uniform until 1914, and deaths were not recorded in 1913. Cleveland newspapers were used for the 1913 deaths found here. The deceased are listed alphabetically, with a separate index for fathers and one for mothers by their maiden names. Many persons listed were born before 1850; thus, information on their parentage might be difficult to obtain. Additional information on the certificates may be obtained from a copy of the original at the History Branch of the Cleveland Library, 833 N. Ocoee St., Cleveland, TN 37311.

TRAILS TO WILLIAMSON COUNTY, ILLINOIS by Barbara Heistand Moore & Jack Dean Moore. 1988. Acco bound, 8½x11. Indexed, 484 pp. Order from Barbara Moore, Route 12, Box 378, New Braunfels, TX 78132. \$31.50

Beginning with a chart of at least eleven lines, this collection of family data includes reproductions of family group sheets, census records, tax lists, newspaper clippings etc, not just of one person or couple, but of whole family groups. The Moore family of Wilson County, Tennessee is traced to Williamson County, Illinois; the Deaton family from the east coast and Alabama has been logged to Williamson Co.; the Hawkins and McDonalds who went to Williamson Co. are included in the record. A wealth of information on the Elmore, Matheny, O'Neal, Caplinger, Reager, Jernigan, Diggs, Haley, Henson & Davis families fills the remainder of this large book.

IN AND AROUND THE BIG ROCK - A HISTORY OF BALD KNOB, ARKANSAS by Lincoln Johnson & Elizabeth Short. 1988. Hard back, 5½x8½. Indexed, 342 pp. Order from Bald Knob Chamber of Commerce, P.O. Box 338, Bald Knob, AR 72010. \$26.80

This handsome keepsake book is basically a local history of a small town in the eastern part of White County, Arkansas and the rural area of Bald Knob Township, from the time of its formation in 1876 to the present. This area included a large part of eastern White Co., which was first settled by families whose origins were in Virginia and North Carolina. Many had crossed the southern states before the Civil War, and in the 1870s others came from the Mid-West looking for cheap farm lands and employment in the opening timber industry. This is a complication of all their stories of life in the early days, of the progress made as railroads, churches and industries came into being. More than one hundred and thirty people have searched through old trunks, shared their memories and pictures to compile an enduring record.

MARRIAGES OF MORGAN COUNTY, ALABAMA, 1818-1896 by Elbert J. Minter. 1986. Soft cover, 8½x11. 305 pp. Order from Tennessee Valley Genealogical Society, Inc., P.O. Box 1568, Huntsville, AL 35807. \$22.00

"There are many names in this marriage book that do not appear in any other Morgan County record and are not names common to North Alabama. The reason for this is that a major wagon trail westward went through Cotaco/Morgan County during the formative years. This trail, coupled with extensive Tennessee River commerce and travel, and later, railroads, brought transients into and took them out of the county. Many stopped long enough to obtain a marriage license, marry and then depart." Interspersed among these marriage records are copies of original bonds and licenses found in the Office of the Probate Judge of Morgan County. We sometimes forget to acknowledge our appreciation for the time-consuming efforts, like Mr. Minter, who for ten years painstakingly copied by hand from courthouse records. To the Tennessee Valley Genealogical Society, Inc., who posthumously published this work of Mr. Minter, we way "Thank you."

SHELTON, WININGER AND PACE FAMILIES BY Harold Casey and Robert Casey. 1988. Hardback, 6x9. Indexed, 786 pp. Order from the author, 1002 Westwood Dr., Stillwater, OK 74074. \$35.00

Numerous intermarriages among the Shelton, Wininger and Pace families led the authors to publish the genealogies of these three families in one book. Beginning with proven ancestors in Scott County, Virginia, Hawkins County, Tennessee, and Jackson County, Alabama before 1800 the authors skillfully bring an interesting format for researchers of these and allied families. Records start with John Shelton, progenitor of two Shelton lines, who was born between 1780-1790 and bring the family up-to-date. The book, reproduced on special PH balanced paper, includes many photographs and family anecdotes. Allied lines include Bellomy, Gentle, Davidson, Davis, Frazier, Hall, Haynes, Jones, Manning, Messer, Potter, and Smith in Texas, Arkansas, Oklahoma, Colorado, Florida, Indiana, and elsewhere. Previously published books by these authors are CASEY FAMILY HISTORY and BROOKS FAMILY HISTORY.

GENEALOGY AND HISTORY OF THE WATSON FAMILY FROM IRISH EMIGRANTS TO MAYFLOWER DESCENDANTS compiled by Samuel E. Watson, Jr. 1988. Soft cover, 7x10. Indexed, 190 pp. Order from the author, 5507 Inverness Ave., Santa Rosa, CA 95404. \$21.00

To escape religious persecution, Mathew Watson fled from Ireland to England. Fleeing a second time to Boston in 1718, he arrived with his wife, Mary Orr, seven sons, and two daughters, Settling at Leicester, Massachusetts in 1720, most of the family remained there and the north-easttern states of Rhode Island, Connecticut, and New York. Later generations moved south and west to Tennessee and Texas and elsewhere. The author has included several generations of related surnames and seventeen of the female lines with no less than three generations and as many as eleven. Mr. Watson states that he was assisted by Ann Watson (Stevens) Lively in the preparation of this manuscript.

CHOATES OF THE SOUTH, DESCENDANTS OF CHRISTOPHER CHOATE OF MARYLAND compiled by Irene Choate Williams. 1983. Soft cover, 81x11. Vol. I 153 pp., Vol. II 193 pp., each indexed. Order from the compiler, 2223 Hollywood Dr. #67, Jackson, TN 38305. Write author for price.

Christopher Choate was one of the early immigrants to Maryland from England in 1676. Little has been written about him, consequently the information in these volumes is not contained in other Choate publications. He is believed to be the progenitor of most of the Choates of the South and Southwest. Vol. I begins with early marriages and baptismal records in England, folfowed by various early records in Maryland, family lines of his sons Christopher and Edward Choate, and land records. Tax lists and census records from MD, VA, NC, SC, KY, LA, MS and TN complete this volume. Vol. II consists entirely of Choate Family records in 25 Tennessee counties. These records include deeds, probates, county court minutes, bills-of-sale, and various other records including the census of these counties from 1850-1900. The families of primary concern are detailed from the immigrant colonists to presentday members of the family, quoting from early letters and family knowledge for added color. Abundant notes are given to document statements and credit other researchers. There are many references to Beaufort Co, NC and to the Primitive Baptist Church.

# CERTIFICATE OF TENNESSEE ANCESTRY

In 1986 the Tennessee Genealogical Society began a program to recognize descendants of the state's earliest settlers and to preserve their history. We have received records on many of our founders, and publication of that material is in the planning stages. If you have an ancestor who lived in Tennessee at any time from first settlement through 1880 you are eligible to participate in the Certificate Program. It is not necessary for you to be a member of the Tennessee Genealogical Society, or for you to live in Tennessee. It is only necessary that you have a documented ancestor who did. There are three categories:

> Prior to Statehood (1796): Pioneer - Certificate of Tennessee Ancestry 1797 to 1850: Settler - Certificate of Tennessee Ancestry 1851 to 1880: Certificate of Tennessee Ancestry

Pictured below is a reduced copy of the certificate. The 8 x 11 inch original is printed on ivory parchment with background illustrations in a gray half-tone. Printing is black highlighted by a gilt border. A shiny gold seal decorates the Settler certificate, with a ribbon added for the Pioneer certificate.
