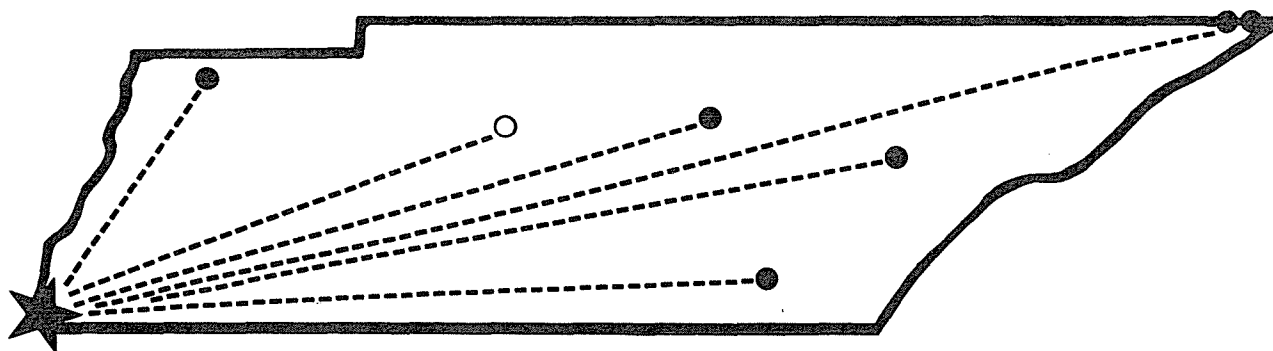

## PETITIONS TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF TENNESSEE

*Abstracted from Tennessee State Library and Archives Microfilm**Legislative Petitions 1812-1813, Roll NO. 4**(Continued from Summer issue)*

14-3-1813 Petition of Thomas BLACKNEY of Montgomery County shows that he "is now and has been many years in the Possession of a woman of Colour named Harriette about thirty one or thirty two years of age and was bourn in the State of Virginia near the close of the revolutionary War and from the best information your Petitioner...doth believe that the mother of said Harriette was entitled to her freedom and was plundered from the State of Maryland, run to the State of South Carolina and sold to the father of your petitioner as a Slave..." His father, on enquiry, discovered that Harriette was entitled to her freedom by birth when she became of age. As a last request he asked that Harriette should not be treated as a slave but should be raised as a member of the family and given her freedom "when she arrive at full age." This is now the purpose of this petition. Furthermore, Harriette has been in the possession of Thomas Blackney for "upwards of Seventeen years since which time she...has borne three children...Frederick, a boy twelve years of age on the \_\_\_ day of April last - John, a boy seven years of age the 15th of January last and Tobias, a boy five years of age the 10th day of December last, which said illegitimate children your petitioner requests and wishes should be made free when they arrive at the age of manhood and surnamed after the Blakney family..." Blackney requests that he be made Guardian of the boys and promises to feed, clothe & educate them. He further states that "the Act of Assembly ratified in the year 1801 authorizing the County Courts to emansipate Slaves does not cover your petitioner's request or wish, said Woman of Colour not being considered as a Slave, and her three children not being claimed by me or any other person as such..."

15-3-1813 Memorial on the subject of Tipling Houses: Numerous Tipling Shops are erected on the "high way, and in our Towns by free Negroes and others to such an extent that our Servants cannot with safety be sent on our ordinary business, owing to the traffic and intoxication encouraged and carried on at those Sinks of Corruption...Sabbath days are regularly violated and profaned by the numerous crowd of Slaves collected for the purpose of drinking and bartering for whiskey, the stolen property of their owners, and others..." The following men signed the request for the Assembly to "remedy the evil": [Ed. Note. No county is given, but many of the names appeared on the 1811 Davidson County Tax List.]

16-3-1813 The petition of Samuel HAMILTON, "a Free Man of Colour", who has lived in Washington Co for a number of years. He has lost a considerable portion of the fruits of his labor due to his legal inability to prove his accounts, and he asks the legislature to "grant him such Relief as in your wisdom shall seem meet and right..." Signed "Samuel Hammilton." The following citizens of Washington Co endorse him as "Sober, Honest and Industrious":

16-3-1813-2b "County of Green and State of Tennessee I do Hereby Sertify that Samuel HAMBELTON a free man of Colour has lived with me for the term of one year and sinse has had his home with me, that is of Saterdag night and sun-days, as I have his wife, during which time he has Behaved him self with due Respect and in which term of time I have traded with him to the amount of one mare and sadle to the amount of Seventy Dollars and he paid with the grateist punctuality... always has paid with as much honour as any gentle man in the County." 17-3-1813 Petition of John MOORE for redress in the matter of building a jail in Washington, Rhea County..."being Lowest Bider & Being unfortunately Bid Down By the ambition of one Individual to the Reduced price of three hundred & thirty Eight Dollars & one quarter..." A detailed report of the building's size and specifications follows, showing the total cost to be \$575.86. Moore asks the Legislature, sitting at Nashville on the third Monday of September 1813, to reconsider the problem.  
26 Oct 1813 "Reasonable" 4 pages)

18-3-1813 Petition of John DICKINSON and Wm W COOKE, a committee appointed by the Directors of the Nashville Library Company, for the incorporation of said company. The association was formed in 1812 for the purpose of establishing a public library. Subscriptions of \$1500 were pledged and about \$1000 was spent on the collection.

19-3-1813 Petition of citizens of Campbell Co for relocation of the county seat which "now lies four miles from Anderson Co. & seventeen miles from Claiborne Co...provided the line of measurement Should be Drawn Directly up & Down Powell's Valley in which the said court Hous now Stands..." 20-3-1813 Petition of "the mountaineer inhabitants" of northeast Bledsoe Co for a separation of their area from Bledsoe Co and its addition to either White or Roane Co. The shape of Bledsoe Co at this time was sixty-eight miles long by three miles wide, making a distance of 40 to 55 miles from the petitioners homes to the county seat of Madison. The group which would attach to Roane Co consisted of:

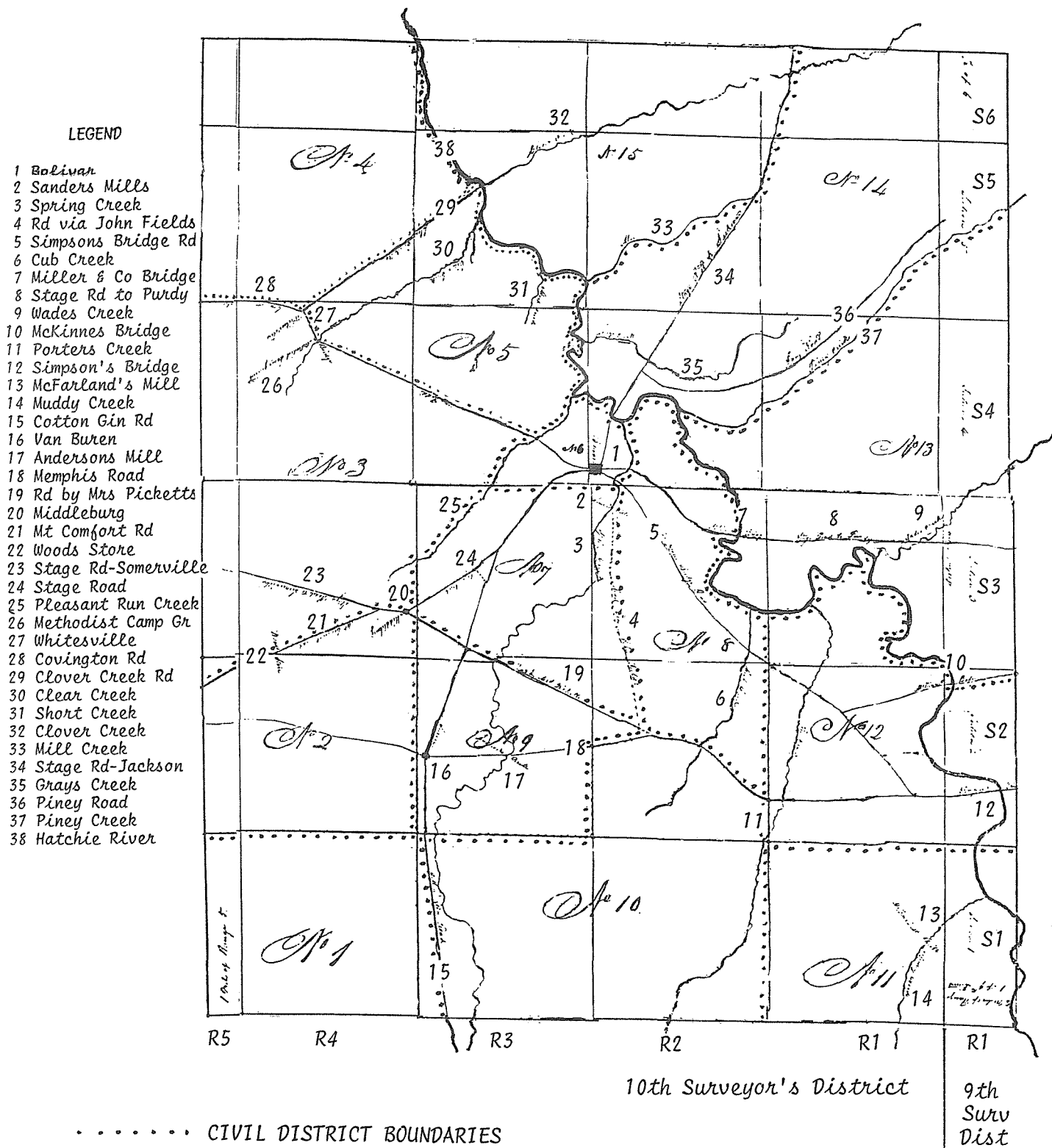

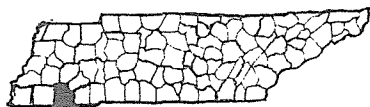

These citizens have heard that Peter HOOTENPILE has prepared a petition to "establish and keep a Turpike" when there is already such a road opened and kept in good order by an "Overseer and hands." The citizens ask for rejection of Hootenpile's petition, if presented - "I do hereby certify; that a rough draught of the above Petition, was handed to me, together with all the names thereunto annexed, which appears below in my hand writing, with a request to transfer the whole on clean paper. Turner LANE." No date (5 pages)

22-3-1813 Petition of William HILL for replacement of a lost document - a grant, #1192 dated 29 Jun 1809 for 200 acres of land founded on Certificate #42 for 2380 acres issued by the Board of Commissioners for West Tennessee to James MABIN/MABANE on 17 Jul 1807. The grant was sent from Nashville to Knoxville "to be executed by his excellency the governor", but now cannot be found in either place. Witnessed by Jos COLEMAN, J.P. in Nashville 13 Oct 1813. ## A YOUNG MAN'S QUEST (continued from Summer issue)

May 18th 1852 The weather has been cool & pleasant. I was out late last night in search of a stray lunatic but did not succeed in finding her. She escaped from the Asylum about 11 oclock in the morning & passed here after sundown. After supper an assistant physician came in pursuit & at his request I accompanied him. She was found today at the academy & carried back to the Asylum.

May 19th 1852 Saw Mr Brooks today & was informed by him of the operations of Mr Carnahan. I found it necessary to go to Murfreesboro & attend to the accts he had in his hands. Went up on the evening train & remained all night. Found him sick & could not get a settlement with him. He promised me however that he would attend to it in the morning.

May 20th 1852 Went to see Mr Carnahan but did not settle. Left his accts with Mr J B Palmer Esq with orders to settle immediately. Returned on the 10 oclock train. Had a conversation with Mr F in which I became convinced of his intention to discharge one or more of his clerks. I shall be one of them & as A J D has him so bound that he would not dare to discharge him to save his soul I suppose that J W C will be the other. He has acted a hypocritical part throughout & it will create but little sensation on my part to leave.

May 21st 1852 The days pass as days always have done & the long looked for time is drawing near as such times will do when I am to visit that one most dear & and that other one scarcely less so. What will be the result of that visit? Shall I be acknowledged unconditionally the accepted of her I love? Or will some providence whose decree I may not question say your hopes are built upon a sandy foundation. Such is life hope today & fear tomorrow. The prospects of today bright & glorious over shadowed by the disappointments of tomorrow. But there is one thing one feeling one pang that I have never felt. And most sincerely I think the great giver of all good that I have been spared this. I have never yet felt one doubt of the constancy of Sue. However I? I have another consolation. If any person marries me it will be for love for I have nothing to recommend me.

May 24th 1852 Mr & Mrs F went to Nashville today. Maj Tucker went also. Business dull. I have of late neglected to criticize my actions as closely as I ought & find as a consequence that I am rather retrograding in the scale of morals. I have been guilty of expressing myself rather too fiercely upon some subjects & about some persons. I must guard myself more closely in future. The practice of making remarks (even if true) prejudicial to the interest of others is certainly very reprehensible. The evil is like many other a growing one. It lives to broils contentions & every thing else but good results. I am determined to never say one word to any one (that is not strictly in confidence) against any person whatever in future & especially Mr F. Respect for his wife alone ought to be of itself a sufficient reason for this.

May 27th 1852 Inconsequence of a conversation with Mr F last night we had a settlement & I left his employment. Went to Jefferson to attend to some accts etc.

May 31st 1852 Started out on a collecting tour & succeeded in getting enough to pay for my labor. Came home in the evening & then went to Mr Buells & spent the night. They seem to be very kind people showing a great deal of hospitality in their treatment of their guests.

June 2nd 1852 Had a long conversation with Jas before leaving. He seems to intertain some hopes of succeeding with Carrie notwithstanding all that I told him. Verily a drowning man will catch at a straw. But what the straw is that he is catching at is more than I can conceive. Came home before dinner & remained the ballance of the day. Felt unwell from the effects of drinking too much cold water yesterday.

June 5th 1852 After breakfast Mr Smith harnessed his horse to his buggy & went to Jefferson also to the Sulphur Springs. Returned about one & went to John Popes to get the note that he promised to give in place of those I now hold. He had not got it endorsed & requested me to carry it to Jackson Smith for his signature. I presented it to him but was told that he could not sign any more paper for him unless it was to renew notes that he was already on. Carried the note back to Mr Pope & left it & went home. Saw J Elder on the way & dunned him for some money due Fleming. Was told to call Wednesday morning & he would pay the note. Went home & found that Mr & Mrs Hazlewood had returned. Saw Caye & was told that he left the girls well. Was again disappointed in not receiving a letter from them.

June 20th 1852 Remained at home all day in consequence of having no horse to ride my horse being disabled. I have spent the day mostly in reading. Read one of Smith's sermons on self examination which reminded me of a duty that I have neglected to much of late & in fact all my life. Upon entering into an examination of my thoughts actions & feelings for the last few days I find that I have relaxed much of my even ordinary diligence in self government. I find that I have permitted many of those original sins such as pride anger envy hatred etc to grow spread their branches deepen their roots & then sow the seeds of future anguish & bitterness of soul. It seems as though with returning health all the evil habits & propensities of my nature return with renewed strength. Instead of feeling more thankful more willing to devote myself to the interests of religion of renewing my efforts for greater holiness I find my desire for wealth for pleasure & self gratification continually increasing. I think a part of this may be attributed to the entire neglect of my journal. The habit of noting down every day the transactions of the day the faults that I have committed the sinful thoughts feeling passions & propensities that I have indulged necessarily produces a kind of self examination that is always beneficial especially if followed by resolutions of amendment honestly & prayerfully made. My unsettled situation includes the possibility of attending to this as closely as I could wish but still by improving every hour when I am at home I can mostly overcome the difficulty. I received a letter from Sue a few days since in which she requested an interest in my prayers.

June 21st 1852 Exceedingly warm all day. C L Davis was here & settled with Maj Tucker. Afterward he bought the mills etc of Maj Tucker. I assisted them in their settlement for which I recd no thanks. Davis chd me \$21 for hauling a load of corn & fodder after I had worked 2 days on his mill accts. So the world goes. Borrowed Brown's horse & rode to Ely Smiths & P/F Hayers and collected fifteen dollars of the former which was credited on H B Smiths note. In reviewing the transactions of the day I see much to condemn & little to approve.

Nov 15th 1852 (Gibson Co - Zion) After an unpardonable neglect and the lapse of months during which some of the most important events of my life have transpired I again renew my acquaintance with you my good journal & ask a thousand pardon for this unpardonable derilection from a known & palpable duty. And by way of remuneration for my neglect & as a thank offering for pardon granted I promise as full a history of the past since the date of my last correspondance as my memory will furnish. Well about the 10th of July I started for Fayette on a visit to -- but it is unnecessary to say who as you can easily guess. Went in company with S L Trigg. After a very pleasant journey I arrived in Fayette on the 15th. Found my friends all at home Carrie well but Sue & Mary down with chills. Sue however was able to be up but Mary I did not see for nearly a week. Notwithstanding the unfavorable situation of the family I spent a few days very pleasantly. Having arranged the preliminaries for future operations I left for Gibson Co for the purpose of making some arrangements for going into business. Arrived at Mr J S Smiths on Saturday & remained over Sunday. Was very unwell both days. Monday I went to Mr Thos Bass's & in consequence

of severe illness did not leave until the following Thursday. Spent some time in the Co & saw many of my old acquaintances from Rutherford but did not find a situation or make any positive arrangements respecting one & started for home in company with Mr Lane/Lune about the first of Aug. Was taken sick the first night after I left but was able to pursue my journey home altho I suffered with fever very much all the way. For nearly three weeks after I arrived at Maj Tuckers I was confined to the house most of the time. When able to ride I attended to some business & was soon ready to return to the District. It was arranged that Maj Tucker who was going with me & myself should start the next Monday but he was taken sick the Saturday preceding & was confined to the house most of the time for five weeks. The third of Oct we started & went to Nashville where I bought a buggy etc to take with me to Fayette. Nothing of particular interest occurred on the way. When we arrived in Gibson Co we parted & after staying some three days I proceeded to Fayette whither Maj T was to follow me. On the 12th of Oct I arrived at Mr Parks was cordially received & found my friends much improved from what they were when I left them. The next day Oct 13th I went to Somerville procured the necessary documents secured the services of the Rev Mr Sherill & returned in company with him & Mr J Newsom to Mr Parks where we found a small company assembled to witness the interesting ceremony. But what ceremony you ask? It is no longer a secret now so I will write it in full. Listen. The marriage of Mr H K Northway to Miss Susan Emeline Parks. So my good friend you see that I am a married man the prophecies of all the wise heads to the contrary notwithstanding. Well to continue for I must be brief the following Monday Maj Tucker & Co Miss C McDowell & brother myself wife brother & sister left to return to our several places of destination. We parted at Jackson Maj Tucker Carrie Tucker & sister Mary proceeding on to Rutherford & the others to Gibson. We that is Sue & myself went to Mr McDowells & remained about a week during which time I bought a place in the Zion neighborhood rented a house & made arrangements to move there as soon as possible. At the expiration of a week we returned to Mr P. We found him in very bad health from the effects of a violent cold taken by going to Somerville. We remained there a week & then returned to Zion bring our effects with us for the purpose of commencing to keep house on our own account. And here we have been quietly domiciliated ever since meeting now & then a rugged eminence in the journey of life but for the whole far greater reason for gratitude to an all wise God than for repining at the hardness of our fate. And now with a promise of less neglect in future I bid you good night.

Nov 16th 1852 Cool & cloudy with a very little snow or sleet. Busied myself in repairing the fences & gates around the house.

Nov 17th 1852 Rainy in the morning & cool & cloudy all day. Went to Mr McDowells in the morning & from there to Trenton in the evening. Mr McD went with me. Circuit Court met last Monday. Bought some things & returned to Mr McD's and stayed all night.

Nov 18th 1852 Returned home in the morning & occupied myself repairing gates fences etc. Mr Flynn, a Colporteur [*a hawker of religious tracts and books*] in the employ of the Presbyterian church called in the evening & remained all night.

Nov 19th 1852 Remained at home till after dinner & then went to the saw mill. Carried Sue & Cousin Rebbecca McDowell (who came home with us from her father's) to Mr Edwards & left them till I returned. Miss Nancy Edwards came home with us.

Nov 21st 1852 Cloudy in the morning & rained late in the evening. Mr F Elder & J Wade called on Cousin R in the morning and Mr & Mrs Elder on Sue. Went to preaching at a Baptist church. Heard a sermon from the Rev Mr Griffin Wright. Wm Hazlewood came home with us to dinner & remained till after supper.. It was given out at church that there would be a preaching at Zion next Saturday & Sabbath.

Family Gatherings (continued)

Nov 23rd 1852 Went to Lewis Wade's with W Hazlewood in the morning & got a load of cotton seed. Had a violent headache in the evening. Sue & Cousin Rebecca went to Mr Edwards' in the evening & I went after them a while before sundown. Spent the evening repairing gates & fences.

Nov 24th 1852 Cloudy & rainy all day. Went to J Lane's in the morning & in the evening to Allen McDougals to ascertain where Mr Ashford was at work. Found that he was at Mr Keltons. Miss Mary & Miss Eliza Wade called in the evening. Went to Mr Simmons late in the evening to buy a hog.

Nov 26th 1852 Cold raw day. Repaired the stables & fixed a place for the buggy. Recd a letter containing a rect for Mr Lane from Sommerville. Sue also a letter from the Church at Somerville written by Mr Sherill.

Nov 27th 1852 Went to Trenton on business but done nothing but buy a few articles for family use. The agent for the Mobile & Ohio RR was in town proposing to let contracts. He succeeded in letting some 10 or 15 miles of the road. Preaching at Zion today. Sue & Cous Rebecca went.

Nov 28th 1852 Arose too late as usual. Went to see Mr Mallet a mechanic & made a partial engagement for building a store. Saw Mr Ingram & had some conversation respecting a negro woman that he has for sale. Returned home & then went to see Mr Howard but did not find him at home. Rained some in the evening and night.

Dec 1st 1852 Cleared off this morning & has been warm & pleasant all day. Went to the shop & had old gray shod also had a shovel made. Returned after dinner & in the evening went with Sue to Mr Elders & from there I went to Mr Simmons.

Dec 2nd 1852 Arose this morning with a violent headache. It got easier tho after breakfast & I rode to see Mr Mallet but did not find him. Saw Mr Ingram & had some further conversation with him about a negro woman that he has for sale. Concluded on taking her on trial. She was sent here this evening. Worked about the house till night. Cloudy all day with some rain after supper.

This concludes the journal for 1852 and the writings of H K Northway. It is resumed in San Antonio, Bexar Co TX on September 14, 1875 by a daughter.

HALL Sr. of the county of Weakley and State of Tennessee of the first part and Bradford EDWARDS of the County and State aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that the said James H. Hall Sr. for and in consideration of the natural love and affection he has for his wife, Rachael Hall, and for his children Lucinda BELL wife of Joseph Bell, Prescott H. Hall, Hiram W. Hall, Sarah E. DIBRELL wife of George W. Dibrell, James H. Hall, Jr., Jacob B. Hall and William Hall and my three grand children Mary Elizabeth, Gustavus A., and Luella Hall, children of my deceased son John R. Hall (the name of my daughter Elvira E. CARTER being omitted because I have heretofore given her her part of my estate) has given granted bargained sold and conveyed unto the said Bradford Edwards his heirs etc the tract of land on which I now live in said County and State containing 670 acres, 640 acres of which was purchased from Alden GIFFORD and the 30 acres from James H. HAZLEWOOD...also my slaves Milly Sanders George Abram & Toney and their future increase if any also all of my house hold and kitchen furniture and tools geer and farming implements of every kind together with all my stock of hogs cattle sheep horses and mules also one buggy and one wagon...This conveyance is made to the said Bradford Edwards as Trustee for the Joint use and benefit of the wife and children and grandchildren of James H. Hall Sr.

Mr. FRICKS received the following information from James H. SILER of Oak Park, IL after he read the Spring 1989 issue of "Ansearchin'" News. This data is from a letter of Dr. Oliver K. AGEE of Maryville, TN in 1975. Dr. Agee gleaned the early dates from a book by Dr. P.M. Agee, The Agee Family, which was privately printed in Independence, MO August 1937.

Mathieu Agee, born c1670 near Nantes, France, fled to Holland then England as a Huguenot because of the Revocation of the Edict of Nantes. He arrived at Manakin near Richmond, VA about 1690 with his wife Ann GODWIN (GAUDOIN). Mathieu had four children: Judith married an AUSTIN, Isaac, James and Anthony. James married a FORD (FAURE) and had eleven children. Anthony married a BINNION and had eleven children. Isaac Agee (1751-1845), son of Anthony, lived in Buckingham Co VA and married Mary SMITH who had eleven children. Most of their children appear in the Spring 1989 issue.

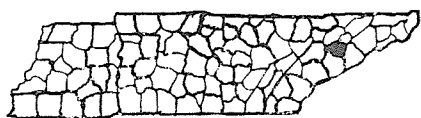
The lineage below is exclusively that of the distinguished Tennessee writer, James Rufus Agee (1909-1955) who wrote A Death in the Family (a play and screen version was called All the Way Home). Readers of the novel will recall that the writer's father, called "Jay" in the novel, was killed in an automobile accident driving from Knoxville to LaFollette to be with his father, Henry Clay Agee, who had just suffered a stroke. One of the most poignant stories was that of Rufus visiting his great grandmother "up in the mountains". This was supposedly his grgrmother "Lynch" as he called the Agees and was Mary (COMER) Agee. Dr. Oliver K. Agee wrote that this episode was pure fiction. The automobile accident of the author's father, however, was not fiction and strongly marked James R. Agee for the rest of his life.

James Agee, son of Isaac and Mary Smith, was born 9 Jul 1788 VA and died Campbell Co TN 10 May 1843. He married Mary TUDOR and had six children.

James Harris Agee, son of James and Mary Tudor, was born 14 Feb 1827 and died 8 Oct 1899. He married Mary Comer and had eleven children (a favorite family number)

Henry Clay Agee was born 3 Apr 1852 and died 9 Jun 1916. He married Mary LAMAR and had eight children.

Hugh James Agee was born 17 Apr 1878 and died 18 May 1916. He married Laura TYLER of Knoxville, daughter of Joel and Emma Tyler. Their son was James Rufus Agee, the writer.

## BOOK REVIEWS

Bess C. Twaddle and Lincoln Johnson

A BIBLIOGRAPHY OF MILITARY NAME LISTS FROM PRE-1675 TO 1900: A Guide to Genealogical Sources by Lois Horowitz. 1990. Hard back, 5½x8½, 1118 pp. Order from Scarecrow Press, Inc., 52 Liberty St., P.O. Box 4167, Metuchen, NJ 08840. \$99.50

This impressive tome is representative of the more sophisticated research tools required by today's genealogists. The annotated bibliography is the first of a series. More than 400 genealogy and history periodicals have been searched for materials listing military men in America's wars whether their names appeared on tombstones or in roster lists, pension records, reunion rosters or old newspapers. The work is arranged chronologically by war, then alphabetically by state and county. Entries for the Civil War are also classified by regiment. Under each war there are entries by geographic region.

SCOTTISH-AMERICAN HEIRS 1683-1883 by David Dobson. 1990. Hard back, 5½x8½. Indexed, 165 pp. Order from Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc., 1001 N. Calvert St., Baltimore, MD 21202. \$21.50

These 2657 abstracts of Scottish-Americans are taken from official inquests held at the time of a landowners death in order to establish the credentials of the heirs. This procedure was known as the Services of Heirs and the records are kept at the Scottish Record Office in Edinburgh. As a rule the abstract will contain name of deceased, occupation, residence in Scotland, date, and relationship to the heirs; and for the heirs it will contain name, occupation, place of residence in America as well as relationship to the deceased.

ORANGE COUNTY ROAD ORDERS 1750-1800 by Ann Brush Miller. 1989. Soft back, 8½x11. Indexed, 394 pp. For current price list and availability contact: Historic Roads of Virginia, Virginia Transportation Research Council, Box 3817, University Station, Charlottesville, VA 22903.

In 1781 Thomas Jefferson reminded the State of Virginia that the county courts were responsible for the building and maintenance of public roads and bridges. Each road was opened and maintained by an Overseer of Highways who was usually assigned all the "Labouring Male Tithebles" living on or near the road. Although the boundaries of Orange County had shrunk since its inception in 1734, it still contained Greene County during the period covered. Road arteries connecting with Orange County are also included. The index is divided into the categories of: personal names; bridges; houses, lands, plantations, quarters; mountains, gaps; rivers, runs, springs, swamps; roads; neighborhoods, towns, landmarks; geographic features, ordinaries and ordinary licenses; ferries; mills; chapels, churches, glebes and meeting houses.

WHITE COUNTY TENNESSEE 1870 FEDERAL CENSUS USA compiled and published by Joyce Bradley McComb. 1990. Soft back, acid-free paper, 8½x11. Indexed, 186 pp. Order from compiler, 1730 Jessamine Rd., Lexington, SC 29073. \$21.00 now; \$23.00 as of 1 Feb 1991

The compiler states the census was taken directly from the microfilm records into her computer. There is a rather unusual indexing system as the entries begin with #1 and all succeeding families are entered in numerical sequence regardless of surname spelling. Indexing follows the same system rather than page numbers; for instance: Adkins is family #1085 and Alexander is #111. Ms. McComb will send a computer printout of surnames being researched to any purchaser without charge upon request with a SASE. Information given in the census includes: Surname, Given name, Age, Sex, Race, Occupation, Place of birth, District and miscellaneous data.

MORGAN COUNTY MISSOURI MARRIAGE RECORDS 1833-1893 by Sherida K. Eddlemon. 1990. Soft back, 5½x8. Indexed, 131 pp. Order from Heritage Books, Inc., 1540-E Pointer Ridge Place, Suite 300, Bowie, MD 20716. \$15.00

Ms. Eddlemon's latest work is a compilation of marriage records for Morgan County, Missouri, which was formed in 1833 from the southern portion of Cooper County. In addition to the names of the bride and groom and date of the marriage, some miscellaneous genealogical information is included. There may be a large span of time between the date of marriage and the date it was recorded since many of the marriages were performed by circuit riders. Some marriages were recorded in other counties while others were never recorded.

KINSHIP It's All Relative by Jackie Smith Arnold. 1990. Soft back, 5½x8½, 66 pp. Order from Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc., 1001 N. Calvert St., Baltimore, MD 21202. \$6.95

This very readable book is both a sociological treatise and a genealogical handbook. It acquaints the reader with sociological vocabulary, such as: cognate, agnate, matriarchial, patrilineal, etc.; and also provides kinship charts with explanations of relationships. Legal and social definitions of family and kinship are included.

THE SURVIVORS-MY ANCESTORS by Justine P. Snipes. 1986. Hard back, 8½x11. Indexed, 216 pp. Order from the author, 1600 South Eads St., Arlington, VA 22202. \$35.00

Akers, Anderson, Christy, Drennon, Harvey, Jones, Lindsey, Rodgers, Short, Snipes, Smith, Wagster, and related families are the subjects of this family book. Since the original families were of Scot, English and Welsh backgrounds, the volume contains an interesting introduction concerning the origins and definitions of these names. Cumberland County in the Province of Pennsylvania was the area settled by a Scotch-Irish group containing the Christy and Drennon families. An excellent historical background explaining the migrations of the Scots to Ireland and the subsequent immigration of these "Scotch-Irish" to America is included.

DEED BOOK 7 AND DEED BOOK 8 AMELIA COUNTY, VIRGINIA Deeds 1759-1765 abstracted and compiled by Gibson Jefferson McConnaughey. 1990. Soft back, 8½x11½. Indexed, 183 pp. Order from Mid-South Publishing Co., P.O. Box 659, Amelia, VA 23002. \$21.75 (VA residents add 90¢ sales tax)

These abstracts were taken from the original handwritten deed books in the Amelia Clerk's office rather than from copies. Many deeds show names of wives, occupations of grantors and grantees, and family relationships. A number of Powers of Attorney and Apprenticeships are also among the deeds. Early records of Nottoway County are included since it was not separated from Amelia County until 1789.

ENGLISH SURNAMES: Their Sources and Significations by Charles Wareing Bardsley. 1990 (1898 Reprint). Soft back, 5½x8. Indexed, 612 pp. Order from Heritage Books, Inc., 1540-E Pointer Ridge Place, Suite 300, Bowie, MD 20716. \$38.00

Reprinted from the 1898, 6th Edition book, which was published by Chatto & Windus, London, this book contains the Prefaces of the first, second, third and fifth editions. The popular work provides a comprehensive discussion of surname origins with chapters of patronymic surnames, locality-derived surnames, surnames based on office, surnames from occupations and nicknames. There are many examples and illustrations, and an "Index of Instances" which cites the sources where specific surnames were found in ancient documents. Since the book is a general study of surnames, it complements Bardsley's other books: The Romance of the London Directory and A Dictionary of English and Welsh Surnames With Special American Instances, which is a quick reference to the meaning and location of a surname.

MARRIAGE RECORDS OF EIGHT GEORGIA COUNTIES by Groom. 1900. \$57.50.

MARRIAGE RECORDS OF EIGHT GEORGIA COUNTIES by Bride both compiled by Max L. Tatum. 1900. Soft backs, 8½x11, 433 pp each. Order from compiler, P.O. Box 5322, Albany, GA 31706-5322. \$57.50 (\$3.00 postage and handling for one book and \$3.50 for both; GA residents add 6% sales tax)

The southwest counties included are: Baker, Calhoun, Colquitt, Dougherty, Lee, Mitchell, Terrel and Worth. Mr. Tatum has given a brief history of the formation of each county, and the county or counties from which each was formed. All extant marriage records from the beginning of each county to as late as the 1920's are included. Each entry contains groom/bride-bride/groom, date of marriage, original book and page number and name of the county.

Tennessee County Series FAYETTE COUNTY by Dorothy R. Morton. 1990. Hard back, 6x8½. Indexed, 144 pp. Order from Memphis State University Press, Memphis, TN 38152 (901-454-2752). \$12.50

Ms. Morton covers the areas of early settlers, government, transportation, education, medical services, churches, organizations and a survey of towns and villages in this history of Fayette County. Among the surnames mentioned of the earliest inhabitants are Thornton, Kirk, Patterson, Johnson, Bowers, Cocke, Higgason, Bennett, Simpson, Martin, Rich, Head, Koonce and Michie.

WASHINGTON COUNTY TENNESSEE TOMBSTONE INSCRIPTIONS PLUS GENEALOGICAL NOTES by Charles M. Bennett and The Watauga Association of Genealogists and compiled by Loraine Bennett Rae. Vol. I (no date), 234 pp, \$20.00; Vol. II (1978), 288 pp, \$22.50; Vol. III (1979), 335 pp, \$22.50; all soft back, 8½x11, and indexed. Order from Jonesborough Genealogical Society, P.O. Box 314, Jonesborough, TN 37659. \$65.00 for set. Supply limited.

This three volume set is not just another list of tombstone inscriptions. The compilers have consulted available records in order to identify unmarked graves, family names of spouses, marriage bonds and other related data. A list of cemeteries and a location map is included in each volume. Volume I contains listings from Johnson City and surrounding area cemeteries. Volume II contains listings from the southern part of the county's cemeteries and Volume III contains listings from the northern part of the county's cemeteries.

NICHOL OF NASHVILLE, AN ULSTER SCOT FAMILY, circa 1689-1989 compiled by Bromfield Bradford Nichol, Jr. 1990. Hard back, 6x9. Indexed, 339 pp. Order from compiler, 408 W. Garden St., Pensacola, FL 32501. \$37.00

Included in this book are 1250 descendants of John and Margaret Dysart Nichol of Magherabeg, Fahan Parish County Donegal, Ireland. Two of their sons, Josiah and John Nichol, emigrated from Donegal in the late 1780's and settled first near Saltville, VA. By 1802 they were living in Knox Co TN, and by 1805 in Nashville. The author uses an alphabetical system of identification beginning with "A" for the prime progenitor and a descending letter combination for their descendants. An interesting background on why the Scots went to Ulster and then to America is given. Very good documentation is footnoted throughout the book, and a number of photographs and family charts are included. A few of the family names are: Chamberlain, Dunn, Crockett, Foster, Hightower, Lytle, Vaulx and Warren.

THE LIBRARY OF CONGRESS A Guide to Genealogical and Historical Research by James C. Neagle. 1990. Hard back, 8½x11. Indexed, 381 pp. Order from Ancestry Publishing, P.O. Box 476, Salt Lake City, UT 84110. \$40.45

A comprehensive guide to the genealogical resources at the Library of Congress has never been published. The scope of this book is to provide a straightforward and informal description of these sources in the library and how to locate them. Titles and names of authors are listed here as examples of the library's holdings, arranged as they pertain to various categories of research. More than 2700 titles are cited (not including directories and social registers), each of which includes the Library of Congress call number. Part 1 gives an overall explanation of the history of the library, it's divisions and catalog system. Part 2 has an explanation of research categories of special interest to genealogists and historians such as biographies, location records, military service, pioneer history, immigrant ancestors, and English speaking ancestors with source materials in each area. Part 3 has key source materials broken down into regions and each region into states. This material includes census indexes, mortality schedules, biographies, land acquisitions, early settlers, local records, periodicals and directories.

The caption reads "The above four generations represent one of the oldest and most prominent families in McNairy County. They are H.A. Hunter, Mrs. John H. Steadman, Charles B. Steadman and Hunter M. Steadman, all of Selmer. Mr. Hunter was born in Madison County, Tenn., and removed to McNairy in 1838. He has been a resident of Selmer 21 years. He has two children, Mrs. Steadman and Mrs. J.B. Maxedon of Selmer, 10 grandchildren and four great-grandchildren. He joined the Methodist Church in 1837. Mr. Steadman is one of the most prominent merchants in Selmer. This group was taken Monday, July 13, the day Mr. Hunter celebrated his 90th birthday.
