

"The Union Mission Cemetery & Sunday School is located in Clarksville, Mecklenburg Co., VA. The church was destroyed by fire after 1946, and the cemetery has suffered from years of neglect. Surnames found include: AVERETT; GLASSCOCK; McLAUGHLIN; RHODES; ROYSTER; WHEELER; WHITT and five unreadable names..." Mr. Rhodes has received the deed to the cemetery and is beginning to restore it. He wants to establish a non-profit organization and an interest-bearing trust fund to provide perpetual care for the cemetery. A local member gave us this reply to a request for information from the General Commission on Archives and History of The United Methodist Church, P.O. Box 127, Madison, NJ 07940:

"The resources for genealogical research...(here) are limited to full-time, fully ordained clergy of the United Methodist Church and its predecessors...We do not have baptismal, marriage, funeral, or membership records. Obituaries of deceased preachers have been a part of the printed minutes of the regional (annual) conference of these churches from their formation. When found, we will be delighted to supply you with a photocopy.

Please note that in the nineteenth century many persons who performed pastorial duties in several of the above churches were 'Local Preachers', that is, not full-time, fully ordained clergy. For this large group no obituaries were ever printed. As such, we cannot trace persons in this category. Therefore, if you know that the person you are researching was a layperson or a local preacher, then you know that we cannot help you...

You are welcome to visit our center and do your own research. It is on the campus of Drew University in Madison, New Jersey. Hours are 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, except holidays."

One must write to the Archives at the above address to obtain a request form, complete the form and return it with a check for \$15.00 for each name. They will return your check if they are unable to locate an obituary.

GATEWOOD FAMILY BIBLE - Submitted by Timothy Arnold Gatewood P. O. Box 12921, Memphis, TN 38182

The original Bible is in the possession of Mrs. Cordies Alton GATEWOOD, Mary Winifred (WAGNER) of Selmer, TN. It originally belonged to her husband's father who was named Gifus Amanuel Gatewood. Later, he changed his name to Gifus Emanuel, and was known as Manuel Gatewood. The title page is missing so the date of the Bible is unknown. The following data were transcribed by T. A. Gatewood.

Basely/Bazell/Bazzeel Gatewood was born 25 July 1836 and married 22 December 1858, Mary A. L. OWENS. She was said to be 1/2 American Indian. Basely and Mary were both born in Weakley Co, TN, and were married there.

Gifus Amanuel/Emanuel/Manuel Gatewood was born 16 April 1869 and married (1) Lillie Corintha HARBER, born 25 June 1880. She was the mother of all his children. Mrs. Lillie C. Gatewood died 6 Oct 1923. Manuel married (2) Nancy Eudora China Celeste BECKLEY, who had been married twice previously. Mrs. China Gatewood died 5 April 1951. Manuel Gatewood died 11 Sept 1954. The children were:

George B. - born 28 June 1901

BURTON BIBLE FOUND IN FLORIDA - Submitted by Jeanette J. Phethean for Kinseekers 19 Quail Run, Wildwood, FL 34785-9032

While going through some books in a second hand bookstore in Lake Co, FL, two members of the Kinseekers Genealogical Society came across an old Bible from DeKalb Co, TN. It was inscribed: To Valeria Burton, presented by her mother, May 1911. The publication date of the Bible was not on the title page, but the earliest entry was the record of a 1797 birth.

Mance M. BURTON was born 30 Nov 1854. On 29 Feb 1888, he married Patsy Alex. DRAKE at the home of John E. Allen, her grandfather. Pattie was born 8 Jan 1873. Mance died 30 June 1946, and Pattie died 10 Sept 1951. Their children were:

Clarence Edward Burton - born 5 Oct 1890; died 4 Feb 1914

Clyde Drake Burton - born 22 Mar 1894; died 22 Sept 1896

Walter Ross Burton - born 12 Jan 1896; died 24 Feb 1978 in Miami, FL. He was interred in Flagler Memorial Park, Sec 12, Lot 429; there is a space for Valeria B. LOUNSBURY

Valeria Burton - born 19 Jan 1899; married Lounsbury

The great grandparents, grandparents, and parents of Pattie (Drake) Burton are listed below. Those entries were apparently made by her in July of 1922, after she had given the Bible to her daughter, Valeria.

Alex MARTIN was born 19 Nov 1797. He married Patsy (_____) who was born 17 Feb 1801 and died 18 July 1876. Alex died 21 Nov 1876.

John Stog Allen was born 18 Feb 1818; married Martha (Martin) who was born 21 May 1821 and died 20 Jan 18 . John Allen died 20 May 1878.

Dr. Isaac Newton Drake was born 4 Oct 1834; married Elinora (Allen) who was born 5 Aug 1840 and died 2 Jan 1917. Dr. Drake died Apr 191_.

All family members are interred in the $\underline{\text{Martin}}$ $\underline{\text{Cemetery}}$, DeKalb Co, TN, except the two grave sites in Miami, Fl.

The fly leaf in the New Testament indicated the Bible was published in Philadelphia, PA by McCarty & Davis, No. 171 Market St. in 1829. Photocopies of the family records have been supplied from which the data have been obtained.

John MILLER, patriarch of the family was born 20 Aug 1754. He married about 1775 Mary (_____), no dates given. They had a son, James. John died 31 Jan 1843, at the age of 88 years and 5 months.



Abbreviations: DIST. = District, A = Acres, TL = Town Lot, S = Slave, W = White Poll, and DT = Double Tax ("...not having given in on time according to Law").

Giles County was created in 1809 from the southern end of Maury County. It was bounded on the east by Lincoln and south by the state of Alabama, but the western boundary was indefinite until after the Chickasaw Cession of 1816. The only significant boundary change took place when the north-east corner, including Cornersville, was taken to form Marshall County. In December of 1835, Tennessee Legislators passed an act to divide counties into Civil Districts and Commissioners were appointed to lay off the boundaries and designate places for holding elections. Abel WILSON, Jno. WHITE(?), Homer RAINEY and John W BORDENHAMER were appointed from Giles Co.

<u>DIST. No. 1</u> Begins at the southeast corner of Giles Co., the point of intersection of the southern boundary of Tennessee with the western boundary of Lincoln Co., running west with the state line to Elk River, thence up sd river to the Lincoln Co. line, thence south with that line to the beginning; elections to be held at John MENIFEE's.

HEIRS OF HARDEMAN ABINGTON OF TN - Submitted by Marge Brown 3005 Phyllmar Place, Oakton, VA 22124

Mrs. Brown found this Abstract among others that had been prepared for her husband's father in 1938. It identifies the heirs of Hardeman ABINGTON, a resident of Shelby Co, TN, at the time of his death in 1860.

Hardeman Abington had received from the State of Arkansas title to the N_2 of SW_4 Section 23 T4N R6W on December 25, 1853. The property described was located in Prairie Co, AR. The instrument of original entry was recorded in Entry Book 2 on page 69. Hardeman Abington died intestate in Shelby Co, TN in 1860.

William T. Abington, a son of the deceased, entered a cause as plaintiff in the Chancery Court of Prairie County, Arkansas, Northern District against the other heirs: James B. Abington, administrator as of 1860 of the estate of said Hardeman Abington, deceased; Joseph H. Abington; Francis C. Abington, minor female in 1860 - "of age" by 1870; Mary E. Abington, minor; Margaret J. Abington, widow. As of April 15, 1870 William T. Abington was represented by his attorneys Gatewood and Thomas and defendants by their attorney William J. Bronaugh.

THE MERONEYS, A CONFEDERATE FAMILY - Submitted by Jeanette Probst Tabb 5220 Valerie Street, Bellaire, TX 77401

Benjamin Davis MERONEY was born 10 March 1810 in North Carolina, the son of Phillip D. Meroney and Martha DAVIS. On May 24, 1831, he married Mary Ann NOLEN, the daughter of Joseph and Rebecca Nolen of Blount Co, TN. By 1847 the growing family moved from Blount to Polk Co, where Benjamin was a Constable of the 7th Civil District. In 1849/50 they traveled through Alabama on their way to settle at Silver Springs, Floyd Co, GA.

The parents, seven sons, and five daughters lived very comfortably on a good farm at Silver Springs. At the out break of the Civil War in 1861, four sons volunteered. Zachary Taylor, 12, was too young. The four were: Cyprus Broyles, age 26, married with three children; Daniel Ross C., age 23; Hugh (Hackett) C., age 16; and Jacob Nolen, age 15. Early in 1862, they became violently ill and were hospitalized. Hugh died 27 June 1862, and his body was returned by train for burial. From the Hospital, Cyprus hired a substitute to fight in the first Battle of Manassas (Bull Run). He recovered enough to fight in the 2nd Battle of Manassas, where he was severely wounded and died 18 Sept 1862 in a hospital in Middleburg, VA.

When Benjamin Meroney received the sad news, he rode to Cedartown to enlist. He was 52 years old and volunteered with the GA 1st Cavalry Co A, where he was placed in charge of brigade wagons, serving under General Davidson until surrender in 1865. Ross and Jacob recovered and rejoined the struggle. Jacob was captured at Gettysburg and imprisoned in Maryland. Ross was wounded and moved to the TN Cavalry under General Hood. He was also captured and imprisoned. In 1865 Ross returned home a sick man. He never married and in 1908 was living with a sister, Mary Ann WASHINGTON. Ross received a pension from his Georgia service.

Young Zachary tried again and enlisted for three years in June 1863. He was discharged by the Secretary of War 12 Mar 1864, as "being a minor." In that year Sherman's troops burned the Meroney home in Georgia. Martha Rebecca "Mattie" was the mainstay of the family. She was born in 1843 in Blount Co, TN as were several of the other children. A tiny red-headed, blue-eyed lady, she was a devout Presbyterian. She married Robert B. LUMPKIN in 1871 and later moved to TX. Other children in the family were Zania D., Oceola M., Lou Emma Agnes, Claibourne B., and Augustus Franklin. Mary Ann (Nolen) Meroney died in 1896 and was buried in New Bethel Cemetery in Silver Springs. Benjamin Davis Meroney died 23 Sept 1902 in the Confederate Home at Jacksonville, AL, at the age of 92. He was buried with his wife in Floyd Co, GA.

On 18 Nov 1898, Benjamin Meroney wrote a letter to his daughter, Rebecca Lumpkin. "I will write to let you know I am stil living and am at the same plase that I have lived for the last three years in good health...This country is in better condition than it has ben for a good many years. The people is out of debt and got plenty to live on...It is supposed that Anniston will be a regular Army post in the future and that will be considerabel help to Anniston and surrounding country for it takes between fifty and sixty thousand dollars a month to pay off the soldiers...I want you all to write to me as soon as you get this...Baby it looks like you could come to see me if you would...I remain as ever your father." A Mr. and Mrs. REAVES are also mentioned in the letter which was addressed to R.B. Lumpkin and family at WEAVER's Station, Alabama.

2-1-1801 Petition of Charles ROBERTSON, formerly of Greene County, now of Davidson County, Tennessee. In 1796 he made a contract with Gov. John SEVIER to cut a wagon road from SHARALD's Cove to the Warm Springs on French Broad River in Greene Co. He cut the road "in Sufficient order for a common team of farm horses to hawl fourteen hundred pound weight over in a wagon." The road was inspected and received by the commissioners appointed for that purpose, but the Governor refused payment because the Legislature "had not, by law appropriated money for that particular purpose." Robertson was advised to apply for such a law, which he did immediately, without success. He had spent \$600 on the road and requests appropriation and payment of the contracted \$1000.

Signed 4 Sep 1801

The Senate read and referred the petition to the Committee on Claims on 23 Sep 1801, then passed it to the House of Representatives, which acted the same day in the same way. The paper is marked "Reported on", but does not say whether or not Charles Robertson was ever paid.

3-1-1801 Petition of Asahel RAWLINGS for compensation to jurors of the Courts of Pleas and Quarter Sessions. He recommends a venire large enough to "constitute a grand and two traves (?) Juryes, and make them a small allowance...Sheriffs are many times obliged to take men not qualified for that purpose being so intoxicated that they many times cannot rehearce one word of the testemony..." He was obliged to make the best way he could with a few hands & his family through the Wilderness...We know he has been obliged to sell three Negroes and the most valuable part of his property to make good his contracts...involved him in a number of lawsuits...It is now obvious to every person the advantage the state has received from that road; even the report of a road brought thousands of emigrants...If Dorris gets redress, it must be given him by your Honorable Body..."

William and Eleanor Nutt first appeared in Augusta County, Virginia in 1740 and died in South Carolina. Related families are Speer, Spear, Hood, McCown, Ramsey, Pinnell, Barkley, Thompson, McCain, Coursart, Coursar, Hardman, Brown, Steelman and others.

Lost your relative in West Tennessee? Help may be at hand. In 1870, as today, Madison County was the "hub" of the "Golden Circle." Counties which border Madison are Gibson, Carroll, Henderson, Chester, Hardeman, Haywood and Crockett. Counties formed from a portion of Madison were Chester in 1875 and Crockett in 1845.

Information transcribed includes name, age, sex, race and multiple births. Noted are districts and post offices as well as census page numbers. It is helpfully organized by dwellings in the order given on the original because neighbors were often, or later became, kin.

Baptist minute books were kept by church clerks to record the detailed business of the church. The books are loaded with personal names. Genealogists and church historians will find in these records pre-1850 data which is difficult to find elsewhere. Though pre-1850 censuses list only

heads-of-household, church minute books treat all members equally, male or female, black or white. The ten churches are Brushy Creek, Clear Spring, Fork Shoals, Gowensville (Cross Roads), Mountain Creek, Reedy River (Head of Enoree), Standing Springs, Tyger (Concord, Head of Tyger River), Milford and Washington, which are widely dispersed throughout the county.

Over one-half of genealogical searchers will find German forebears in their family trees. This guidebook has been compiled in order to provide these researchers with genealogically-pertinent information on (a) the geography, (b) the history, (c) the language, (d) the original records, (e) the secondary records, (f) the locations of the records in Germany, (g) research procedures in the US, and (h) research procedures in Europe for German family history research.

At its formation in 1771 from Rowan County until 1778, Surry County included the present-day North Carolina counties of Ashe, Alleghany, Wilkes, Yadkin, Stokes and Forsyth; while for the period 1770-1787 it included present-day Yadkin, Stokes, and Forsyth counties. Therefore records in this book may apply to more area than present day Surry and are especially important as there are no extant marriage bonds for Surry County from 1771 to 1780. Based on recorded wills and original wills at the North Carolina State Archives, and on "Loose Estates Papers" of intestates, also at the Archives, the abstracts cover not only wills but powers of attorney, bonds, inventories, bills of sale etc. Of particular valve are the editorial notes gleaned from Mrs. Linn's research.
