

OVER THE EDITOR'S DESK

My good friend and fellow genealogist, Mary Johnston, wrote me to say, "When HOPE prevails, SUCCESS will reign." This was recently confirmed for me when I received a call and inquiry about a Bible record which I had submitted to this magazine twenty-one years ago. As a result of the call, we believe that we have solved several mysteries about the record and documented another female line. Twenty-one years ago - another generation! But, in yet another generation, no matter what may happen to that original Bible, the record will still be available because it was published here and sent to many libraries (including the Library of Congress). Two other Bibles within my family perished in a fire, and we lost all of the information in them.

With these two examples before you, I invite you to send us your unpublished Bible records which contain dates prior to 1914. Birth and Death records after that date were required by law and should be available. If possible, a photocopy of the original pages and comments by the contributor are the most desirable forms to send. It is too easy for a copyist to read the same date twice, or to skip a line, etc.

"Another generation" will establish new methods and machines for genealogy, (as in the case of computers) new libraries and societies. Members of the Keystone Genealogical Society in Monticello, Florida have donated their personal libraries to create the Keystone Genealogical Library, which now contains more than 700 books and numerous quarterlies, covering all but about a half dozen states. Emphasis is on the South, and there are extensive collections on several of the southern states. The library is located at 695 E. Washington in Monticello.

LOWRANCE CHAPEL CHURCH OF CHRIST

The Lowrance Chapel Church of Christ was probably established about 1885 - 1890 but it has not been possible to confirm the exact date. The first building was constructed on land that was provided for this purpose by the Wilson Family. Its location was on a dirt road about five miles East of Rutherford in Gibson County, Tennessee. The congregation continued to worship in this building until sometime about 1940, and the road was still a dirt road. At that time a new building was constructed about two miles North on what was then a gravel road. This land was provided by the Tommie Capps Family. The congregation still worships at this location.

In January of this year, while visiting a cousin, Jack Bell, of Kenton, TN, I was informed that he had a copy of the church records. These records include the names of members who were baptized, followed by other information, such as their death, the falling away from the church, restoration, and church offices held. The record begins in 1893 and ends in 1943. Entries were made by many different people, and many names are obviously spelled incorrectly. All parentheses are mine.

The record begins with comments on protracted meetings. All information listed will be prior to the year 1920.

Aug. 4, 1918. Meeting began by Bro. E. P. Smith. 1st Sunday. Preaching 14 sermons. Closing second Sunday 11th at Twelve with eight additions: Gracie Crowell, Elsie Bell, Odell Curd, Myrtle Richardson, Mavis Roberts, Forest Baker, Sar. Stevens and Emma Stevens, all by baptism.

For 1916, August 13. Preaching by E. P. Smith, five days. Members received, six; three by baptism and three by restoration. (members not identified)

For the year 1917, August the fifth, protracted meeting began. Preaching by R. E. White for 10 days. Members received, five: three by baptism - Rubie Lowrance, Bessie Peeviehouse and Barrie Crowell; two by restoration: Malcomb McClain (McLean) and Saddle Roberts.

The first list of members recorded does not have a date; however, it is known that some of these members died prior to the turn of the century. These members were probably added to the membership during a period of time beginning prior to 1888 and ending about 1905.


TGS ANNOUNCES ADDITIONAL LIBRARY HOURS


The Tennessee Genealogical Society Library at 3340 Poplar will be open from 10:00 AM until 2:00 PM on the following Saturdays:

TIPTON COUNTY, TENNESSEE 1837 TAX LIST

DT = Double Tax, "...not having given in on time according to Law."

Tipton County is one of the original counties formed from the Western District in 1823. In 1830 the area of Tipton County included most of what is now Lauderdale County which was formed in 1835. There have been only slight boundary variations along the Shelby-Tipton east line, the Fayette-Tipton corner and the Haywood-Tipton corner. John F. NEWMAN, Nathaniel HUNT, John McKEE, James N. SMITH, and John POLK were appointed Commissioners to divide the county into Civil Districts & establish election sites. They completed their report 8 Feb 1836, giving the descriptions of boundaries as follows:

DIST. NO. 1 Beginning at the mouth of MATHEWS Creek, thence up said creek to the two-mile post on the road leading from Covington to Randolph, thence in a southern direction to the four-mile post on the Old Memphis Road, thence due south to a fork of Indian Creek upon which MOOREHEAD's Mill is situated, thence up said creek to the Porterville Road, thence in a northeastern direction to Hance LARIMORE's, thence due east to HOWARD's, thence in a northeastern direction so as to include Mrs. L. COTTON, thence north to Hatchie River, thence down said river to the beginning. Elections to be held at Covington.



1836 LETTER FROM LUCINDA ROARK TO HER BROTHER - Submitted by Judge Hugh W. Roark,
Hardin County Courthouse, Elizabethtown, KY 42701

The letter excerpted here reveals conditions in the Cherokee Nation of Mississippi (Holly Springs) in 1836. Lucinda wrote to her brother William who was living in Cherokee County, TX. Lucinda and William were children of John Roark and Nancy CHAMBLESS Roark.

May 1, 1836 Holly Springs, Mississippi

"Dear Brother, Our Heavenly Father has once more permitted me to inform you that we are all well and do earnestly hope that if you ever receive this lines they will find you with all my friends, if permitted to say friends, enjoying the same blessing.

I have just got home from Alabama. Cousin Joel Chambless came down here last December and I went home with him and have just returned. I come by our old place in the district, and found all well and saw your letters you wrote by Mr. HIGIN-BOTTOM and one from Katherine and one from Russell stating that they had all been sick except Mother. You all say that you are well pleased with that country. I can't see how you can be pleased where you are oppressed with sickness and surrounded by enemies. I have no doubt but that will be a free and happy government who should live to see it. I cannot tell when Mr. RANDOLPH will come to that country. He talks of coming there sometime. It is likely that he may come this fall if he can arrange his business here so he can leave. He has got the county site located on his land. There is a considerable Town here now and is improving rapidly. . . . You said in your letter to Uncle BARNETT that you had not heard from us since you left here. We have wrote but by passengers. We have received two letters from you. But nothing since last March was a year.

I want to see you all again but I never expect to see you all again in this world. That is a sickly country and I fear some of you will never see me again...In all your letters I did not see my Father's name. Pray tell me is he dead and I never to see him again. Don't tell me so. I had rather see him than anybody in this world tho I want to see you all. If you get this write as soon as you can and I will write ofter. Randolph has wrote two or three times by mail. I don't expect you have gotten the letters. Tell Russell and Katherine to write. I will write to my Father soon as I can no whether you can get letters by mail or not. Uncle Barnett has sold his place to the widow BURNS and is aliving at Samuel's old place. He expects to move this fall to some new country. But he is not able to come without help. Cousin Samuel is dead. He died with the measles last fall. I didn't stay there but one day. Samuel and Marques is well. That is the poorest looking place now you ever saw and the poorest people. If I thought I had to live there now I'd thank anybody to kill me.

I was very well pleased with my trip to Alabama. Cousin Joel was married last August to Martha STEWARD. Cousin Elizabeth was married while I was there in February to Mr. Z. P. GLASCOCK...Uncle Stephen is still making money, but drinks hard you must write to him. I think Samuel T. will come down here. He will be here to look at this country this Spring. Cousin Gebulon Glascock has been to Texas. He has relations of that name in that country. Cousin Charles ROARK and Tiry RIDDLE is living in Bellfount. Charles was at Uncle Stephen's last winter...Uncle Stephen got a letter from Aunt Fanny while I was there. She said she had got a letter from Father not long since, her daughter is aliving in the Chickasaw Nation. Sister Fannie and all the children wish to be remembered. She has another son and his name is James Allen. Brother Cullen KENDRICK comes and preaches for us. We have a large Society here. He is one of the greatest preachers I ever heard. I want to come to see you as soon as I have any opportunity. Give my best love to Margaret and

the children, to Father and Mother, Russell, Katherine, John, and Napoleon, also to Cousin Washington. Tell him to write. I must come to a close now. May God be with you all. . . .

The first is dated 27 Jul 1799 and comes from inhabitants living on the north side of Cumberland River. On that date, this part of Sumner included all of present-day Sumner, Macon, Clay, and Trousdale, and parts of Jackson, Smith and Robertson. The northern boundary was the Walker line which divides Tennessee from Kentucky, although Kentucky had not yet accepted the division, and the boundary was uncertain. These petitioners expected the county to be divided and asked that Sumner County "not be Suffered to Cross Cumberland River."

BOOK REVIEWS

"A.K.A." (ALSO KNOWN AS) by Sandi Garrett. 1993. Soft cover, 8x11, 42 pp. Order from Cherokee Woman Publishing, P.O. 48, Spavinaw, OK. 74366. \$15.00.

When the author ran into blank walls while researching her ancestry, she began to compile the material included in this brief monograph. The largest part of the work is devoted to a list of names. Cherokee names changed often for a reason, sometimes for no reason. The names listed are not always translations from one language to another but English and Cherokee names for the same person. An example is George Guess and Sequoyah. Also included are explanations of the following, as related to Cherokee life: Adoption by Cherokee Nation, Treaty of May 6, 1828, Old Settler Payroll of 1851, Population Schedule of years 1650 through 1937, and more.

LOGAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY DEED ABSTRACTS 1792-1813 Volumes A1, A, B, C abstracted by Joyce Martin Murray. 1993. Soft cover, 8x11. Full-name index, 179 pp. Order from Joyce Martin Murray, 2921 Daniel, Dallas, Texas 75205. \$30.00 plus \$3.50 S&H.

The 13th county created in Kentucky, Logan County was made from part of Lincoln County in 1792. Between 1792 and 1813 Christian, Warren, Muhlenburg, Livingston, and Henderson Counties were formed from part of Logan County. The greatest number of settlers had come from Virginia. Many came because Virginia granted lands in southwestern Kentucky which were set apart for Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia Continental Line of the American Revolution. Other settlers came from North Carolina, South Carolina, Maryland, and Pennsylvania. Settlers also came from territories such as Illinois, Indiana, Louisiana and Mississippi. The entries cover the usual wide range of items recorded in the deed books of the period, giving a picture of life in the county. Not only real estate transfers, but powers of attorney, bills of sale for furniture and other items, mortgages, deeds of trust, deeds of gift, and relinquishment were entered into the deed books. The volume is completed with place and slave indexes.

UNITED STATES CENSUS WHITE COUNTY, TENNESSEE 1850 transcribed by Joyce Lindstrom, overread by Margret Rhinehart. 1991. Soft cover, 8x11. Surname index, 169 pp. Order from Van Buren County Historical Society, P.O. Box 126, Spencer, TN. 38585. \$20.00 plus \$2.00 mailing fee.

This census was transcribed as recorded in the original. The name of the person who took the census in each of the 15 districts is included, with the dates on which that particular district was enumerated. Surnames are capitalized and occupations, ages, sex, and birthplaces are included. Because 1850 was the first census to name other than the head of household, this census is particularly important to the researcher.

AMELIA COUNTY, VIRGINIA DEED BOOKS 15, 16 and 17 (DEEDS 1778 - 1786) compiled by Gibson Jefferson McConnaughey. 1993. Soft back, 8x11. Indexed, 204 pp. Order from Mid-South Publishing Company, P.O. Box 659, Amelia, VA. 23002. \$24.50 postpaid. VA res. add tax.

Created from Prince George and Brunswick counties in 1735, Amelia County was named for Princess Amelia, the daughter of George IV of England. Prince Edward and Nottoway counties were later formed from Amelia County, therefore the early records of Amelia contain material of these counties also. Made from the original records, these abstracts reveal much more than transfers of property. A great deal of family information is available by a survey of early entries. Marriage contracts, powers of attorney, apprenticeships, election returns, sheriffs' bonds, emigrations from the county are mentioned.

OUR UNION COUNTY FAMILIES by Winnie Palmer McDonald and Bonnie Heiskell Peters. 1992. Hard-back, 9x12. Full name index, 420 pp. Order from Bonnie Peters, 3212 Curtis Lane, Knoxville, TN. 37918-4003. \$50.00 plus \$6.00 postage.

This volume is an addition to Volume II "Our Union County Heritage". A Pictorial History with Genealogical Summaries of Union County Families. The focus of this book is family history, but there is a brief introduction which includes articles on the history of the county. Each family article contains many names and dates of births, marriages and deaths. Most are accompanied by pictures of individuals, groups and places important to that particular family. Almost one hundred family names are featured including the family of Roy Acuff. Among families included are Carr, Cook, Graves, Carter, Gentry, Heiskell, Hubbs, Miller, Morton, Wolfenbarger, and Wilson.

A useful companion book to Death Records for Carter County, Tennessee, 1908-1925 by the same author, this volume contains the names of both brides and grooms arranged in alphabetical order. Additional data given is the actual date of the marriage ceremony or the date the license was issued. If the record shows that the marriage did not occur, that fact is indicated. Carter County Records on microfilm at Tenn. State Library & Archives are the source of this material.

AMERICAN PASSENGER ARRIVAL RECORDS by Michael Tepper. 1993. Hardback, 6x9, 142 pp. Order from Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc., 1001 Calvert St., Baltimore, MD 21202. \$19.95.

Updated & enlarged from the 1988 edition, this new volume traces the development of immigration records from the scanty records of colonial times to the more complete listings of the nineteenth century. The author examines the records in their historical and legal framework, explaining what they contain, where they can be found and how they can be used. National Archives microfilm holdings, and new developments in immigration research are only two of the many topics covered. Also listed are books and periodicals which contain immigrant lists.

This index of over 5000 references contains previously unindexed surnames abstracted from the DAR Lineage Books, Vol. 151-166, giving volume and page number. They are names that appear in at least three consecutive generations. The Revolutionary War veterans are not included as they have been previously indexed. There is also mention of how to obtain the information if you do not have access to the lineage books.

The author has indexed the less than common names from twenty-five selected family histories by various authors. There are 5,246 different surnames plus all the 1761 surnames found in the compiler's file of active genealogy Pedigree Charts. If the Selected Family Histories are not accessible, there is mention of how the information may be obtained.

The alphabetical listing of residents of DeSoto County is a convenient starting point for a search of the 1910 CENSUS. The names are listed with the page number on which they are found in the census, saving time for the researcher. All the families with the same name become listed together, making an identification of related persons easier.

The DEATH NOTICES refer to persons whose graves are not marked in Desoto County, nor are they found in Desoto Cemetery Inscriptions by the same publisher. A possible source for those who have been unable to locate missing relatives in DeSoto County, this index lists in alphabetical order persons who died in the 1800's. The name and source of information are given. Additional facts may include age, sex, burial place, parents' names or a variety of miscellaneous items, if available. A second section of the book lists names of persons, information from grave markers, and names of cemeteries which were not included in the previous publication.

19TH CENTURY HERNANDO traces the history of the town, beginning with its formation from the Chickasaw Nation in the 1830's to the 1870's. This period saw the building of the county, the destruction of the Civil War and the problems of yellow fever epidemics. The building of court-houses, the visit of a circus, the attack of a wolf are all chronicled as part of the life of the town. Through the upheavals of the period, citizens continued to build and rebuild their town and their lives.

THE HERNANDO BAPTIST CHURCH story begins with the Treaty of Pontotoc and the donation of land for the county seat by Edmund Orne of the Boston Land Company, is traced in DeSoto County, Mississippi to the present time. In 1840 a presbytery called a meeting of Baptist believers and ten individuals presented their letters of dismissal from former churches, becoming the first members of the newly created church. They raised funds to purchase from the land company a lot which remains part of the present church site. While the early members were buried near the church, the need for a cemetery led to the purchase of more land. Over the years the church gained, and at times also lost, members due to the changing population of the area. This brief history reflects the changing conditions of the area which it serves.

THE FAMILY OF BARTHOLOMEW STOVAL (Eight Generations of Stovalls in England and America) Vol.I by Neil D. Thompson. 1993. Soft back, 6x9, 256 pp. Full name index. Order from Stovall Family Association, Inc., 5000 Rock River Drive, Fort Worth, TX 76103. \$25.00.

Beginning with the English background of the Stovalls, this volume traces three generations in Surrey prior to the immigration of Bartholomew Stovall to Virginia. The first three American generations are then followed through each child. Documentation is provided in footnotes at the end of each chapter. An ancestor table is furnished for Bartholomew Stovall in Appendix I; Appendix II provides material on the Burton/Hatcher lines. The next two generations will be continued in a yet-to-be published second volume.

This is an excellent book for all genealogists who use, or are planning to use, a computer to store genealogical information. It will give you the help you need to make an informed decision about which program to use. The first part of the book presents the basics that everyone needs to know. Then there are reviews of 32 GEDCOM compatible programs, 9 non-GEDCOM genealogy programs, 86 utility programs and 28 other programs. Also included are 73 charts illustrating the actual reports produced by the various programs. This book is a consumers guide to genealogy software.

PSYCHIC ROOTS Serendipity & Intuition in Genealogy by Henry Z. Jones, Jr. 1993. Soft back, 6x9. Full name index, 36 pp. Order from Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc., 1001 N. Calvert St., Baltimore, Md. 21202-3897. \$14.95 plus \$1.00 P&H.

The author believes that there is a psychic dimension to genealogical research. What at first appears to be luck or chance is really the operation of a sixth sense in action. By asking other genealogists to share their experiences, Jones compiles a series of stories which illustrate serendipity and intuition in research. Topics include dreams, ghosts, reincarnation prayers, and synchronicity. The importance of feelings as well as concrete information is stressed, and the belief that when one is ready the information will come is expressed.

DEATH OF A TENNESSEE HERMIT

LINCOLN JOURNAL, November 8, 1860

The McMinnville (Tenn.) New Era announces the death on 23rd ultimo of Daniel West, the well known hermit of the mountains, at the age of 78. He had lived for a number of years in the hollow of a large tulip poplar tree, in the opening of which he had fitted a rude door. In the center of the hollow he would make his fire in winter and for cooking his plain meals. This hollow also served as his sleeping apartment. Adjoining or near this tree, he had a rude shed which he used as a workshop, where he manufactured chairs, boxes, cider mills & etc. He was a North Carolinian by birth and a soldier in the war of 1812.
